Civic Commission.

WEEKLY MEETING. The regular weekly meeting of the

Civic Commission was held yesterdayafternoon. Mayor Morris presided and Councillors Vinicombe, Peet, Collier, Jackman and Hallett were present, as were also Mayor-elect, Hon. Tasker Cook and Messrs. Ryan, Martin, Outeroridge and Dowden. Mayor Morris, in opening the meeting welcomed to the Council Chamber

the newly-elected representatives of the Municipality, and stated that the present Board would be only too glad to co-operate with them in all matters tending to the advancement and bettermen of the City.

The Minutes of the last meetings were then confirmed, after which the weekly accounts were presented for payment.

Geo. M. Johnson, Chairman Dickinson Memorial Committee, asked for information as to voltage of lights which the Council agreed, some time ago, to have placed at this monument. The information is to be obtained from the Superintendent of the Electrical Department, Reid Newfoundland Company, and forwarded Judge.

Aleck McDougald, Topsail Road, called attention to damage done his property through overflow of sewer which runs through same. The Engineer stated that this matter had been attended to during the past week. A letter was received from B. But-

ler, Acting Secretary, Employment Bureau, stating that, at a meeting recently held, it was decided to form a Committee consisting of representatives of the various unions and charitable institutions of the city, with a view to considering methods to remedy the unemployment situation. He asked that the Council appoint one of its members to represent it at this committee. It was decided to leave this matter to the incoming Council. Health Officer Brehm reported no cases of infectious disease in the city

for the week. The report of the City Engineer for the week was read. Mayor Morris then made the following suggestions, which he thought worthy of the consideration of the new Council, and which, if carried out, would be of great benefit to the city:--




