

**BYE-LAWS**  
OF THE  
**Board of Home Missions.**

---

1st. At all the meetings of the Board or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be Chairman of the Board, and the very Rev. the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be ex-officio, Vice-Chairman. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer.

3rd. The Board shall consist of the Chairman, Vice-Chairmen Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and the Treasurer of the Board, who shall fill the same offices in the Committees; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese, together with twenty Laymen to be chosen by the Diocesan Synod. At each ordinary meeting of the Synod, one-half of the whole number of lay members of the Board shall go out of office, but they or any of them shall be eligible for re-election: the new members having been proposed, seconded and elected by ballot, shall be placed at the bottom of the list. No one shall be elected a member of the Board who is not an annual contributor to its funds of at least one dollar.

4th. The Board shall meet monthly during the year with the exception of August and September, seven being a quorum for the transaction of business; and a general meeting thereof shall be held annually in July or at the time of meeting of the Synod, to which matters may be referred from the ordinary meetings of the Board, and such appeals addressed as have hitherto been allowed to the general meeting of members of the D. C. S. A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chairman, or in his absence by a Vice-Chairman.

5th. The members of the Church in every part of the Province are invited to co-operate with the BOARD, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the BOARD.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Board, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention :—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision to be appointed by the Board, shall then have received the approval of the Board ; and lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.
- 6.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.
- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Board, to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen ; but no part of the funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid for these objects.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied ; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects.

6th. The Accounts of the Board shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Board.

7th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at an Ordinary Meeting of the Synod ; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

**REPORT**  
 OF THE  
**BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS,**  
 TO THE  
**DIOCESAN SYNOD OF NOVA SCOTIA.**

---

The Board report that in accordance with the joint action of the Synod and the Diocesan Church Society, the funds of the latter were in July last transferred to the former upon the terms and under the conditions agreed upon, which terms and conditions have been printed and published in the Record of the Thirteenth Session of the Synod.

The various documents and vouchers connected with those funds have been received by this Board, and a statement of the securities and investments will be found in another part of this Report.

The balance of the several accounts of the Diocesan Church Society have also been received by this Board, and a certificate filed from the auditors that the accounts were correct and satisfactory. A memorandum of these balances is appended.

The total amount disposable for general purposes during 1877 was a balance from the former year of \$876.40, and the above named \$5216.68,

equal to \$6093.08. The expenditure was \$5933.50, chiefly for support of missions, leaving a balance of \$159.58 to the credit for the year 1878. Had all the salaries been called for which were due at the end of the year there would have been a deficiency of about \$500.

The auditors for the year 1877 have reported that, having examined the accounts and investments, the former were found correct and satisfactory, and the latter to agree with the Secretary's statement, a copy of which is herewith printed.

The total amount of grants to Missions for three years from 1st January, 1877, is \$5590 per annum, on condition of \$7280 from the people.

Considering the comparatively large amount pledged for the support of missionaries, there is every probability that the Board will be obliged, unless greater support is found, to curtail its expenditures.

The Board beg leave to remind the Synod that, in accordance with the rules, one-half of the whole number of lay-members of the Board go out of office, and that the vacancies have to be filled up.

The following resolution, adopted at the general meeting of the Board in May, 1878, is submitted for consideration in connection with a motion already on the Records of the Synod :—

"The Church, as represented by the Annual General Meeting of the Diocesan Church Society, in 1875, affirmed the imperative necessity to the well-being of the parishes and missions throughout the Diocese, that the minimum salary of the clergy should be \$800 per annum. This Board warmly endorse the said opinion, and in hopes of carrying it into effect, or approximating more nearly thereto, recommend

*Firstly*, That no subscription lists received after 31st December in each year be published in the Annual Reports.

*Secondly*, That the Executive Committee be instructed to make arrangements, if possible, with the several Boards or Committees under, or connected with, the Boards of Missions, and to engage a Clerical Secretary to the Synod and the various schemes connected with it, as the Boards of Missions, the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, &c., &c., who, under instructions from the Board shall visit such parts of the Diocese as may be deemed expedient, and, with the co-operation of the clergy, hold meetings in behalf of the Board, and canvas the members and friends of the church in aid of its funds.

