#### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO. It : suld be difficult to conceive of con-

ditions more favorable to the lumber trade than those which now exist. Lumber, whether white pine, hardwood or hemlock, practically sells itself. Dealers are booking large orders in advance of production and anticipate a steady trade throughout the year. In some instances orders for dry stock have been turned down on account of the scarcity in the supply of certain grades and sizes. There is no change to report in prices, for the reason that manufacturers as a whole are not taking advantage of every opportunity to boost values. Individual advances have been made on some lines, but the general policy seems to be to keep prices near the present basis and thus prevent, if possible, a curtailment in consumption. The outlook for building operations is favorable. In Toronto and Hamilton a number of large buildings are projected. In some quarters fear is expressed that labor difficulties may interfere with building to a slight extent, but on the other hand there seems to be a disposition on the part of employers to meet all reasonable demands. Considering the large percentage of the white pine lumber production of this province . 1

which has already been contracted for by United States buyers, it seems certain that the demand this season will be large enough to consume all available stock. Insympathy with the United States murket, lath prices are no more than holding firm. Shingles are exhibiting the usual strength incident to the approach of the

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The strength of the spruce market is due largely to the active demand for lumber for shipment to the Eastern States. Spruce has to some extent replaced white pine, and it is anticipated that more than the usual quantity will this year find a market in the United States. By some it is predicted that prices will advance sharply before the new cut is in shipping condition. European trade is still somewhat uncertain. Shippers are indisposed to pay the high prices asked by manufacturers until they are more certain that prices in the British market will be maintained. Some purchases of South American specifications have recently been made at good figures. Present indications point to an early resumption of sawing operations. With a continuance of favorable weather conditions logs will be in the brooks and driving operations started by the first of April.

#### MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

Remarkable activity characterizes the lumber industry of Western Canada. The prediction is made that the mills will not be able to supply the demand, but it does not seem probable that a dearth of lumber will be experienced. The large number of new mills that have been erected in British Columbia would seem to be sufficient to supply the increased demand arising from settlement in Manitoba and the Territories. Some fear is expressed that building operations will be hampered by labor difficulties, the carpenters of Winnipeg having already submitted an ultimatum to the contractors notifying them of a demand for an increased scale of WAZES.

#### UNITED STATES.

A heavy demand from Chicago for low grade white pine boards has developed. Buying in the Minneapolis district has reduced the supply to such a point that box manufacturers fear a famine in dry stock suitable for their purposes. Reports from manufacturers indicate that they are short of almost everything except. No. 1 and No. 2 boards. This somewhat unexpected demand for the lower grades has created additional confidence in market conditions and brought about a buying movement on the part of dealers. Inquiries for stock to be shipped upon the opening of navigation have increased in number, notwithstanding that prices are about two dollars higher than at the opening of navigation one year ago. It is claimed that prices at eastern wholesale centres are still low when compared with the figures asked by manufacturers, A Buffalo dealer gives the following prices at which he sells inch white pine: Uppers, \$80; selects, \$70; fine common, \$58; No. 1 cuts, \$42; dressing, \$38; 12inch No. 1 barn, \$32; No. 2 barn, \$27; No. 3 barn, \$23; 12-inch box, \$20. These prices are said to represent no more than a fair margin of profit.

The hardwood market is in a very sutisfactory condition. Inch quartered white oak has sold at unprecedented prices. Basswood leads in point of strength and scarcity, followed closely by elm. Maple is in moderate supply only, thick sizes being quite scarce.

Lath is slightly weaker and offerings are more plentiful. In the Saginaw Valley No. 1 pine lath are held at \$3.75 and No. 2 at \$3.25. In Chicago quotations are \$3.50 for No. 1, \$3 for No. 1 Norway, and \$3.15 to \$3.25 for No. 1 mixed.

#### GREAT BRITAIN.

The deadlock between the shippers and the British importers still exists. Much less than the usual quantity of stock has been contracted for. It is considered only a question of a short time before sellers and buyers will come together, although it is difficult to judge as to which side will give way. The conditions seem to favor the shippers, and particularly in respect to the Canadian supply, which will be unusually light on account of the large demand at home and in the United States. There is no change to report in white pine deals. A considerable quantity of red pine deals, 3x9, 4x9 and 3 x11, have been placed for shipment from Montreal. The spruce market in steady. The stock of soruce deals in the Surrey Commercial Docks, London, is under half a million pieces. Agents of Canadian exporters are holding out for £9 158 c.i.f. London for 3x9 second quality spruce, L9 5s for third quality and £8 15s for tourth quality. It is reported that in one or two instances these prices have been shaded slightly, but this has been due to the inferior quality of the stock offered. At recent public sales second quality 3x9 spruce brought Lto 5s, third quality L9 15s and second quality 3x7 £8.

#### STOCKS AND PRICES.

The Brompton Pulp & Paper Company took out about 12,000,000 feet of logs this season for their pulp mill at Brompton Falls, Que.

At Thomson Station, N. S., lumbering operations this season are unusually brisk. About 3,000,000 feet of lumber is now ready for shipment.

