WEDNESDAY, July 4th.

In accordance with the 5th Article of the Constitution, the Synod of the Diocese of Fredericton met on this day, in Trinity Church School House, in the City of St. John, at 10 o'clock, a.m.

The Reverend Canon Brigstocke, Ecclesiastical Commissary, in the Chair.

After making some remarks, the Chairman informed the Synod that the Secretary, the Rev. Canon Medley, was absent from the Diocese in attendance upon the Metropolitan, and that therefore it would be necessary for the Synod to elect a Secretary for the present Session.

doubt, receive the most respectful and attentive consideration; and I have felt that I could not with propriety decline to be present at this conference. On no other ground should I be willing to be absent from you at a time when the presence and counsel of your Bishop seems to be especially required, both at the Annual Meeting of the Diocesan Church Society and at the meeting of the Synod. I rely, however, on the wise and zealous co-operation of the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese to adopt such resolutions as are calculated to promote its extension and prosperity. And I take this opportunity of expressing a hope that it will not be necessary to abandon any of the work which the Church has undertaken, and that by united and harmonious action this great evil may be prevented.

I have appointed the Reverend Canon Brigstocke to be my Commissary to transact such business as it may be necessary to do during my absence, and the absence of the Bishop-Coadjutor.

When the Synod is duly organized, I should think it desirable, if there be a quorum, that the reports of the Committees should be presented and the Committees re-appointed; but I should not deem it advisable that any business be transacted which involves a change in the Constitution of the Synod. Notice must be given of the time and place of the next meeting of the Synod.

I hope to return by the *Vancouver* steamer, on September 6th, and I earnestly ask your prayers that I may have a safe and prosperous voyage, and that I and my house may be preserved from harm.

shall so extend the powers of the Provincial Synod that it may be enabled to legislate for the Canadian Church as a whole; to bring about an uniform method of procedure in all matters pertaining to Church government; a uniformity of Canons and Discipline of the Clergy and Laity; and, further, to consider and advise what legislation may be necessary in the several Dioceses to bring about the beneficial result of an entire and united Church in the Dominion of Canada,

And whereas, It is advisable to facilitate the work of the said Committee of the Provincial Synod by ascertaining the views of the various Diocesan Synods on this important matter;

Be it therefore resolved, That the Synod do now appoint a Committee to fully consider the relations now existing between the various Dioceses and the Provincial Synod, and also the possibility of uniting the whole Church of British North America under one ecclesiastical jurisdiction;

When the number of Communicants shall be from forty-one to one hundred: two Representatives.

When the number shall be from one hundred and one to two hundred: three Representatives.

APPENDIX D.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE DUTIES OF CHURCH WARDENS.

The Committee appointed by the Synod in the year 1886, and continued in the following year, to report on the subject of the Duties of Church Wardens, and to prepare a Canon defining such duties, beg to submit the following Report:

The duties of Church Wardens in cases where a Rectory becomes vacant, and the notices they are to give, and the acts they are to perform when a person has been chosen to fill the vacancy, or when they receive a mandate from the Bishop of the Diocese to induct a person into a vacant Rectory, are particularly defined in the Church Act, passed in the year 1885 (48 Vict., c. 36), in Sections 17 to 23, inclusive.

Their duties in cases of sales of Church lands, and in investing the proceeds of the sales of any such lands, will be found in Sections 50 to 54, inclusive, of that Act.

In addition to these statutory duties, the Committee are of opinion that the duties of Church Wardens in other matters connected with the services of the Church should be defined, as near as practically may be, and they submit herewith the draft of a Canon on the subject.

A Canon to define the Duties of Church Wardens in certain matters.

- 1. It shall be the duty of the Church Wardens to see that all things are provided out of the funds of the Church which are necessary to the decent performance of the Church Services, such as
 - (a) A decent Communion Table, with Cover or Covers, and a fair Linen Cloth.
 - (b) A Flagon for the Wine to be used at the Holy Communion, and a Chalice or Cup, or more than one Cup if necessary, also a Paten or Plate.
 - (c) A decent Basin or Alms Dish, and necessary Plates or Bags to receive the Offerings.
 - (d) A decent Font for Baptisms, if possible of stone.
 - (e) A Pulpit or Lectern, and a Prayer Desk.
 - (f) One or more Surplices, which must be kept clean and in good repair.