*Thirdly*, That \$1000 be appropriated from the several schemes under the control of the Synod for one year, in such proportions as may be deemed advisable and just, as a salary for such Secretary, to which such travelling expenses shall be added as shall be unavoidably incurred, while in the discharge of his duty—the salary to be renewed from time to time or amended, at the pleasure of the Synod.

They recommend also that the name of this Board be changed from "Board of Diocesan Missions," to "Board of Home Missions."

## Report of the Widows' & Orphans' Committee to the Board of Home Missions.

---

The Committee report that the general meeting of the Society in 1877 requested this Committee to consider and report upon the position which clergymen should occupy with regard to this fund who, in future, after receiving certificates, may leave the Diocese.

In accordance with the above, this Committee adopted the following recommendations to the general meeting of the Board, viz.:—

The Committee are of opinion that it would be best for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund that the connection between a clergyman and the Fund should be severed by his removal from the Diocese. Also, they recommend that seventy-five per cent of the amount of premiums, paid by the holder of the certificate himself, be returned to him upon the surrender of his certificate.

In consequence of the transfer of the fund from the Diocesan Church Society to the Synod, the Committee find it necessary to make certain alterations in the form of the certificates issued. A copy of the amended form is herewith submitted, to which may be added such amendment as may be agreed upon with reference to clergymen leaving the Diocese.

Your Committee report that the income of the Fund for 1877, was \$2250.58, derived from the following sources, viz.:—

The charges upon the Fund were \$2260. This amount is increased in consequence of a resolution by the general meeting authorizing the payment of pensions at the full rate to the orphans of the late Rev. J. Crisp. The interest upon investments is less than last year inasmuch as certain persons were tardy in making payments in due time. These, however, have been since received.

There are now ten claimants upon the Fund. The Committee append a list of the clergy holding certificates, and also of the collections received from the several missions during the year 1877.

At the general meeting of the Board of Home Missions, May, 1878, the above Report was adopted and ordered to be presented to the Synod together with the Report of the Board.

With reference to the proposed regulations relative to the case of clergy leaving the Diocese, the following amendment was adopted.

Except in the case of any clergyman who shall become a missionary of the Board of Foreign Missions of this Diocese, or who undertakes work in Algoma while a missionary Diocese.

At the ordinary meeting of the Synod in May, 1878, the above Report of the Board of Home Missions, including that of the Widows' and Orphans' Committee, was adopted.

## Report of the Board of Foreign Missions of the Diocese of Nova Scotia, May 1878.

This Synod not having been called together last year, the Board has had no opportunity of reporting since July 5th, 1877.

At a meeting of the Board, held at the Bishop's house July 20th, 1877, the following was found to be the state of the Funds:—

A circular was issued to each clergyman asking aid toward increasing this sum to \$1200, which was considered by the Board to be necessary before it could undertake to send to the heathen a missionary from among ourselves. Since the annual meeting in July, 1877, there has been received \$469.17, i. e., for ten months; \$56.25 was also received by the Rev. C. M. Sills, Secretary and Treasurer for Algoma towards Shingwauk Home; present balance in hand, \$1007.11.

The Treasurer's accounts have been duly audited. There was an increase in the funds of 1876 over 1875 of \$171.98, in 1877 over 1876 \$187.83. The year 1878 cannot be compared until its completion in July. A total increase over 1875 of \$359.81 up to last year. It is the most anxious wish of the Board that the proportion of increase should become still larger each year, and it now calls upon every member of the

Synod to exert himself strenuously toward the attainment of this much to be desired object.

The Synod is called upon to fill up two vacancies in the Board, caused by the much regretted absence of Dr. J. R. DeWolfe from this Session of the Synod and the removal of the late Secretary (Rev. J. R. Campbell) from the Diocese. With regard to the latter, the Board ventures to suggest that the present Secretary be appointed to fill the place vacated by his predecessor.

When the *Church Chronicle* was no longer published, the Board greatly felt the loss of the ready and gratuitous aid of that paper in circulating throughout the Diocese missionary notices and intelligence, and the Board was put to some expense in the way of printing. Latterly, however, the *Dominion Churchman* has also been most generous in the admission of intelligence forwarded by the Secretary and the Treasurer. To the proprietors of both these papers the Board offers its grateful thanks.

