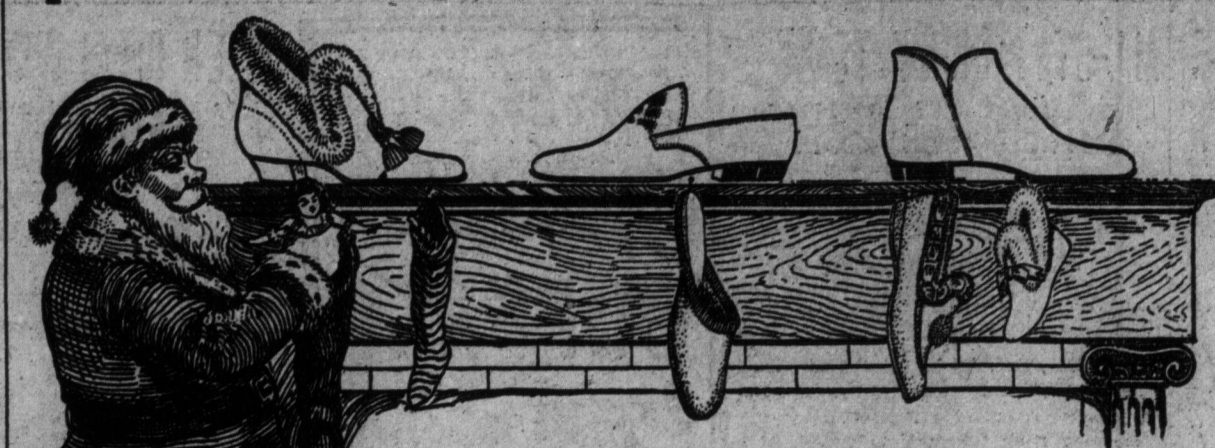

REFERENCE TO BISHOP RESULTED IN "SCENE"

Arthur Hawkes Replied at Empire Club to Bishop of Niagara's Treatment of Suffragettes.

When Arthur Hawkes took up the cudgels on behalf of the under dog in politics at the Empire Club yesterday, there threatened for a moment or two to be a scene. President Castell Hopkins sat tight, however, and the privilege of free speech was insisted upon by the majority, and Mr. Hawkes had better than he in the clearest and most entertaining speakers in Canada, and his subject "On Going 'Ome," that he had heard the speech of the Bishop of Niagara last week, and his strictures on the remarks of his lordship of Niagara developed some tension. F. B. Featherstonhaugh gave expression to this by rising to a point of order, but the chairman ruled that it was a matter for the speaker's taste. Mr. Hawkes did not transgress the courtesies of debate in anything he said, and Mr. Hopkins said at the close that the club was for the purpose of hearing both sides of important questions. The members afterwards engaged in conversation but evidently no idea that only one side of a subject should be presented to them, and Mr. Hawkes' address was the occasion of much complimentary remark.

Mr. Hawkes began by illustrating the progress made by the English immigrant after he assimilates the freedom of Canadian institutions. Those who return to England generally come back, because they find their second home better than their first. It was the man who had only visited England, and who only knew it superficially who was generally most opinionated about the country.

"Lots of Englishmen think they know Canada when they have visited

the Toronto Club and come here, and gone to Vancouver in Sir Thos. Shaughnessy's or Dan Mann's private car," was the counter proposition.

The Making of Men. "The man who is building up Canada is the man coming down the Saskatchewan with a yoke of cattle and a load of wheat, getting off his wagon and walking to keep himself warm; wondering if the frozen ground may break his wagon axle; not those of us who sit at night figuring how much toll we can take off that load of wheat before it gets to Liverpool." This point met with applause and laughter. There was an independence, said Mr. Hawkes, in a man going back to England from Canada which surprised Englishmen. He had lost the badge of servility he bore in England, and which no man need bear in this country. Mr. Hawkes asserted that he was an imperialist thru and thru, but any contribution Canada could make to imperialism depended on the fact that we are the only country we can raise and better men than they can. The delegation from Bristol was impressed with the crowd at the exhibition here. No crowd of common people anywhere could compete with them, they said.