White pipe shingles are held in the Saginaw Valley at \$5.35 for XXXX and \$3.25 for clear butts. White cedar 18-inch XXXX are quoted at \$4 and butts at \$2.75.

The Ontario Power Company, of Niagara Falls, Ont., is using Canifornia redwood for the construction of its pen-tock. It is estimated that 6,000,000 feet will be required.

Considerable logging has been done this winter on the Salmon river in British Columbia, and some 3,000,000 feet of logs are now awaiting high water for transportation to the Columbia River Lumber Company's mill at Kualt.

Reports from the lumber comps in the Riding and Duck Mountains of Manitoba are to the effect that the past winter was

the most favorable for years for getting out logs. The number of men engaged in the camps was double that of c.her years. and the output of logs will be the largest in the history of the district.

O. E. Elsemore, of Bay City, Mich., has recently been in the Sudbury district and reports that the following quantities of logs have been banked on the north shore in Spanish River waters: Saginaw Lumber & Salt Company, 28,000,000 feet: N. N. Wright & Co., 30,000,000 fc.; Victoria Harbor Lumber Co., 10,000,000 ft.; Turner Lumber Co., 8,000,000 ft.; Spanish River Lumber Co., 12,000,000 ft.; Edmund Hall, 15,000,000 ft.; Holland & Graves, 25,000,000 ft.; Cleveland & Sarnia Saw Mills Co., 20,000,000 ft.; Moulthrop Lumber Company, 8,000,000 ft.

The Edward Hines Lumber Company. of Chicago, last week closed negotiations at Marinette, Wis., for the purchase of 80,000,000 feet of lumber, represented by two transactions. The first purchase consisted of the cut of the two mills of the Ludington Company, aggregating 50,000,000 feet of white pine lumber, 15,000,000 shingles, and 20,000,000 laths, the purchase price being approximately \$1,000,000. The second purchase was the cut of the Marinette mill of the H. Witbeck Company comprising 30,000,000 feet of white pine lumber. These purchases comprise practically two-thirds of the combined output of the Marinette and Menomimoe mills.

Under date of February 28th Messrs. Clairmonte, Man & Company say of the Barbadoes market: We note two arrivals with lumber during the fortuight, a schooner from Annapolis, N.S., with 173,ogo feet white pine, spruce and hemluck, and a schooner from Belleveau Cove. N.S.. with 160,000 feet spruce. The cargo of the former was sold to arrive at \$26 for first and \$21 for second quality white pine, and \$22 and \$20 for spruce. The cargo of the latter brought \$22.50 for first and \$19.50 for second quality spruce, and 28,000 long hemlock shingles brought \$2.40. Our yards are still barely supplied, as during our crop season, just commenced, there is always a good demand. There has been no arrival of shingles since October. Last sales were made at \$4.80 to \$5.04 for Gaspe Long Cedar and are now worth more. Cedar Laying are selling at \$1.82 and Spruce Laying at \$1.65 to

#### LUMBERING OPERATIONS IN NEW BRUNSWICK.

R. A. Estey, of Fredericton, has completed his season's operations on the Tobique river, also a successful season's work on the Rockaway, Madawaska county. Mr. Estey's season's cut will be about -.000.000 feet.

Herbert Hay, of the firm of W. A. & J. H. Hay, of Millville, has just completed operations on the Beccaguitane river, where he cut 1,500,000 for A. H. Sawyer, of Hartland.

Josiah Hallett, of Millville, has finished his season's operations on the Nashwank, where he cut 2,000,000 for the Alexander Gibson Company.

Hilyard Bros., of St. John, have taken out about 6.000,000 feet.

J. J. Hale, Donald Fraser & Sons, and other large lumber operators on the Tob. que are already hauling supplies into their camps for next season and are experience ing considerable difficulty on account of the heavy condition of the roads. The Burns Company, of Bathurst, are bauling supplies through from the Toblque to the Bathurst river.

H. M. Craig, of Perth Centre, who has been operating for the Tobique Manufacturing Company, on Sisson Brook, cut 2,000,000 teet this winter.

#### THR HEMLOCK SITUATION.

Western manufacturers of hemlock, according to the American Lumberman, are reporting flattering conditions prevailing in the various departments of their industiv and from all accounts the coming season promises to be one of the most active that the manufacturers have ever enjoyed. Dry stocks are exceedingly low and broken in assortment. Shippers are great ly bothered by the scarcity of cars, which, white annoying, should in a measure conduce to the strengthening of market values. The volume of sales is steadily increasing as the season advances, although operations are at a standstill in some sections owing to the bad condition of the country roads.

A manufacturer who has made a careful survey of the situation confidently predicts that there will be a substantial increase in the quantity of hemlock sold during 1903, which he thinks will be greater than for any year previous to this, estimating the expected increase at from 25 to 35 per cent. over previous seasons. He gives as a reason for this that stocks are already in favorable demand, that norway piece stuff is scarce and will continue so, and that the spread in prices is greater in comparison with other woods used for construction purposes than it has ever been since accurate data on the subject have been secured. Occasionally it is noted that some of those who are selling hemlock on a commission basis are able to find a soft spot here and there, but no particular attention is paid to this by the larger manufacturers, as they are able to dispose of their stocks without difficulty to the country trade at list prices, and the surplus, when any exists, is well cared for in Chicago and the larger markets. More hemlock is going into the country trade this spring than had been counted on and but for the temporarily low prices that are being made on yellow pine dimension hemlock would doubtless find no difficulty in reaching territory that heretofore has been regarded as a natural absorbent of the southern stock. Even as it is, hemlock distribution is steadily expanding through the western and middle states, and its position for future development is regarded as entirely satisfactory by hemlock manufacturers in all sections.

