Dr. Houghton began his academic career in 1911 in Missouri where he worked as a teacher and administrator in public schools until 1922. He then took the position of instructor in political science at the University of Illinois for two years. Following that, he was head of the social sciences division at N. E. Missouri Teachers' College for three years, following which he became professor of political science at the University of Arizona, which is his present position. He has also been a visiting professor at the Universities of Missouri, Illinois, Washington and Regina Campus, and has done university teaching on European summer tours.

There is not enough space here to include even a partial representative listing of Dr. Houghton's numerous publications. Suffice to say that he has written many scholarly papers dealing with: (American) state political - legal questions; broad questions in international affairs; and third (the bulk of his writing), American foreign policy.


At Regina Campus, Dr. Houghton gave a class on international affairs, in many cases forcing his students to reconsider comfortable attitudes which had, perhaps, been seized without much critical consideration. Very likely, this was his greatest contribution.

Dr. Goulet's field of scholarship could be described as development planning. In pursuing this interest he has done field work on psychological and sociological conditions of underdevelopment; worked on a census of immigrants in Toronto; worked as a labourer in proletarian areas of central France; worked as a factory hand in Madrid; lived in slums; and has lived with two nomadic tribes in the northern Sahara.

As a free agent on contract he has been a foreign student advisor and also a professor and assistant director of studies at Irfed, Paris. Shortly after participating in an U.N.E.S.C.O. symposium in 1960, he went to Brazil, working there until 1963 (except for a one year stint at Irfed). In Brazil, he did research on the interdisciplinary features of development, was a consultant to the territory of Rondonia and did research and lecturing at the University of Sao Paulo. From 1964 until he came to Regina Campus he was a development planning advisor for U.S.A.I.D.

At Regina Campus, he gave two classes. One, "Ethical Problems in Contemporary Economics", attempted to look at the philosophical questions raised by economic life, forces and pressures. In intradisciplinary class, it also studied how the disciplines converged and affected planning decisions and their concomitant effect on human life. The second, "Human Resource Planning in Economic Development", was more technical, dealing with education planning, man power policies, community development and research priorities, with the emphasis on the relation of the above factors to underdeveloped countries.



# THE CHANGING ROLE OF STUDENT GOVERNMENT D. Mitchell

The central student government on this campus, has chosen in the past couple of years to de-emphasize the 'social' role which had long been its largest claim to recognition. Leaving dances and intramural athletics to be organized by individual colleges, they have expanded into other areas. They have taken the lead in planning a multi-million dollar student union building, they have encouraged development of student owned and controlled co-operative residence, and they have assumed, and continue to seek, more power and responsibility in university government.

Through seminars, guest speakers, and the now famous "spotlight series," they have tried to encourage the students whom they serve to do more with their spare time than play cards or pick their noses. With your participation and your support, student government can be the living, breathing "pulse" of the university community.

#### The Student Union Building:

1965-66 saw the proposed student centre take definite steps towards becoming a reality. In July of 1965 the students' union hired Mr. Abie Okazaki as general manager to study and plan the project. A requirements study was completed in April '66 and a facilities list and cost analysis went before the university Board of Governors on June 2nd. It was approved in principle and turned over to the Buildings and Grounds Committee for a more detailed study, selection of architect, and inclusion in the university building program.

The building itself, if plans are approved will include lounge areas, music listening rooms, and art gallery. It will have meeting, banquet, and ballroom space for all groups and organizations on campus for any type of social or academic function. It will have office and working space for student government, publications and professional, hired administrative staff. The recreation area will consist of billiards, table tennis, bowling, and a creative arts and crafts room. Commercial outlets will include bank, and barbershop, as well as a university owned bookstore. There will be a communications centre with close circuit radio, and television hookups to other parts of the campus, and possibly an F.M. station broadcasting to the community. There will be central food services for the campus and a theatre to handle both local and outside productions.


The building as you can see will offer something to every student who enters. It will cater to large groups and small, as well as to the individual student. It will be the activities centre of the campus; a campus which is headed now for a maximum enrolment of 12,000. The need for a Students' Centre is apparent now; it will become more apparent and more urgent as our enrol-

ment increases. By 1970, which is now seen as the target date for the Centre, there will be five to six thousand students on this campus looking for its services and facilities. The Students' Representative Council is doing everything possible to ensure early completion.

#### The Wascana Student Housing Co-operative Ltd.:

This newly incorporated student co-operative, which represents the combined efforts of the S.R.C., the Anglican Church on Campus (A.C.O.C.), and a number of interested students; seeks as a final and continuing objective the construction of new student residences in the area of the new campus. The first board of directors of the Wascana Co-Op, have laid out a three stage program of development which will from its inception provide much needed facilities for 'out-of-town' students as well as providing valuable experience in co-operative living and planning with their peers. STAGE I will consist of renting or leasing older housing units with capital outlay for furnishings purchased by loan. It is anticipated at printing time that provisions can be made for twenty to fifty students in fall term '66. This stage in the program will serve as a training ground for successful operation of student co-operative residences, without the risks involved in large expenditures. STAGE II involves the purchasing of older housing units and will be operated similar to the rented accommodation in STAGE I. These units will provide accommodation for the second year but in addition they will be purchased with an eye to return on capital investment, if sold at the time of new construction. Houses in the area of the old campus are rapidly being drawn into downtown planning and may offer good value for short term investment. STAGE III represents the final objective and depends upon a number of undetermined factors, most particularly the availability of land in the area of the new campus. The construction of high-rise multi-dwelling units in Toronto and Waterloo offer sound precedents to build plans on. It is hoped that suites and single units would provide accommodation for up to 200 married and single students.

All stages of this project depend on outside support from an incorporated body which has been set-up precisely for that purpose. Co-operative College Residences Inc. Saskatchewan Ltd., is designed to provide assistance to student housing co-operatives initiated in Saskatchewan and will serve as an advisory and financial board of directors for all such projects. It is made up of major provincial co-operatives and offers permanence and stability to co-op housing enterprises undertaken by students. Student government is only involved in this project to promote it, guide it and help initiate it. They will then leave the co-operative to function on its own.