It is deeply felt by the Board that the death of so eminent a missionary Bishop as the late Right Rev. George Augustus Selwyn ought to receive due notice from this Synod. The claims of that apostolic prelate upon the gratitude and admiration of all who love the Lord Jesus Christ are so thoroughly recognized that they need not here to be dwelt upon at length. Sent out at about 40 years of age, and working for 26 years in New Zealand, as few can work, he was enabled to lay down his life in his native land, with the thought that in that period the region in which he had begun, as the only Bishop of our Communion, Christ Church, Nelson, Dunedin, Auckland, Wellington, Waiapu, Honolulu and Melanesia have all been provided with chief pastors of their own, the Melanesian Bishop being *his own son*.

Would it not be well that this Synod ask his Lordship our Bishop, to express to the Widowed Diocese of Lichfield, and through it to the Church at large, our very warm sentiments of esteem and veneration for him whose loss is so deeply and sincerely mourned?

The great work now going on in India, under Bishop Caldwell in Tinnevely, calls forth our sympathizing joy! 16000 natives have been added to the church since that Bishops' consecration in March last year.

Why is it that we cannot furnish one of the additional Missionaries now required for the further developement of this great movement ?

But this Board must again call upon the church in this Diocese, to remember the pre-eminent claims of the Heathen Indians of our own Dominion—the peculiar claims they have upon us. The words which the devoted Bishop of Minnesota has spoken to the church in the United States, we would cause to re-echo throughout this Diocese.

“These heathens are at our door! Christ died for them! In their sorrow and need they look to us! We must weigh our duty as under the eye of God! We must measure it by the Cross. Once settled—let neither man nor devil hinder us! God will work with us and bless us and many who are perishing will be owned as Christ's in the day of his appearing.”

## Annual General Meeting of the Diocesan Church Society.

The meeting was held in the National School Room, July 3rd, 1877.

The Right Rev. the Lord Bishop in the Chair.

The Bishop stated that this was the last meeting of the Diocesan Church Society, and that henceforth all its interests would be transferred to the Synod to be continued under the same Rules and Regulations. He spoke of the good work which the Society had done in the Diocese, and expressed a hope that the same work would be carried on under the change of name.

The meeting directed that the Treasurer of the Diocesan Church Society shall receive from the Treasurer of the Synod a receipt for all monies and securities transferred.

The Widows' and Orphans' Committee having decided that they could pay the pension to the orphans of the late Rev. T. Crisp only in accordance with Rule 14, as it was worded at the time of Mr. Crisp's death, (viz., for ten years from the date of his death,) an appeal was made by their guardian to the whole Society. It was—

*Resolved*, That the pension be paid by the Widows' and Orphans' Committee in accordance with the amended 14th Rule.

The Widows' and Orphans' Committee was requested to consider and report upon the position which clergymen should occupy with regard to the fund who in future, after receiving certificates, may leave this Diocese.

The meeting was dismissed with the Benediction, "*Vale.*"

## Extracts from the Minutes of the Executive Committee of the D. C. S.

---

MAY 18, 1877.—The Secretary read a memorandum of receipts and also of the missions from which no returns had been made. The Secretary was directed to notify certain Missions that the grants under the control of this Society cannot be continued if its interests are thus ignored.

The Secretary read a draft of the 39th Annual Report, which, after some amendment, was adopted and ordered to be published as usual.

JUNE 15.—The following recommendation from the Quebec Scheme Committee was adopted :

That an additional grant of \$25 be made to the Mission at Cumberland Mines, provided that \$25 be raised from some other sources.

JULY 6.—At a meeting of the Board of Diocesan Missions, a Committee was appointed to inspect and report upon all insurance policies held by the Board.

The Committee upon Widows' and Orphans' Fund was re-appointed ; also, the Committee upon investments and Block Sum S. P. G.; and also the Committee upon the Quebec Scheme.

Mr. Silver gave notice of motion for the appointment of a travelling Secretary to advocate the claims of the Society.

OCT. 19.—The Committee upon insurance policies made the following Report:—"That having examined the policies, they found them generally satisfactory, but they recommend that new policies be taken out, in lieu of the present ones, in favor of the Diocesan Synod, and that in future all policies held by the Synod expire and be renewable on the 10th of July."

The Report was adopted.

The Secretary presented a report from the auditors of the D. C. S. accounts, stating that they had found them correct and satisfactory.

Messrs. Marling and Allison were appointed auditors for the half year ending Decr. 31, 1877.

The Secretary submitted a statement of finance, shewing that when all the claims up to the end of the current year were paid there would be a deficiency of more than \$200.

