London, Nov. 21.—It is credibly reported, says the Shanghai correspondent of the Daily Telegraph, under yesterday's date, that the Empress Dowager had telegraphed a secret decree warning all governors and viceroys to prepare for immediate war against the allies everywhere.

Allies to Take Stronger Measures. "At last," says the Shanghai correspondent of the Morning Post, writing yesterday, "the allies in Peking have resolved upon stronger measures to bring matters to a crisis. They have asked the viceroy of Nankin to state definitely his position towards the Chinese court, and the question of forwarding supplies."

Report From Waldersee. Berlin, Nov. 20.—The War Office has received the following telegram from Field Marshal Count Von Waldersee:

"A detachment consisting of two companies of infantry, a force of mounted men and two guns, under command of Major Muehlenfels, has been despatched, via Sankin, to the 21 kilometre west of Peking, Nov. 18. The carrier reported that the Chinese column under Col. York arrived 25 kilometres south of Peking on Nov. 17. On returning, Col. York took no communication with Major Muehlenfels."

Foreign Minister Delcasse Says French Forces Will Not Be Withdrawn From China.

Paris, Nov. 20.—The debate on the budget for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs was continued in the Chamber of Deputies today.

Minister of Foreign Affairs Delcasse, explaining the origin of the force, existing to relieve the foreign legations at Peking, referred to the German ultimatum in the defence of the legations, and declared the armistice of cruelty against the French and international troops to be unfounded.

Delcasse traced the submission of the French note to the legations, and said it was unnecessary to obtain the consent of the Chinese government, which he said he had refused to do.

"Everyone desires to end the situation," he said.