"I would advise you not to be afraid of innovations proposed in England," said Mr. Hawkes, recalling the old saying, "a crowd of fools, one who gives and one who takes advice. Men who wanted to succeed in Canada must adapt themselves to the conditions there."

"Do not accept partisan statements. Investigate for yourself. The sign infallible of the Briton who has become a true Canadian is a curious and wonderful detachment from the political connections and the party cries of the old land." Then Mr. Hawkes told how his brother wrote him three years ago asking him what he thought of the Jarrov by-election, and Mr. Hawkes replied asking him what he thought of Charlie Hyman having the cabinet. The laughter was loud and long.

Changes Wrought by Time. "I will not be a party to writing down any man in the empire a traitor till he takes arms against it," he declared. The men in a minority to-day were likely to be in a majority to-morrow. When the Reform Bill was passed in 1832, everybody said the empire was going to the everlasting bow-wow.

The country was going to destruction if the agricultural laborers were permitted to vote. Yet the Tories were in power 17 years out of the 20 following that measure.

Then Mr. Hawkes turned his attention to Bishop Du Moulin's speech of the week previous. He was sorry he was not present, but he was not going to answer episcopal billingsgate with billingsgate again. His lordship had a tilt with the suffragettes. Mr. Hawkes confessed himself an arm-chair suffragette, but was glad his wife and daughter were not. Referring to Dr. Du Moulin's advice that rats be turned loose upon the suffragettes, Mr. Hawkes declared there was not a man in the room who would set a rat on a woman who was convicted of murder even.

"This illustrates how easy it may be to talk with apparent authority, but absolutely without knowledge," he proclaimed.

ceeded. The great advances had always been made by those who were willing to take up such burdens. He would remind them of one who was arrested and lodged in jail because he was a pestilent fellow and turned the world upside down.

The Bishop of Toronto: "Hear, hear." Straight Talk.

"It does not lie in the mouth of any follower of the lowly Nazarene, it does not become any man to speak of himself as willing to serve a woman in the world upside down the convicted of murder or adultery."

At this point Mr. Featherstonhaugh interposed.

"I'll take another case," said Mr. Hawkes, when the situation had been allayed. The other case was home rule. A young landlord had told him that he had found the Nationalists were sincere. The mistake of the English was in trying to make bad Englishmen out of good Irishmen.

"If you regard the Irish as 'intolerable and incurable,' you rule Ireland outside of the empire altogether." This was in striking contrast with the treatment accorded the Boers.

Bishop Du Moulin had spoken also of the labor agitators, when he described them as the "rudest, roughest and most ruthless gang that could possibly be collected, and the most despicable of tyrants," as a result of his visit to the house of commons in 1908.

Mr. Hawkes would not question the propriety of calling to the councils of the King those approved by their fellows. They might go back to the glorious days when ridings were bought and sold as the cure of souls was bought and sold in the market place. When the elder Pitt became prime minister, it was on condition the Duke of Newcastle had charge of the secret service—the corruption—fund.

Mr. Hawkes recalled the incident of a few years ago when a noble earl accused a labor member of being intoxicated. In the excitement the laborist called the earl a liar, and the labor man was sent out of the house. Next day Premier Asquith moved that the incident be expunged from the records and the greatest aristocrat of them all, Mr. Balfour, seconded the motion. Mr. Hawkes read the statements as follows of both gentlemen.

Making Amends. Mr. Asquith: "A noble lord opposite made a most offensive and injurious imputation on the character and conduct of another honorable member. It

must be taken that that imputation was wholly without foundation in fact, and the noble lord himself at a later stage the same night, not only withdrew it, but apologized for having made it."