The following members of the Board were appointed as the Endowment Committee :—Messrs. W. C. Silver, H. Pryor, T. A. Brown, J. W. Marling and C. Bullock.

Also, as the Superannuation Committee, together with the Bishop, *ex officio*, Messrs. S. P. Fairbanks, W. C. Silver, J. T. Wood, J. T. Wylde, R. J. Wilson and Dr. DeWolfe.

Nov. 16.—The Committee upon investments reported that in view of the transfer of all property to the Diocesan Synod, they examined the securities held by the Diocesan Church Society and found them generally satisfactory. The exceptions being a loan made on a property in Cape Breton and a fire insurance policy on a property in the city. The objection to the former being that the property on which the money is loaned is not in the city of Halifax, to which city they think all loans on mortgage should be confined. The objection to the latter is that in their judgment the building insured is over-valued. Some loans have been made without the knowledge of the investment Committee, but now all proposed investments pass (as formerly) under their review and await their approval before consummation."

The above report was adopted.

It was recommended to the Widows' and Orphans' Committee that they should prepare a new form of certificate adapted to the changed position of the Fund with reference to the Synod.

JAN. 18, 1878.—On the recommendation of the Quebec Scheme Committee, a grant of \$300 was made to the mission of Melford on condition of \$220 from the people. The grant to terminate with the other missionary grants at the end of 1879.

FEB. 15.—The Auditors reported that they had found the Treasurer's accounts for the half year ending Decr. 31, 1877, correct and satisfactory. Also, that they had examined the securities and found them to correspond with the Secretary's statement.

Messrs. Marling and Wiswell were appointed Auditors for the year 1878.

MARCH 15.—The following resolution, moved by the Rev. Alfred Brown, seconded by Mr. Meynell, was adopted for presentation at the general meeting of the Board.

*Whereas*, At the Annual General Meeting of the Diocesan Church Society in 1875, the Executive Committee was requested to endeavor to carry out a report then adopted by the Society, which recommended that the minimum salary of the Clergy be \$800 a year,

*And whereas*, It is desirable to raise the annual income of the Board of Diocesan Missions to at least \$7000,

*Therefore resolved*, That no subscription lists received after December 31st in each year be published in the Annual Report, and that this Board recommend the appointment of a Clerical Organizing Secretary, whose duty it shall be, at such times as this Board may appoint, to visit the parishes of the Diocese, and with the co-operation of the clergy, to hold meetings on behalf of the Board, and canvas the members of the church in aid of its funds.

APRIL 26.—With reference to an application for renewal of grant to meet expenses of missionary visits to St. Peters, C. B., the Board were of opinion that inasmuch as the grant was made for one year only in expectation that the people having had the ministrations of a clergyman for that period would be willing to pay for their continuance, therefore the Board were not willing to renew the grant.

It was directed that for this year the Annual Report be published as usual under the direction of the Secretary.

The Secretary was directed to prepare a brief report from the Board to the Diocesan Synod.

At the General Meeting of the Board, May 14, 1878, the report prepared for presentation to the Synod was adopted, together with its recommendations relative to appointment of a General Secretary (vide report). The Report of the Widows' and Orphans' Committee was also adopted.

It was recommended that the name be changed from Board of Diocesan Missions to Board of Home Missions.

## Extracts from Letters.

RAWDON, HANTS COUNTY, 1877.

The work and progress of the church in this parish have been specially marked during the past year. In April last the Lord Bishop visited the parish, and administered the rite of confirmation. Twenty-two were confirmed, and at the celebration of Holy Communion in the Parish Church there were forty-two lay communicants. Not only have most of the newly confirmed become regular communicants, but some others who had been before confirmed; showing us the blessing in the administration of confirmation to others, as well as to those actually presenting themselves for the laying on of hands. Indeed all present at the services must have been impressed by the solemn words of exhortation and encouragement addressed to them by their Bishop.

In temporal matters the chief event of the year has been the building of a large barn on the glebe farm. At the Easter Meeting, 1876, it was decided that the old building could only last another winter, and the Church Wardens, Mr. Casey and Mr. Alfred Smith, were appointed a committee to carry out the work of preparing for and building the new one. Subscriptions in cash, lumber, and work were solicited throughout the parish, and so responded to that everything was in readiness in June, 1877, when the old barn was pulled down and the new one put up and ready for use before haying. The readiness with which this work was taken up, and the successful manner in which it was carried out, was a matter of great encouragement to me, as it manifested a very earnest feeling on the part of the parishioners to do what was right by their clergyman, or as they style him, "the parson." The cost was little short of \$250; and the new building enhances the value of the glebe in no little measure, the old barn having become of little use.

