## RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Non-members will be charged \$2 for Entries, except parties entering for Special Prizes.
2. The Secretary will receive entries at the Omeme House from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m., on the first day of the Show, and from 8 to 10 a.m. on second day of Show, after which no entries can possibly be received.
3. Everything entered must be the BONA FIDE property of the Exhibitor.
4. No horse shall be eligible for more than one prize.
5. All field and horticultural productions shall have been grown by the exhibitor in the present year, and all manufactures must have been manufactured in the year 1896, and must be the work of the exhibitor.
6. No person shall enter or receive more than one prize for the same description or product or manufacture.
7. All articles entered in Class S, must be the work of the exhibitor, and such as have not hitherto received a prize at any previous show of this Society.
8. It is particularly requested that all the Produce and Manufactures be deposited in the Tent on the first day of the Show, so as to enable the Judges to proceed on the discharge of their duties early in the morning of the second day of the show, and no article will be admitted in the Tent after 10 30 o'clock on the second day of Show.

9. All entries should, if possible, be made on first day of Show.

10. No persons shall be allowed to remove any article from the Tent before 4.30 o'clock p.m., on second day of Show under penalty of forfeiting prizes.

11. Articles must be of such quality as the Judges approve, otherwise they will not be entitled to a premium.

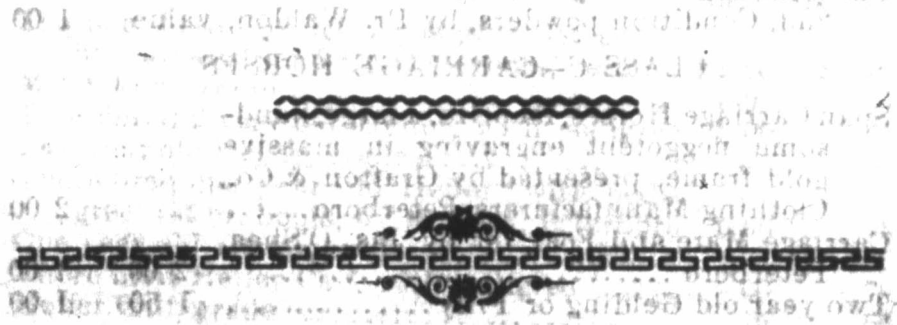
12. The directors will not be responsible for loss or damage to any article, but will endeavor to preserve all articles shown in the tents free from injury.

13. All animals and articles must be entered in their proper class.

14. When a dispute arises the ONUS of the proof lies with the exhibitor.

15. One dollar will be retained from all male prize winners, a membership for fee 1897.

16. All prizes that are not called for before the 1st of January, 1897, remains in the treasury, and belongs to the Society.

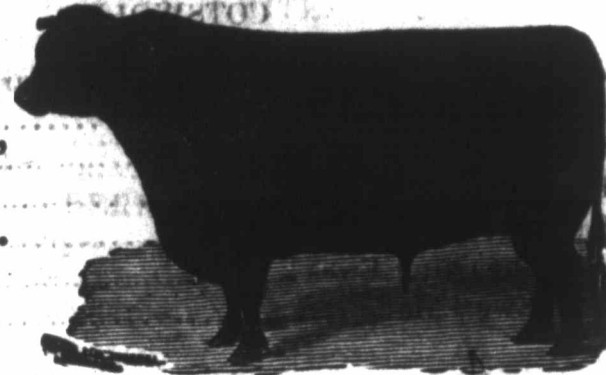
