ANOTHER RISING AT OPORTO

MILITARY CALLED OUT TO QUELL THE MOB

OPORTO, April 9.—This city, recently the scene of a violent Republican outbreak, was today disturbed by Republican riots. The trouble arose from the arrest during a late afternoon of several men who were mistaken for being members of the Republican party. A riot followed, which the military were summoned to quell. The soldiers were stoned by the rioters and were forced to charge upon the mob, inflicting many injuries. They finally quelled the disturbance, but extra precautions against future disorders are being taken by the authorities, who are cognizant of latest agitation.