The general work of the church here goes on quietly, and one occasionally sees visible proof that God's Word will not return to Him void, and that our Lord Jesus Christ, according to His true promise, is with His Church, blessing and sanctifying her work to the salvation of souls.

HUBBARD'S COVE, *January 9th, 1878.*

I send the Annual Report to the Diocesan Church Society, and I feel happy and thankful to Almighty God that He has vouchsafed me health and strength to complete a year, almost every day of which was fraught with scenes, some of which were most trying and even harrowing to the feelings. About the commencement of last year that fearful disease, diphtheria, and other epidemics made their appearance among the parishioners, so that almost the whole of my time was taken up in visiting the sick in confined and overpeopled houses, and burying the dead. A part of the time I had to wade for miles through deep snow, owing to the bridges being taken away by high tides. It happened more than once that four interments took place at the same time. Taking an intermediate position between the open graves, I would read the service so as to be heard by all. To accomplish these and other duties you will perceive, by looking over the report, I travelled over 1800 miles, paid 808 pastoral visits, held 210 services, baptized 60,

and buried 63, when on other years they averaged 15 deaths. Add to which various other parish duties that required constant and unremitting attention, which left me at times utterly prostrated both in mind and body. How long I may be able to carry it out, single handed and alone, I cannot say. But oh, what a refreshment to my weary spirits was the season of Advent, and the glorious festival of Christmas. We had a Christmas Tree for the Sunday School children, and our parish church very tastefully trimmed, and the services on the high festival itself and the following days were most delightful and very well attended, and an evident improvement in the way in which the people in general observed the happy season.

SHELburnE, April 3rd, 1878.

I am sorry to say that our contribution to the D. C. S., or rather to D. B. M., (those letters do not look so familiar to my eye as the old ones), is something short of last year. It ought not to be so, although the parish has had a good many calls upon its liberality during the last year. This is, it is true, a large parish, but the people are scattered, and the distances between the town and outstations and between station and station are long, and cause labour disproportioned to the number of parishioners and also a waste of time on the road. As, for instance, it took me from 8.30 A. M. to 4.30 P. M. to visit one sick person. True, I also administered the Lord's Supper, and baptized two children, but it took up a great deal of time, although well repayed by witnessing the gratitude of the poor fellow, and his entire submission to His Heavenly Father's will. But what I want to say is that the parish ought to be divided, for no two clergymen *living in the town* can do the duties of the mission as they should be done, or at all satisfactorily to themselves. How this is to be accomplished is the difficulty. I cost the parish not a cent and have not for years, and never very much, and the town congregation now raises three-fourths of the Curate's salary. As long, therefore, as I do the work of a better man (and indeed that cannot in the course of nature be much longer, as I am in my 73rd year), they will make no effort for a division. We ought to have a missionary at Lockeport, who could, if he were a faithful servant in the Master's vineyard, have a large field to cultivate, and I think with a prospect of a good harvest.

The great depression in our Fisheries for the last two years, the sudden stoppage of work on our railway, and the prevalence of fatal diseases for the last year, small-pox, fever, and diphtheria, have all contributed to lessen the number of our subscribers.

S., and earnestly wish it were more, but my ward is not a rich one, though perhaps some might have given more according to their means. I often think how many small sums are spent, without thought many times, upon what we would simply like to have, but perhaps do not really need. But when asked to give to God some small sum is considered to be as much as we can afford. I hope the time may speedily come when all shall feel that it is to God they are giving, for too many seem to lose sight of this great fact altogether, and very frequently are guided by what others give, who may be better off than themselves."

I enclose the list, and will send you the money in a few days.

