On His Amendment re Northwest Schools.

**DIVISION NOT REACHED TILL 2 A.M.**  
Laurier Says Maintenance of Confederation is the Real Question.

Mr. McCarthy Urged That Education Was a Local Concern and that the Northwest Legislature Should Have Power to Deal With It—Sir John Thompson said that the bill was intended to prevent conductors from selling return tickets and pocketing the proceeds. Passengers using such tickets would have to go to the ticket office and sign a receipt to show that they were the parties to whom the ticket was issued.

The Government's Program.  
Sir John Thompson in reply to Hon. Mr. Laurier said it was proposed to bring down some railway tickets this afternoon. Hon. Mr. Laurier said that it was intended to prevent conductors from selling return tickets and pocketing the proceeds. Passengers using such tickets would have to go to the ticket office and sign a receipt to show that they were the parties to whom the ticket was issued.

The Dilton divorce bill passed through committee and is ready for reading. The bills for the Atlantic service, the Insurance Act and the Dominion Lands Act were read a third time and passed. The bill allowing members 12 days was introduced and read a first time.

The remainder of the session up to 6 o'clock was taken up discussing the resolutions granting land subsidies to railways in the Northwest.  
After recess, on motion for the third reading of the Northwest bill, Mr. McCarthy moved the amendment of which he has long been a proponent.

The Legislature should Deal With Education.  
He argued that education was a matter of local concern and property, therefore belonging to the province, and as nearly all the provincial legislatures had done so, upon the Legislative Assembly of the Northwest, the power and right to deal with education ought not to be withheld. He explained the reasons for the Ontario educational convention of 1889, at which he had taken part, and said that the minority of the population were Roman Catholics and that the majority of the population were Protestants. He said that the act of 1870 Parliament insisted and continued to insist upon the maintenance of separate schools in the Territories, so that by the educational clause of the British North America Act, if their Territories were created into provinces to-morrow, the separate school system would be fastened for all time upon the Territories.

For many years, in 1892, 1893 and this session, he had tried to have the anomaly existing in the Territories removed, and the Northwest remedied and he had taken up the matter, he said, because public after public had shown that the Northwest was not a Territory, but a province. The law was practically riveting upon the Territories the maintenance of separate schools in the Territories, so that by the educational clause of the British North America Act, if their Territories were created into provinces to-morrow, the separate school system would be fastened for all time upon the Territories.

Cost Per Pupil Compared With Ontario.  
The statistics showed that there were 207 Protestant Public schools, 34 Catholic Public schools and 11 Catholic Separate schools. There were no Protestant Separate Schools, showing that the Protestants, where they were not numerically strong, attended the Roman Catholic Public schools. He then gave figures showing that the system of separate schools entailed an expense of \$85 per pupil, compared with \$14 in Ontario. As Parliament spent \$100,000 in education in the Northwest surely it had interest in the economic side of this question at least.

Moved to Refer the Bill Back.  
He moved, seconded by Mr. Denison, that the bill be referred back to committee to add a paragraph, giving the territories power to pass laws dealing fully with the matter of education, subject to the control of Parliament, the clause not to take effect until after the next general election.