Mr. Balfour: "The right honorable gentleman has based his motion upon a most legitimate desire which he and the rest of the house have for making it absolutely clear, in the most explicit and formal way, that the charge originally levelled against the honorable member concerned, by my noble friend, is absolutely without foundation in fact. It was present all thru the unfortunate episode and everyone must deeply deplore that an unfounded charge should have been made. I desire to say that, in my opinion, the honorable gentleman below the gangway have frequently, and indeed generally, not merely obeyed the orders of the house, but have set an example which might well be followed in other parts of the house, of listening without interruption to arguments and appeals from which they profoundly dissent. If I may be allowed with respect to opinion, I have observed to express my opinion in the course of the present parliament, a growing habit of commentary of the speeches and argument that are being addressed to the house. If not intentional, it is a growing habit, and I think it is an unfortunate one. But I house, the honorable gentlemen below the gangway are the least offenders in that particular."

MANY SECURE EXTENSION Unable to Pay Double Liability on Bank Shares.

According to the decision of the privy council one month ago, the double liability contributions of the shareholders of the Ontario Bank fell due yesterday. Of the \$1,425,000 that was due, only \$687,000 was paid. Many applied for an extension of time, their contributions to be paid in instalments. In cases where this was granted six per cent interest will be charged.

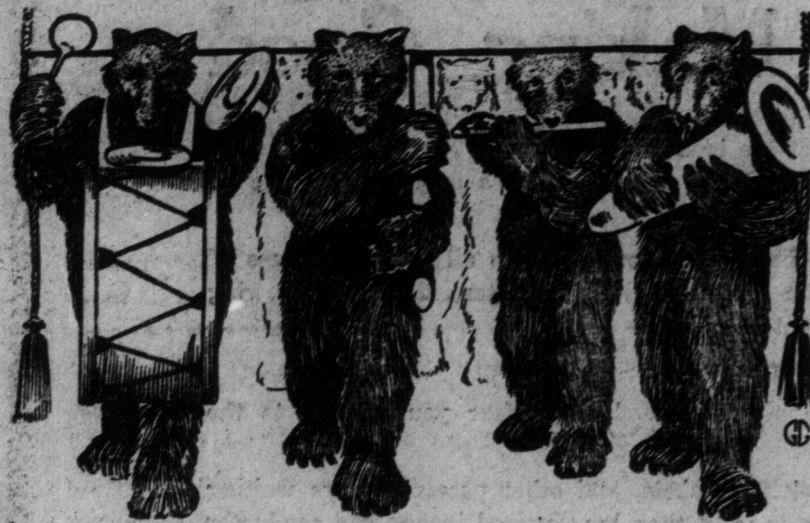

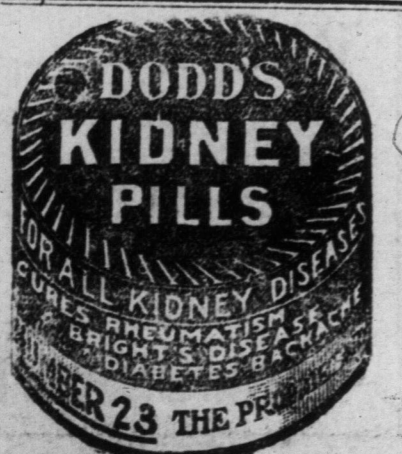

## 132 AT SANITARIUM PATIENTS IN DANGER

Free Building at Weston Destroyed Early Yesterday—Loss Placed at Close to \$100,000.

Fire breaking out in the engine room of the Toronto Free Hospital for Consumptives at Weston shortly after 2.30 yesterday morning, destroyed that building and necessitated the hurried removal of forty patients in the burned wing to nearby buildings. Half a hundred others in other hospital buildings also dressed hurriedly. It was stated yesterday that none appeared any the worse for their experience, the one, a young man, Chas. German, who had been at death's door, succumbed during the day. Heroic conduct by the nurses and attendants undoubtedly prevented a casualty list.

The property destroyed was the main building, a block, two storeys, nurses' cottage, dining-room, and two-storey roughcast building used for patients and as a kitchen. In addition most of the furnishings, food supplies and drugs were gone. The total loss is estimated at around \$100,000, with insurance of some \$30,000, distributed: Atlas, \$16,500; Anglo American, \$5,000; Gore, \$2,187; Rimouski, \$2,187; Economical, \$3,187.

