





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TWENTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE  
COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

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*To the Members of the New Brunswick Provincial Rifle Association:*

The concluding duty of your Council is to submit the following Annual Report of what has transpired during the past Association year.

That which first calls for reference, relates to the acquisition of the new Range at Sussex Vale. As intimated in the Council report of last year, the choice of ground had been practically settled at the time of the Annual Meeting, and accordingly your Council, when it met in November, took the final action to secure a lease of the site from Mr. D. M. Fairweather. A lease, mutually satisfactory to Mr. Fairweather and your Council, was shortly afterwards executed and has been recorded in the Registry Office for Kings County. The lease is for a renewable term of ten years from last November at an annual rental of fifty dollars, the Association having the right to occupy after the 15th August in each year. Provision is further made in the lease for a right of way from Ward's Creek Road (so called), and that the lessor shall clear the Range of any growing grass or grain interfering with the view of the targets. At the request of the Council, Mr. Fairweather also consented to the insertion of a covenant that a Brigade Camp at Sussex shall have the use of the Range at any time on payment of the sum of twenty-five dollars.

To a Committee of eleven members your Council referred the whole matter of fitting up the Range, with full power to settle the details and character of the work. That Committee met from time to time, and early in May last, when it was finally certain that the second appropriation of \$500.00 had been made by Parliament, contracts were entered into for the construction of butt, firing-points, targets and Range House. These contracts amounted to \$1,118.00, so from the outset it was known that the grant of \$1,000.00 would fall short of the ultimate expense.

The task of superintending the work was accepted by Lieut.-Col. Beer, and to him the Association is under a very great obligation indeed, because of the close interest and attention which he gave to all the details of the construction. Without such oversight it is impossible that the Range could have been placed in such thorough order as the Association found it when the annual matches opened in August. The total expense chargeable to equipping the new Range amounts to \$1,339.00. Application, accompanied by vouchers for all the expenditure, has recently been made to the Department of Militia for the necessary further grant to defray the additional cost, and the Council entertains the hope that this application will be favorably dealt with.

Tuesday, the 23rd of August, was appointed for the commencement of the annual matches, it being the Tuesday before the D. R. A. meeting at Ottawa. The programmes were distributed in June, care being taken to send a large number to the Brigade Camp at Sussex. The Prize List differed from that of 1891 in the addition of ten prizes of four dollars each, both to the "Nursery" and "Association" matches; while in the Regulations two changes were inserted, allowing two sighting shots at each Range, and permitting members of the Militia to shoot in non-military matches, either in uniform or plain clothes.

The thanks of the Association continue to be due to Lieut.-Col. Maunsell for his generosity to the Nursery competitors.

The attendance at the matches was practically the same as that of the past few years, the entries ranging from seventy-nine in the "Prince of Wales" to eighty-five in the Association match. Though rain on Thursday afternoon interfered with the presentation of prizes, the weather on the other days was very fine, and no delay prevented the termination of the shooting in the accustomed three days.

The working of the new targets, the general condition and appearance of the Range, and the improved convenience of the Range House, were all subjects of repeated approval among the competitors. A few changes, viz., in the arrangement of the house, doors and platform, in the height of some of the firing points, and in the size of the target numerals, will remove the only grounds of objection of which the Council is aware.

The report of the Range Committee, referring at length to the work performed on the Range, is submitted herewith for the information of the members.

A well attended meeting of competitors was held on the Range, and at it were passed several resolutions of recommendation, which will therefore have to be dealt with. The Council directs the attention of the Association to the minutes of this meeting. A resolution of special significance was that recommending to the D. R. A. the adoption of the Martini-Henri as the sole rifle at its matches.

The Maritime Match for 1892 was shot on Thursday, the 9th June, on Drury Range.

The hope that both the other Provinces would be able to send teams to us was at the last moment disappointed, because of the Island not being able to complete its eight, so our welcome was confined to the team from Nova Scotia. They proved themselves thoroughly at home by again, as they did in 1889, coming out in advance of our team, though the match this year was a good one throughout. The Nova Scotia team scored 671 and the New Brunswick team 662, a difference of nine points.