- (g) A Bible of large volume of the authorized version, complete, with that part of the Bible called the Apocrypha, for the lessons to be read therefrom.
- (h) Two copies of "The Book of Common Prayer and administration of the Sacraments and other Rites and Ceremonies of the Church, according to the use of the Church of England, together with the Psalter or Psalms of David, and the form and manner of making, ordaining and consecrating of Bishops, Priests, and Deacons," of the last edition, with the revised lectionary.
- (i) One or more Church Bells, if possible.
- (j) A small table, or shelf, or bracket, near the Holy Table, in order that the Rubric, directing the Bread and Wine to be placed on the Holy Table at a certain time of the Service, may be reverently carried out and obeyed.
- (k) They are also to provide, with the advice and direction of the Ministers, from the Offertory money, a sufficient quantity of the best and purest Wheat Bread, and the purest Wine that can conveniently be gotten for the celebration of the Holy Communion, whenever the Minister gives notice thereof. It is to be remembered that so-called "unfermented wine" is forbidden at the Holy Communion.
- (l) They are to provide a secure Chest or Safe for keeping the Register Books directed to be kept by the 17th Canon of this Diocesan Synod, such books, during a vacancy of the office of Rector, to be under the charge of one of the Church Wardens, to be appointed by the Corporation.
- 2. The Church Wardens, or their substitutes for the time being, shall collect the Alms and other Offerings of the Congregation at the Offertory. They shall reverently bring them to the Priest or chief officiating Minister; and they, or their substitutes, shall, immediately after any Service at which a collection has been made, count the collection in the presence of the officiating Minister, and enter the amount thereof, with the date, and their initials, in the Register Book of Services.
- 3. The Church Wardens are to take care that due reverence be observed within the Church during Service.
- 4. They are not to allow the Church to be used for any secular purpose.
- 5. They are to see that the Church is kept clean, and lighted, warmed, and ventilated during Divine Service; also that the Linen be clean and in decent repair.
- They are to make strangers welcome, and provide them with seats, so far as possible.
- 7. The Church Wardens, or either of them, may summon a meeting for the election of Lay Representatives to the Diocesan Synod when the Parish or Cure is vacant, or the Rector or Missionary is absent, or unable, or shall refuse to summon such meeting.

APPENDIX E.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON AMALGAMATION.

To the RIGHT REVEREND THE LORD BISHOP, and the DIOCESAN SYNOD OF FREDERICTON:

The Committee appointed to act under the recommendations of the Report of the Committee on the Amalgamation of the Diocesan Synod and the Diocesan Church Society, at the last meeting of the Synod, beg to submit the following Report:

The Committee have carefully considered the steps necessary to carry such amalgamation into effect, and they now submit the Draft of a Bill which, if approved by the Synod and Church Society, and enacted by the Local Legislature, will, they believe, be fully sufficient for the purpose.

In presenting their Report, the members of the Committee ask that they may not be considered to be debarred from suggesting or supporting, individually, any alterations in the Bill, or any views with regard to the question of Amalgamation which, upon debate, they may think advisable.

AN ACT IN ADDITION TO AND AMENDMENT OF AN ACT INTITULED "AN ACT TO CONSOLIDATE AND AMEND VARIOUS ACTS OF ASSEMBLY RELATING TO THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND IN NEW BRUNSWICK."

Whereas it is deemed expedient to unite the Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick with the Diocesan Synod of Fredericton, and to vest in the said Diocesan Synod of Fredericton the funds and property heretofore held and administered by the said Diocesan Church Society, and otherwise to amend an Act passed in the 48th year of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "An Act to Consolidate and Amend various Acts of Assembly relating to the Church of England in New Brunswick."

- 1. From and after the first day of July, A. D. 1891, The Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick shall be united with and merged in the Diocesan Synod of Fredericton, and shall cease to exist as a separate body or by a separate corporate name.
- 2. It shall be lawful for the said Diocesan Synod of Fredericton, by any amendment of its Constitution hereafter to be made, to provide for the election and appointment by the said Synod of Lay Representatives, to sit in the Synod as Representatives of the Diocese at large; provided that not more than eight such Lay Representatives of the Diocese at large shall be entitled to sit in the said Synod at any one time; and provided also that every such Lay Representative of the Diocese at large shall be a male communicant of the Church of England of the age of 21 years, and resident within the Diocese, but he shall not be required to be a resident of any particular Parish, or a stated attendant at any particular Church or Chapel therein; and the said Diocesan Synod of Fredericton may, in like manner, make provision for the removal of any such Lay Representative of the Diocese at large, and the election and appointment of another in his place, as the said Synod shall direct; and such Lay Representatives of the Diocese at large shall have all such and the like rights, privileges, and immunities, and be subject to the same rules and regulations as any Lay Representative elected for any Parish or Cure. And it shall be lawful for the said Synod to provide for the election and appointment of such Lay Representatives of the Diocese at large, either together at any one time, or separately, from time to time, and in such manner in all respects as its Constitution, so amended, may provide: provided that no Lay Representative of the Diocese at large, unless re-elected as one of such Lay Representatives, or elected as a Lay Representative for some Parish or Cure, shall be permitted to sit or vote in the said Synod for a period extending beyond the close of the fourth annual Session of the Synod after that at which he shall be elected or re-elected to be such Lay Representative of the Diocese at large.

The Diocesan Synod of Fredericton shall be and they are hereby authorized to demise and lease for any term or terms of years, with or without covenants for renewal, and upon such covenants and conditions as may be deemed advisable, and to sell and convey in fee simple, subject to such limitations, conditions, and restrictions as may be deemed advisable, all and every or any the lands, tenements, and hereditaments which now are or hereafter from time to time may be or become vested in the said Synod, and the lease or conveyance of such lands, tenements, and hereditaments, under the seal of the said Synod, and by and with the approval of the Bishop of the Diocese, signified by the same being executed under his hand, shall be valid and effectual for leasing or conveying the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, or any part thereof, free and discharged from the trusts upon which the same may be held, any law, usage, or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

5. Every such lease, sale, and conveyance shall be made and effected in such manner as shall be directed by the said Synod, or by any Board or Committee of such Synod, or Committee or sub-Committee of such Board or Committee, which may be authorized by the said Synod to make and effect the same, and to use and affix the seal of the Synod to conveyances or other instruments made under its authority.

6. APPENDIX F.

REPORT OF THE SYNOD COMMITTEE ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

To the RIGHT REVEREND THE LORD BISHOP, and the DIOCESAN SYNOD OF FREDERICTON:

The Committee of Synod on Sunday Schools beg to report —

That the following questions were issued by them on March 1st, and addressed to all the Clergy of the Diocese:

- i. How many Sunday Schools are at present established in your Parish or Parishes?
- ii. Number of Teachers, male and female, including Superintendents and Librarians?
- iii. Number of Scholars, male and female?
- iv. What scheme of instruction is adopted in the Schools of your Parish?
- v. What Services are held each year in connection with the Schools?
- vi. If no Sunday Schools are established, please state the reason?
- vii. What is the amount contributed by your Sunday Schools yearly for all Church purposes, including Missionary purposes?
- viii. For what objects are such contributions made?
- ix. Are there any special obstacles to the work of Sunday Schools in your Parish?

We have pleasure in recording that to these questions returns have generally been made with great readiness, and a schedule of statistics compiled from these replies accompanies this report. We much regret, however, not being able to present a full return of particulars from all the Parishes in the Diocese, and cannot forbear from expressing our surprise that questions issued under the authority of Canon XII should not meet with a ready response. The Parishes from which we have received no returns are the following:

In the Deanery of Chatham - Bathurst, Richibucto, Restigouche.

In the Deanery of Fredericton — Bright, Douglas, Fredericton, Kingsclear, New Maryland, Stanley.

In the Deanery of Kingston - Cambridge, Greenwich, Westfield.

In the Deanery of Shediac - Albert.

In the Deanery of St. John—St. Jude's (Carleton), Petersville, St. James (City), St. Luke's (Portland), St. John Baptist (Portland).

In the Deanery of Woodstock—Wicklow.