The patients, as they were assisted—many of them carried—from the burning building, were taken first to the King Edward sanitarium nearby, where they were given stimulants. Yesterday thirty of them were sent by special train to the Gravenhurst Sanitarium. The night nurse, Miss Katie Bass, noticed smoke about 2.40 and the nurses began at once to arouse the inmates. Dr. Dobbin has had a well-organized fire drill, and despite the dense smoke that filled the corridors, in fifteen minutes all the patients were out. Much of this arduous duty fell upon the nurses themselves. Miss Dixon yesterday was about exhausted, having carried or dragged three men from the upper room down the stairs, across a long hallway, through smoke which was nearly choking her, and out into the open air. Many of the other nurses carried two men, and the lady superintendent is proud of the great heroism displayed by the nurses under her charge. She gives them high credit for both their bravery and their coolness. One, Miss Florence Watt, persisted, until she fell exhausted into the arms of her superior.

The Toronto Fire Department was notified at 2.12 a.m., and engine, hose and truck sections were sent out. It was a run of about two and three miles over rough roads and with a stiff hill on route, but the men arrived about 4 o'clock, and although water was scarce, render aid, tearing down a number of shacks to prevent a spread of the flames. By 4.15 the whole western sky of the city was illuminated, and from Yonge street, it seemed as tho the fire was within the city limits.

The inmates were almost exclusively Toronto people. Only four or five had come from the neighborhood of Berlin. The flames shot right up in my face, and I had a pretty narrow escape from being burned, stated Ben, a young man, who was saved from the main burning building. "I was able to walk around and help myself. I did not know anything of the fire, and I put it up to me as a window. When I put it up the flames shot right up past my face. It certainly gave me a bad scare."

## EXCLUDE GOVERNMENT FROM NEW HARBOR BOARD

Special Committee, While Favoring Commission Idea, Would Limit It to Civ. Body.

TO-DAY AT THE CITY HALL. 11 a.m.—Board of control.

Altho the special civic committee on waterfront improvement yesterday approved the adoption of a harbor commission, it dealt an apparently serious blow to the whole project by rejecting the plan of having two members appointed by the Dominion Government, one on the government's own initiative and the other on the board of trade's recommendation, so that the scheme sent on to council contemplates a commission of only three members, all to be appointed by the city.

The decision, on a vote of six to four, was a disappointment to Controller Spence and also to a large deputation representing the board of trade and the Manufacturers' Association. The feeling was that, without the Dominion Government being represented on the commission, the necessary co-operation was not to be expected. However, the visitors were invited to appear before council on Monday and another warm battle is in the air.

The vote on Mayor Geary's proposal to institute a purely civic commission, was: For—the mayor, Chisholm, King, Edward, and Graham; against—Controllers Spence and Ward, Ald. Maguire and O'Neill.

GROSS-EXAMINATION OF MRS. GLOVER WAS SEVERE

Went to Hospital When Husband Was Dying, But Turned Back

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Dec. 1.—A verbal duel between Mrs. Lillian M. Glover, widow of Clarence F. Glover, and Kelvin M. Johnson, leading counsel for Hattie Leblanc, who is on trial for the murder of Glover, held the interest of the court-room for the whole of today's sessions, and was not concluded when court adjourned.

The cross-examination by Mr. Johnson, who announced yesterday that he intended to show that Mrs. Glover "had the motive, the capacity and opportunity" for the murder of her husband, covered much of Mrs. Glover's life since she came to Boston from Cape Breton, and dealt minutely with her actions and feelings on the day and night of the murder and the few days that followed.

She said that she sent for Hattie Leblanc, who lived near her own birthplace, clothed her, fed her and finally found her husband with her. She sent the girl away for a week, but took her back, and on the fatal Nov. 20, 1909, Glover took both women to a football game.

She admitted certain falsehoods regarding her birthplace and her name, and certain discrepancies in her testimony with that given at other hearings were pointed out.

Just before the close of the forenoon session Mr. Johnson asked: "Do you know any reason why Hattie Leblanc should have shot your husband?" Mrs. Glover said she did not.

She admitted that she was familiar with firearms and had used a revolver, at a target.
