THE ROYAL CANADIAN BANK .--A large number of the shareholders

of this Bank met in Toronto on Satur-day. The Leader says that the state-ments made went far to show that the present condition of the Bank is by no means a bad one. It is the inten-tion of the Directors to appoint a com-mittee of investigation—some two or three gentlemen of repute and good standing—to examine into the state of the bank's affairs and make a report of the result of their examination at the approaching annual meeting. The di-rectors intend to apply to Parliament for a short Act to enable them, if it should be considered necessary, to amalgamate with another bank, or sell out, or make such other disposition of the property of the bank as would pre-vent its being eaten up in the slow process of liquidation. 