As the Council was aware of a feeling among the riflemen, that the permanent interests of the match would best be served by avoiding any formal reception, arrangements were made merely for an informal meeting at the 62nd Fusiliers room in the evening, at which the teams met to witness the taking over of the Maritime Trophy by the Captain of the winning team. It remains for the Council to recognize the spirit with which many of the officers of the City Brigade, more especially the non-shooting officers, contributed towards the fund for carrying out the match.

Two New Brunswickers, Captain J. H. McRobbie and Captain E. A. Smith, had the honor of shooting at Bisley this year as members of the Canadian Team. The weather all through the N. R. A. matches was unusually tempestuous, and the Canadian Team had to return without any very prominent honors.

The return of prizes won by the Ottawa Team is submitted herewith. It is yearly a gratifying fact that the main object of the visit of our riflemen to Ottawa never quite fails of attainment, and so the Council has pleasure in noticing that three places on next year's Bisley Team have been secured by New Brunswick, viz., the second place by Col.-Sgt. Henderson, 62nd Fusiliers, the twelfth place by Pte. Walter Langstroth, 62nd Fusiliers, and the thirteenth place by Pte. C. T. Burns, 62nd Fusiliers.

In the Team Aggregate Match for the Lansdowne Cup our Association Team failed of securing first place by only two points

The Annual Report of the Association for 1891 (a more than usually large pamphlet) was printed in the customary form and very generally distributed. In addition to the proceedings of the year, a complete list of first prize winners to 1891 inclusive was inserted. This record makes the Report an especially interesting one.

The accounts of the Secretary-Treasurer, with vouchers, and the report of the Audit Committee thereon, are submitted.

The Council report of last year concluded with a reference to the great scarcity of reliable Snider Rifles among the Militia Corps of the Province, and directed attention to the fact that new steel barrels, in small quantities, could be obtained by Commanding Officers on application to return into store an equal number of old rifles. With the view of promoting such applications, your Council, at its special meeting in May, directed the Secretary to write to each Commanding Officer in the Province, urging him to act in the way suggested. Letters were immediately sent by the Secretary, and it is within the knowledge of the Council that at least four Commanding Officers applied for a small exchange issue, but in no instance has a favorable answer been received.

The Council feels very strongly that the matter should not be allowed to rest here, believing, as it does, that there is a supply of these new rifles in Militia stores, and that they are being issued to other Corps in Canada.

It is admittedly a fact that only here and there in the Company armories of this district is there a stray rifle, the accuracy of which has not been greatly impaired by long usage and exposure, and it is a very gloomy outlook for this Association and for rifle-shooting in this Province if the necessary supply of "shooting" rifles is not at once, and from time to time, to be renewed.

As the supply now stands, the Council fears that it is an idle hope to expect any increase in the number of competitors, either at the County or Provincial Matches, for to place a defective rifle in the hands of an eager beginner is sure in the end to discourage him from continuing. If there is any action which this Association can take to aid in securing the necessary issue of new Sniders, that action should be the first duty of the incoming Council.

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## REPORT ON RANGE.

*To the Chairman and Members of the Range Committee:*

GENTLEMEN,—

Having been appointed by you as Superintendent and Inspector in connection with the work of constructing butts, targets and other work on the new rifle range at Sussex, I have the honor to report that the work entrusted to me by you has been completed.

Immediately upon the acceptance of the tenders for erection of butts and hut, etc., I notified the parties thereof, and Mr. Heffer, on behalf of West & Co., at once took steps to secure the necessary lumber. The contract specified that round logs should be used in the construction of parapet and firing points, but upon the representation of Mr. Heffer to the effect that it was almost impossible at that season of the year to get round logs, and he having stated his willingness to put in square timber of the same dimension as the round, I submitted the matter to the sub-committee, who authorized me to allow the same. The result has been that a much neater, and, I believe, more durable, structure has been put up. The parapet is 250 feet long and seven feet high, the back face built of logs averaging over ten inches square, with space between of two inches. This face is tied by cross ties ten inches square, and a tier of logs running lengthways of the parapet, leaving a space between of some five feet, which was well filled and rammed with earth; this whole structure resting on sills, alternately twelve and eight feet apart, which sills project four feet from the front face of parapet, and on which a plank walk is placed the whole length of same. The rear face of the parapet, as also the ends, is sodded, and there is, in my opinion, sufficient earth between the sodding and inner logging to secure permanency. The parapet is

about nine feet through at the bottom and four feet at the top. The sod and earth required for the parapet were taken from immediately in front of same leaving four feet of earth in front of wall undisturbed. This makes a ditch three feet deep and about fourteen feet wide the whole length of parapet, and gives the required depth for target standards, etc.

Space has been allowed for thirteen sets of targets, twelve feet apart—ten for the regular matches and three for extra series—and a space of twenty feet allowed for a repair butt. In the latter space the face wall is carried down to the bottom of the ditch. Markers' seats and shelters over the same have been put up for each target.

There was no work required at the firing points except at 500 and 600 yards. The former was ordered to be built at a level of one foot above the ground at the eastern end, and has been so built, but it would have been better from six to eight inches higher. At 600 yards the contract specified two feet above ground at eastern end, and this has proved ample. The firing points at these ranges have been so arranged that on the eastern side of range 120 feet is allotted for the regular matches; and on the western side the firing points for extra series are placed in echelon, and both sufficiently far enough away from the regular firing points to allow extra series to be carried on at all times and at both ranges, except when firing at regular matches at 200 yards.

The targets are put up on the sash principle as ordered, and, with the exception of some minor details which can be remedied at trifling expense before another year, have proved satisfactory. The telephone posts and wires were all placed in position as far as was required of contractor, as also a temporary foot bridge.

The above includes the whole work as contracted for by West & Co., and is on the whole a most satisfactory piece of work. The discs are the same as used on the old range, and were put up at a trifling cost outside of contract by West & Co.

The hut was erected by Wallace Bros., and is 32×26 feet, with secretary's office, committee room, store room, refreshment room, competitors' room and general waiting room; the latter, being more like a verandah as the front of the building is composed of three large doors which lift up and inwards. In front is a platform eight feet by thirty-two. A pump has been placed at a convenient spot in the waiting room, and good water obtained. At the back of the hut a necessary out-building has been erected.

Two large flag-poles were placed in position, one immediately in front of the 500 yard firing point, and the other to the front and right of the 200 yard point; giving ample windage facilities.

As no instructions were given me in regard to the covering in of the repair butt, and it not having been included in contract, I took upon myself the responsibility of placing a temporary roof over the same, the material in which will be available in case a permanent structure is ordered. In this space I also erected a double target on a plan of my own. This was improvised from the old iron frame targets. It was found to be of much service during the Kings County matches, for target practice during camp, and throughout the Provincial matches. The cost of changing one set of old targets for same (*viz* \$2) was charged to the Association.

The above includes the whole work as done under my superintendence, and is, I think, quite up to the expectations of all concerned. I therefore trust that the committee will be able to endorse this report in handing it to the Council.

# MINUTES OF MEETINGS.

## SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL.

FRIDAY, May 13th, 1892.

A special meeting of the Council was held on the afternoon of May 13th, at the room of St. George's Society, the President, Major J. H. Parks, in the chair. There were also present :

The President explained that the meeting had been called to deal with the Prize List of the Annual Matches, to fix the date of the matches and to consider, also, certain matters regarding the Maritime Match, which this year would be shot at Drury Range on the 9th of June.

Resolved, on motion of Col. Beer and Lieut. Chipman,

That the Annual Matches of the Association commence on Tuesday of the week preceding the Dominion Matches at Ottawa.

The Secretary stated to the meeting that Sergt. F. H. Fairweather, who had been elected to a place on the Council at the annual meeting, had permanently removed from the Province, thus leaving a vacancy in the Council. It being duly resolved to proceed to the election of a member to fill the place, Capt. H. C. Hanington, 74th Battalion, was on ballot elected.

The Secretary was directed to notify Capt. Hanington of his election.

After discussion the Council, on motion, resolved

The Secretary was directed to open correspondence with officers commanding Corps in the Province, directing their attention to the fact that a small number of good Snider rifles can be obtained by each Corps in lieu of the same number returned into store, and requesting them to take early steps to secure this exchange issue, and to point out that as matters now are the number of rifle shots is necessarily limited by the scarcity of reliable rifles.

Col. Beer informed the meeting that he was in receipt of letters from the D. A. G., who desired to be informed upon what terms the use of six sets of targets could be had for the Sussex camp.

After consideration it was resolved

That six sets of targets be available for the camp at a charge of \$20.00 to meet the cost of repairs and re-covering.

