THE FIFTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL.

The Annual Meeting of the Society of the Montreal General Hospital was held on the 21st May, Mr. Andrew Robertson, Vice-President, in the chair, when the Secretary read the following Report:

GENTLEMEN OF THE CORPORATION OF THE MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL.

I beg to present a report of the proceedings of the Board of Governors for the year which terminated on the 30th April, 1878.

Of the 1616 in-door patients who were treated to a conclusion there died 127, or 7·95 per centum. If 35 deaths, which occurred within three days after admission, be deducted, the mortality is reduced to 5·7 per centum. The average number of days of each patient in Hospital was 29 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Although the number of "out-door" patients treated for affections of the eye and ear have more than doubled, as compared with the previous year, there has not been a corresponding increase in the number of "in-door" patients treated for disease of the eye. This is due to the fact that the ophthalmic surgeon is obliged to restrict his admissions to urgent cases. In view of this circumstance it will probably be well, when the position of the Institution permits it, to afford additional room to ophthalmic cases.

In the "out-door" departments of the Hospital nineteen thousand and seventeen (19,017) prescriptions were given to patients.

Thanks to the alterations and improvements which were reported at the last annual meeting as having been completed, no considerable expenditure of money on the building has occurred in the year under review.

With the view of reducing the expenditure of the Institution as far as possible consistently with its efficiency, some important alterations, in the administration and economy of the Hospital, have been made, and it is gratifying to be able to say that the diminished expenditure reported by the Committee of Management during the first half has been maintained throughout the last half of the financial year.

At the last quarterly meeting of Governors the Committee of Management reported the resignation of the Lady Superintendent, and (because of it) the resignation of Miss Blower and the four other English trained nurses employed in the Hospital.

"The resignation, which the Committee accepted with regret, will take place on the 30th June." The following extract from the Committee's report will be satisfactory to the members of the Corporation and all others interested in the Hospital:

"The standard of nursing in this Hospital has been greatly raised since the advent of Miss Machin, and it is desirable in every way that the present standard should be fully maintained. To this end the Committee are of opinion that it will be necessary to make some arrangements for training nurses in the Hospital, and

this question is respectfully submitted for the consideration of their successors and of the Governors as a body.

"The Committee are of opinion that the expenses hitherto incurred in bringing nurses from England have been abundantly compensated by the beneficial influence of the change upon the whole staff; but nurses cannot be expected to leave their homes unless special inducements are offered. We cannot continue to bring them from England or elsewhere without permanently raising the scale of wages; there would, therefore, be a certain degree of economy in training nurses here."

The hand of death has removed during the year one familiar name, that of the late H. L. Routh, Esq., from the roll of Life Governors, but the following considerable number of gentlemen have been added to it in the same period:
