The United States Crops. WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.-There is a reduction in condition of all cereals as reported by the statistician of the Department of Agriculture. The decline from July 1 to Aug. 1 is from 93.1 to 73.3 in corn, from 94.4 to 83.2 in spring wheat, from 81.6 to 70.1 in oats, from 88.3 to 82.8 in barley. The condition of buckwheat is 90.1 and of spring rye 86.8. The condition of Irish potatoes is reduced from 91.7 to 77.2.
