

The Year 5660 of the Jewish Era commences at sunset on September 4th.

The Year 1317 of the Mohammedan Era, or Era of the Hegira, begins on the 12th day of May, 1899.

The 63rd year of Queen Victoria's reign begins June 20th, 1899.

The 33rd year of the Confederation of the Canadian Provinces as the Dominion of Canada commences on 1st July, 1899.

The 12th year of the Independence of the United States begins July 4th, 1899.

The first day of January, 1899, is the 2,414,656th day since the commencement of the Julian Period.

ECLIPSES.

In the year 1899 there will be three eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon.

- I. A Partial Eclipse of the Sun, January 11th, invisible.
- II. A Partial Eclipse of the Sun, June 7th, invisible.
- III. A Total Eclipse of the Moon, June 23rd, invisible.
- IV. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, December 2nd, invisible.
- V. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, December 16th, visible, Moon enters shadow 6.45 p.m. Middle of eclipse 8.26 p.m., Moon leaves shadow 10.07 p.m., magnitude of eclipse 0.996. (Moon's diameter=1).

MORNING AND EVENING STARS.

Venus will be a morning star to September 16th, afterwards an Evening Star. Mars is a Morning Star to January 18th, and an Evening Star to end of year. Jupiter is a Morning Star to April 23th, an Evening Star to Nov. 13th, then Morning Star. Saturn is a Morning Star to June 11th, an Evening Star to December 17th, then Morning Star. Mercury may be seen in the morning about January 11th, May 9th, September 5th, and December 25th, in the evening about March 24th, July 22nd, and November 16th. Venus will be at its greatest brilliancy January 5th. The Satellites of Jupiter will be invisible from October 15th until December 1th, Jupiter being too near the Sun.