The meeting, on motion, adjourned.

## COUNCIL MEETING.

WEDNESDAY, Nov. 16th, 1892.

The regular meeting of the Council was held to-night in the office of the Vice-President.

The minutes of the last Council Meeting were read and confirmed.

The minutes of the Annual Meeting were read.

Attention being drawn to the fact that Captain E. A. Smith, elected to the Council, was now entitled to a place as the officer commanding the St. John Rifle Company, the meeting on motion proceeded to the election of a member to fill the vacancy in the elective part of the Council. Lieut. F. B. Carvell, 67th Battalion, was duly nominated and elected.

Captain J. T. Hartt was on nomination and ballot duly elected Secretary-Treasurer.

The President appointed as Auditors Captains J. H. McRobbie, G. F. Thompson and E. A. Smith.

On proceeding to the election of an Executive Committee, and after nominations duly made, the following were elected:

The recommendations contained in the minutes of the annual meeting were then considered.

Moved by Col. Beer, seconded by Capt. McRobbie,

That the recommendation as to Extra Series targets stand over until another meeting of the Council.—Carried.

Moved by Col. Beer, seconded by Major Hartt,

That the recommendation as to the introduction of the time system of squadding be referred to the Executive Committee to be carried out if considered feasible.—Carried.

Major Markham entered the meeting at this stage.

Consideration of the other recommendations was temporarily deferred to enable Col. Beer to report regarding the work on the Range, which had been ordered at the October meeting.

Col. Beer reported that a facing of hemlock boards had been placed under the edge of the target platforms, running the full length of the butt, and would prevent any wash or falling away of the earth inside it; that the facing was strongly secured to the target sills; that instead of erecting a dam at the western end, to prevent the overflow of water from passing behind the butt, the Committee had thought it best to construct a ridge or dam at the eastern end, the effect of which would be that the water would be more or less dead and any rush of water along the butt would be prevented; that the work had been done at a much less expense than the work first contemplated.

In regard to the target standards he reported that on attempting to remove them, the bolts were found so tightly screwed that to separate the frame work would likely cause a good deal of damage, and that it had been decided to leave the more permanent parts standing. He did not anticipate any special damage to them. The targets, chairs and pulleys had been stored in the Range house.

The Secretary read a statement of the Range construction account, showing a total balance of bills unpaid of about \$173.00, this not including the cost of the work now being done at the butt.

Resolved, on motion of Capt McRobbie, seconded by Lieut.-Col. Armstrong,

That all extra bills unpaid be paid now out of the funds of the Association.

Resolved,

That the usual Report of the Association's proceedings be printed, and that estimates be procured for this and the other printing required during the year.

The recommendation as to the disposition of the N. R. A. medal was then considered and very generally discussed. The meeting at last agreed to let the matter await a final decision until a larger meeting of the Council.

In regard to the matter of selecting New Brunswick teams at Ottawa, it was resolved

That the selection of all teams for the matches at Ottawa be determined by the members themselves present at the matches.

The suggestion of a partial introduction of Martini shooting into the Grand Aggregate at Sussex was referred to a subsequent meeting.

Resolved,

That a special meeting of the Council be held in the month of May on a day to be selected by the President.

Moved by Capt. McRobbie and resolved,

That the Secretary be directed to order enough medals to pay off the present arrears to the County Associations and to provide for the coming year, and also to enquire as to the ownership of the dies.

Moved by Col. Armstrong, seconded by Major Markham, and resolved,

That the Council of the New Brunswick Rifle Association hereby express their regret at the removal of Mr. Park A. Melville from the Province. During the past fifteen years Mr. Melville was rarely, if ever, absent from the business or competitive meetings of the riflemen of this Province, and by his faithful work, always cheerfully given, he rendered to the Association excellent services which have materially advanced the interests of the Association.

Ordered that a copy of the resolution be sent to Mr. Melville, at Boston.

Suggestions were made to the effect that, if possible, a Reception Committee of the Council should be in attendance at least on one day of the matches, and that excursion rates

should be secured from Intercolonial Railway during the shooting week.

That these and other steps should be taken to render the competitions more widely known of and more attractive to visitors. It was decided to give these matters further consideration at the special meeting.

On motion, the Council adjourned.