WHITE POR PARTICULARY AND QUOTATIONS.

#### TIMBER LIMIT TRANSACTIONS.

It is announced that the Rat Portage Lumber Company has purchased the timber limits and saw mill of W. L. Tait at Vancouver, B.C., the consideration being \$100,000.

H. M. Whitney, of Boston, and B. F. Pearson and H. J. Crowe, of Halifax, N. S., are organizing a lumber company to be capitalized a \$2,000,000. The field of operation will be Newfoundland, where timber limits and saw mills have been purchaned.

#### THE GLASGOW MARKET.

From Edmiston & Mitchell's monthly timber circular we extract the following: Business during the month of February has been fairly active at firm prices, and the few shipments of pine and spruce deals which came to hand via St. John and Portland were for the most part promptly disposed of from the ships' side. The position of the market as regards pine is very strong, and a fair amount of business has been done in contracting for delivery during the coming season, but in spruce there has not been the same activity, buyers not responding as readily to shippers' prices as in the case of pine. Sidings continue scarce, and are in active demand, and the same remark applies to broad 1st quality pine deals.

In American hardwoods a steady business has been passing, and values of poplar and quartered oak lumber continue firm, a remark which equally applies to good walnut and oak logs.

Deliveries from stock have been well maintained during the month, and everything denotes general activity in the trade.

The Clyde shipbuilding returns show that 29 vessels aggregating about 42,000 tons were launched, compared with 16 vessels, of about 41,000 tons, in February, 1902. In new work it is gratifying to state that several vessels have been placed within the past few weeks, and, now that the threatened strike has been averted, the prospects of this important industry are more satisfactory.

In housebuilding there is also considerable activity in the city and neighborhood.

WHITE OR YELLOW PINE. - Business during the month has been fairly active, and quite a number of big parcels have changed hands during the month. We hear of 80 logs 1st class waney, about 2300 feet per page, having been sold to a shipbuilder at 4s. 3d. per cubic foot; about 400 loads and class waney, about 1200 feet per page, at 2s. 7d. per cubic foot; and 3-400 loads 1st class square, 40-feet average cube, at 2s. 7d. to 2s. 8d. per cubic foot. The stock of waney in first hands is low, but there is an ample supply of square wood.

RED PINE. - There have been no sales to report, as stock in first hands is exhausted. An early consignment of good-sized wood would meet with a ready sale.

Oak.-There has been very little en-

quiry during the month, and no transactions of importance. Stock is ample, and is moving off slowly.

ELM-There have been a number of enquiries during the month, and several lines of 1st class rock have been placed at prices round about 3s 1d to 3s 2d per cubic foot. We hear also of a parcel or two of soft elm having seen cleared at is ad per cubic foot.

Bincii-Quebec - There has been no import so far this year of either logs or planks, but it is reported that there are some logs due shortly via Portland, which have been sold to arrive. The position of the market is firm, and values about 19d for 15-inch up to 2x for 17 to 18-inch average. There is little or no demand for small wood, but several enquiries for 16-in h average. Lower Port-There is no stock of logs on hand and the nominal value is round about 17d to 18d for 15-inch average. Planks-Stocks are heavy and prices are unaltered at about 11d per foot for ordinary Halifax planks.

Astt-There is nothing of importance to report, the only movement being an occasional retail transaction in logs and lumber. Prices are round about is 6d for 121 inch up to 24 for 1416-inch average.

DEALS, ETC. - Business during the month has been of a fairly active character and deliveries from the public yards are well maintained. First pine deals and sidings are much enquired for, and those arriving per liners are keenly com-

peted for by buyers. Current values are as under :-Broad First Pine Deals, £32 to £34; 21-inch, £29 to £31; ends and non-dimensions, £22 to £24. Second Pine Deals-11-inch and up, £19 to £21 10s; ends and non-dimensions, £13 to £14 tos. Third Pine Deals-11-inch and up, £13 to £14 10s; ends and non-dimensions, Lto to Lit. Red Pine Dealsg and 11-inch, L11 10s to L12 10s; narrows, L8 10s to L9 10s. First Pine Sidings—9 and 10-inch, L24 to L25; 11 to 12-inch, L26 to £28; 13 to 14 inch, £20 to £31. Spruce Deals—9-inch and up, £8 15s to £9 10s; 7 and 8 inch, £7 5s to £85s. Lower Port Pine and Spruce—7 and 8 inch, £7 to £7 15s; 0-inch and up. L8 5s. L3wer Port Pine and Spruce , and 8 inch, L7 to L7 15s; 9-inch and up, L8 5s to L8 15s.