BAYFIELD, *13th April, 1878.*

I have waited until this date in order to give all our people an opportunity of contributing to the funds of the Society, a duty and privilege which some could not avail themselves of before. The little flock, I am thankful to say, have again come to the front, giving a fair share towards the support of our Diocesan Missionary enterprise. I cannot but confess that some lack of faith on my part caused me to face the question of subscriptions to extra-parochial schemes this year with some fear and trembling. However, I managed to convince myself and others that a want of interest in the Society would betray a deadness most religiously to be avoided. With a determination to do our duty manfully, we set to work and the result has exceeded our expectations. After providing more than \$800 for building purposes, and paying the clergyman's salary in full for the year, I send you a larger amount of subscriptions than was raised last year. Thus are we realizing, I trust, the sacredness of the bond of union pervading the One Body, and the truth that when "one member rejoices all the members rejoice with it." Let me allude to the present position of the parish with regard to Church Building. Active work on the new church was begun in the spring of 1876, and the exterior nearly completed in the autumn. The adverse circumstance of the winter of 1877, by which the building was somewhat damaged, a gale carrying it off its foundation, did not discourage us, for in the spring of that year work was carried on so expeditiously that on the 14th of October we took possession of it. Since that date much has been done, so that it is now completed in every part, furnished with a furnace for heating, chandeliers for lighting, and provided with seatings for more than the old and the young, the rich and the poor, of the parish. With the exception of some few articles of chancel furniture, it is now supplied with all things suitable to making it fulfil the design of its establishment. To accomplish this it could scarcely be expected that we should have it altogether free of debt, and particularly so when we have not employed funds from the S. P. C. K. for that purpose, as many of our brethren have been compelled to do. In conclusion, I have only to say that the number among us who do not join works with faith are becoming less, and that the theorists who are losing their hold of the God-Man are beginning to awake out of their sleep. With earnest prayers that all who are advancing the interests of the Society may receive in this life houses and lands and possessions, and everlasting life in the world to come,

## APPENDIX.

### Widows' and Orphans' Fund, Diocesan Synod,

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

"It shall also be one of the objects of the Board of Home Missions to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased clergymen, but no part of the funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Synod therefor."

1st. In accordance with the above, the Board of Home Missions will open a special Account for this object, to be called the Widows' and Orphans' Fund. This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Synod for this special object, and of all premiums received under these Rules, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this particular object and none other.

2nd. A standing Committee of seven members shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Secretary of the Board of Home Missions, (who shall be paid as Secretary of this Committee,) shall be vested the whole management of this matter.

3rd. The Diocesan Synod undertakes to pay out of this Widows' and Orphans' Fund, the pensions which become due under the following Rules.

4th. Every Clergyman of the Church of England within the Diocese, wishing to avail himself of the benefits of this fund, shall, within one year from taking orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary for a Certificate of pension, and shall pay the annual sum or premium therefor, as hereafter mentioned.

5th. Any applicant after such period of time shall only be permitted to receive such Certificate at the option of the Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

6th. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable by every Clergyman applying for a Certificate, according to his age at the date of his first application. It being understood that any Parish or congregation contributing to the fund more than \$8, then the excess be counted toward payment of the premium of the Minister or Ministers for that year.

7th. If any Clergyman marry the second time, he shall pay the annual sum or premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

8th. Upon payment of the first sum or premium, the applicant shall receive a Certificate, as hereafter mentioned, and the same sum shall be paid by him, up to the time of his death, on the first day of January in each year.

9th. If any person fail to pay the amount of his premium within 40 days after the payment becomes due, all claim to the pension under his Certificate shall be forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become null and void. But if he desire to have his claim to the pension renewed, it shall be in the power of this Committee to readmit him on such terms as they see fit.

10th. Removal of the Clergyman from this Diocese, except in the case of any Clergyman who shall become a Missionary of the Board of Foreign Missions of this Diocese, or who undertakes work in Algoma while a Missionary Diocese, forfeits all claim to the pension. Seventy-five per cent of the amount of premiums, paid by the holder of the Certificate himself, shall be returned to him upon the surrender of his Certificate.

11th. If any Clergyman shall go beyond the limits of Europe, or of North America 35° North latitude, without the leave of the Committee, he shall forfeit all claim to the pension.

12th. The widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid the annual sum or premium (subject to the above exceptions) shall receive a pension of \$100 per annum during widowhood.

13th. If at any time it is the opinion of the Sub-Committee that the state of the funds will safely warrant their so doing, they shall have power to increase the amount of the pensions.

14th. If the widow die or marry again, the child or children of her deceased husband shall receive the pension. But no part of the pension shall be received by those children who have arrived at the age of sixteen years, if males, or eighteen years, if females—while those who are still under those respective ages will receive the full amount of the pension.

15th. If the wife die before the husband, his child or children shall at his death receive the pension, under the above limitation as to ages.

16th. The pensions shall be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year: and shall commence on the first of these days which shall happen after the decease of each person holding a Certificate, and terminate on the first of those days which shall happen after the death of the widow or child, or the happening of any other event by which, under these rules, such pension is to cease.

17th. The Clergy of Prince Edward Island shall be entitled to participate in the benefit of this fund on equal terms with the Clergy of this Province.

18th. The Certificate to be granted shall be in the following form, under the seal of the Synod and the signature of the Secretary; and on the back thereof or annexed thereto shall be printed the above Rules.

19th. None of the above Rules or Regulations shall be altered except at an ordinary Meeting of the Synod, after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

✚ The Widows' and Orphans' Committee do not consider the fund responsible for the payment of a larger pension than the \$100 named in the certificate.

### SUPERANNUATION FUND RULES.

It shall be one of the objects of the Board of Home Missions to provide for superannated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the funds shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Synod therefor.

No. 1.—In accordance with the above, the Board of Home Missions will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Superannuation Fund."

This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Synod for this special object, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this object and none other.

No. 2.—A Standing Committee of six laymen shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Bishop of the Diocese as chairman, shall be vested the whole management of this fund.

No. 3.—The Diocesan Synod undertakes to pay from the proceeds of this fund the pensions which may become due under the following rules.

No. 4.—Any Clergyman of the Church of England within this Diocese wishing to participate in the benefits of this fund, shall make application to the Committee, who shall decide each case upon its own merits, and have power to grant such amount of pension, (not exceeding \$200), as they think expedient. But should the Committee refuse to grant the pension, an appeal may be made by the applicant to the General Meeting of the Board.

No. 5.—No Clergyman admitted from abroad into this Diocese shall receive any benefit from this fund, unless he shall have served for at least seven consecutive years in this Diocese, or shall have paid into this fund a sum to be named by the Committee.

No. 6.—The pension shall be for life, unless circumstances should arise (either from a falling off of the fund or otherwise) which may make a revision necessary.

No. 7.—If the pensioner reside out of this Diocese, sufficient proof of his identity shall accompany each draft for his pension.

No. 8.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days that shall happen after the pension is granted, and terminate on the first of those days that shall happen after the death of the pensioner, or the happening of any other event by which such pension is to cease.

No. 9.—If any pensioner shall be so far relieved from his disability as to be able to resume the discharge of Clerical duty, the pension shall be suspended during his relief from such disability.

No. 10.—None of the above rules or regulations shall be altered except at an ordinary meeting of the Synod, after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

### **ENDOWMENT RULES.**

The following Rules for the guidance of the Endowment Committee were adopted May 17th, 1850 :—

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks, or other companies, money invested in mortgages or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the incumbent or resident Missionary, for the time being, of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said incumbent or resident Missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interests or rents arising from such Endowment.

II. The conveyance or trust of such Endowment may be made either to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or to the Church Corporation of the Parish, or to the Diocesan Synod.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment, it shall be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowment shall be withheld from

any incumbent or resident Missionary of any Parish or Mission who may be suspended by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the Churches in his Parish or Mission, during the continuance of such suspension.

V. The Endowment Committee shall hold any sums contributed toward the endowment of any Parish or Missions, in trust for such Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable, consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission; and if, in the judgment of the Endowment Committee, such opportunity or proposition for Endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorize the said sums to be paid to the Parish or Mission so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing rules, or if any other point relative thereto should be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the General Meeting of the Board at their next meeting then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Committee for aid, shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a resolution of the Local Committee of the Board of Home Missions in its favor, in such Mission; and shall state the nature, situation, value, and annual profits of the investment desired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be duly registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Committee to form a correct judgment. All such applications to be made to the Secretary of the Board of Home Missions, who is ex-officio Secretary of the Endowment Committee.

The Endowment Committee, in a Report May 11th, 1863, made the following recommendations:—

“That while no restriction is made as to the sum which a Parish may withdraw from its *Reserved Fourths*, and invest as heretofore, yet that \$1000 be the minimum to which they should amount before they can be placed in trust with the Board and the interest be payable to the incumbent.

“With reference to the control of the Board over the *Reserved Fourths*, the Committee state that they have no wish to interfere in any way with the right of the Parishes to manage their own property. They would merely, for the better security of this fund, for the support of the Clergy, recommend—That a Rule be adopted which would require that, when an investment made by any Parish from its *Reserved Fourths* may be paid off, the money be returned to this Board to be held under the same Rules, and on the same terms as before, until such time as the Parish may be able to procure another satisfactory investment.

The first recommendation was adopted, the second is still under consideration.

## QUEBEC SCHEME.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1st.—That no grant be ordinarily more than \$200 per annum to one Mission, or to one Clergyman.

2nd.—That in future, were there is no special condition, grants be made for *three* years from the first of the month either next preceeding or next following the date ; and that they cease, in every case, at the expiration of that period, unless renewed, at the least *six* months before their termination.

3rd.—That all parishes and missions receiving aid from the Board of Home Missions toward the salary of their ministers, shall by their wardens, or other representatives, pay to the Secretary of the Board half-yearly, on or before the 30th of June and 31st December in each year, such proportions of the required salary as may be arranged by mutual consent of themselves and the Board.

4th.—On receipt of the stipulated half-yearly amount from the parish or mission, the Secretary shall accept the order of the minister for the full half year's salary as agreed upon jointly by the two contracting parties.

5th. Should the minister accept part of the amount payable by the parish or mission in kind at *cash* prices, his receipt for the sum in the form of a bill of items, may be counted by the the wardens or representatives towards making up the amount to be paid to the parish or mission.

6th.—Should the sums agreed to be paid by the wardens or representatives not be paid when due, or within thirty days after falling due, the proportion agreed to be paid by the Board, may be continued for six months, and the Board shall enquire into the cause of such deficiency, and consider the subject at the ensuing meeting.

7th.—The receipt of the Clergyman for money given at the offertory may be received from the Wardens as part of the conditional payment required by the Board from the people.

## CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information :—

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
3. The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.

- 4.—The proposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.
- 6.—That all the sittings are to be free and unappropriated.

It is the wish of the Board of Home Missions that no Clergyman should, when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Board, without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Board to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made on the following terms, namely: That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished. Grants to Parsonages are made on similar conditions.

“The Endowment Committee receive and hold any money given in trust for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given.”

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Board.

“The Board will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the *Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission*, all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that Parish.”

“All subscription lists received before the 31st December in each year, will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted.”

“If reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Board.”

 The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above regulations.

“All applications for aid from this Board are proposed at one meeting of the Board and considered at the next.”

“No person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Board, nor to be elected a member, who has not been a Subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting.”

At the General Meeting in 1869 the following Resolution was adopted:—

“The Church property, in any Parish, which is actually occupied by the Incumbent of the said Parish, shall be valued by competent valuers upon his taking charge, and be considered at the same value for salary during his incumbency; and the valuers shall be appointed as follows, viz.: one by the parish, one by the Board of Home Missions, and another by those two.”

*AN ACT to vest in the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia the Funds held by the D. C. S.*

*Whereas*, At a meeting of the D. C. S. held in the month of July, 1876, it was resolved, &c., &c.

*And whereas*, At the General Session of the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia, held in the same month, the said resolution was adopted by the Synod.

*And whereas*, It is considered expedient in order to carry such (resolution) into effect, that an Act be passed to vest in the said Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia all real and other property held in trust by or for the said D. C. S.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, as follows :

1. All property, real and personal, held by or in trust for the D. C. S. or other funds respectively connected therewith, are hereby declared to have become vested in the Diocesan Synod of N. S. in trust, to be held and managed for the several purposes for which they have heretofore been held and managed by the D. C. S., as fully and effectually as the same were previously vested in or held in trust for said D. C. S.
2. The said Synod shall be bound to fulfil all engagements made by the said Society previous to such transfer, and to observe all the conditions under which the several funds may have been held in trust by the said Society.
3. In all cases where moneys of the D. C. S. have been loaned on mortgage in this Province for the benefit of any trust funds in connection with said Society, and in all like cases it shall and may be lawful in case of the payments of the amounts due on such mortgages, for the said Synod to discharge such mortgagers by writing under their seal, and thereby the mortgagers, their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns shall be fully discharged from all further liability on account of such mortgages.
4. The receipt of the Treasurer of the Synod shall be a sufficient discharge to the Treasurer of the said Society for all moneys and securities transferred by him.
