




# ALMIGHTY GOD:

Accept, O Lord, our further prayers in behalf of those nations, allied with our Sovereign, in the present contest; whom the immediate ravages of war have exposed to the most fevere and horrible afflictions. Grant to them a speedy deliverance from these tremendous visitations, and reftore to them the bleffings of tranquility, happines, and plenty.

We pray to Thee, O Lord, for firength, courage, and prudence, to withftand our Enemies ;-liften with favour alfo to our fupplications for their good ; inftil into them a love of Thy holy name, caufe them to fee their errors, difpofe them to abftain from tyranny and wrong, and incline their hearts to that

that fincere defire of peace by which a fpeedy termination may be put to the calamities of prolonged warfare.

These humble supplications we devoutly offer up at the Throne of thy Divine Majesty, in the name, and through the mediation of our only Saviour, and Redeemer Jesus Christ.

GRANT, O Lord, we befeech Thee, that the courfe of this world may be fo peaceably ordered by thy Governance, that Thy Church may joyfullyferve Thee in all godly quietnefs, through Jesus Chrift our Lord. Amen.

A LMIGHTY God, who hast promised to hear the petition of them that ask in Thy Son's name; we beseech Thee mercifully to incline Thine Ears to us that have made now our Prayers and Supplications unto Thee; and grant that those things which we have faithfully asked according to Thy Will, may effectually be obtained, to the relief of our necessity, and to the fetting forth of Thy Glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
