

The Breakwater for a Railway Terminus.

It has been understood for some time past that the Dominion Board of Works has been desirous of securing the wharves and lands at the Breakwater with a view to establishing a proper Deep Water Railway Terminus.

The Committee, or such of them as have met, allege that they heartily favor the establishment of a Deep Water Terminus at or near the Breakwater, and also an extension of the track to Reed's Point wharf.

In the first place, they will consent to give the right of way through the Corporation lots on the Back Shore. They will give the Railway the most of the Breakwater, reserving only a width of one hundred feet, or about one fourth, along the front.

The Committee appear to have a decided objection to allowing a wharf to be built from the Breakwater across to Reed's Point. The distance is about 1,000 feet.

Paris, Jan. 25. Despatch from Nice reports a terrible RAILROAD ACCIDENT at City-to-day. While a train from Cannes was crossing the bridge over Pagliani River, the structure gave way and the cars were precipitated into the water.

New York, Jan. 25. To-night the Atlantic Boat Club, which defeated Harvard's and Yale's last summer, went to CHALLENGE the London Rowing Club to a four-oared shell race, in England, in June or July. Money for expenses out and back was subscribed on the spot, and the secretary was instructed to send out a challenge by next Saturday's steamer.

Passages are said to have been secured six or eight weeks in advance by all sailing and steamship lines. A great number from the Eastern States are now looking in Central Kansas and Eastern Colorado, while from both sources the Kansas and Pacific Railroad is daily receiving applications for lands to the value of two dollars and six cents per acre, and 150 acres credit which, if located in a body, would average over a mile square per day.

Lady Franklin has offered a reward of £2,000 for the recovery of the records of the Erebus and Terror, supposed to be deposited in King William's Land.

A report circulated, that the sentence of HANRI ROCHFORT has been commuted to banishment, is pronounced without foundation.

The Pope's advisers are urging him to quit the City. St. Petersburg, Jan. 25. A doctor has been issued, making compulsory use of THE RUSSIAN LANGUAGE in the primary schools of Poland.