Your Committee would call special attention to these omissions, as without a full statistical return from all the Parishes it is impossible to form a true estimate of the condition or work of our Sunday Schools. It may here be well to remind the clergy that the Canon above referred to lays down that "Each Rector and Missionary in charge of any Parish or Mission within the Diocese shall furnish such statistics for his Parish or Mission to the Committee, and shall reply to such inquiries as the Committee may make, whenever required by them so to do."

With regard to those Parishes from which returns have been received, it is satisfactory to notice that in nearly all cases definite courses of instruction are in use. Where no special course is followed, we would strongly recommend the adoption of some one of those mentioned in the accompanying schedule. Such must always be a great assistance to teachers, especially in Parishes where the clergyman is unable to personally superintend the Sunday School. One other point for special comment seems to be that, although the majority of Parishes have either quarterly or monthly services for children, yet some fourteen fail to observe any. Your Committee believe that at least monthly services for children should be held in Church whenever possible, and would urge upon the clergy the desirability of establishing this usage in their Parishes. It is to be feared that without these special services many little ones seldom join in the Church's worship, and remain content with the Sunday School.

We are glad to hear that the meetings of the Teachers' Associations in the St. John and Kingston Deaneries are being attended with increasing success, and trust the same is true of the Association in the Shediac Deanery.

APPENDIX G.

REPORT OF THE GOVERNORS OF KING'S COLLEGE, WINDSOR, N. S.

(Submitted July 4th, 1888.)

To the SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF FREDERICTON:

In behalf of the Governors of King's College appointed by this Synod, I beg leave to submit the following Report:

It is impossible to make the yearly reports concerning King's College a record of continuous progression. We wait for the turn of the tide, but the flood of prosperity still lingers. The future is still involved in much uncertainty, and there is abundant reason why all who have the welfare of the College at heart should exert themselves to the utmost in its behalf.

In the election and consecration of Dr. Courtney to the Bishopric of Nova Scotia we have abundant cause for thankfulness. As Visitor of the College and *ex officio* President of the Board of Governors, he seems likely to prove himself a tower of strength. His resolute determination to bring King's College more nearly to the position which it ought to occupy in public confidence and esteem, coupled with his wide influence and his appreciation of what the requirements of the College are, cannot fail to accomplish much good.

An important change has been made in the Faculty by the appointment of Rev. Dr. Willets to the chair of Classics in the room of Mr. Hammond, whose engagement terminated in June last. Dr. Willets is a graduate and former scholar of Corpus Christi College, Cambridge, and is well and favorably known as head master of the Collegiate School. It was in recognition of his excellent work in connection with the school that the University conferred upon him the honorary degree of D. C. L. in 1882.

It was stated in the report for last year that the west wall of the Library and Convocation Hall was in an unsafe condition, and would probably have to be rebuilt. It was found possible to secure it by means of upright and cross timbers bolted through the wall, and this has accordingly been done at a comparatively small cost.

As regards our financial condition there is not much progress to report. We are still sadly crippled for want of funds. The income for this year has been slightly in excess of the expenditure, thanks to an extra grant of \$100 which the Associated Alumni were able to make.

The results of the Degree examinations, which were conducted by extra-collegiate examiners, show that good work has been done during the past year.

The Collegiate School has just entered upon its hundredth year, and through the energy of the Head Master an excellent and commodious gymnasium has been built by private subscription to commemorate the Centennial.

The good will of the College towards this Diocese is shown not only by the courtesy which is always extended to your representative at the meetings of the Board of Governors, but by the selection of the Rector of Fredericton to preach the Encania sermon, and the election of Rev. Canon Brigstocke to the Board of Governors by an almost unanimous vote of the Alumni at their annual meeting.

APPENDIX H.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN MISSIONS.

To the LORD BISHOP OF FREDERICTON, AND MEMBERS OF THE DIOCESAN SYNOD:

In presenting their Annual Report, the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions cannot forbear expressing their regret that they are unable to record an increase of contributions towards the great work of Missions in the Domestic and Foreign field. Many reasons may, no doubt, be assigned for such result, but they earnestly hope that it shows no lack of sympathy and zeal in missionary enterprise.

The contributions received by the Treasurer have been as follows: For the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, \$476.53, which shows a decrease of \$37.56 in the amount raised the preceding year; for the Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews, \$105.79, a decrease of \$149.45; for Parochial Missions to the Jews' Fund, \$74.05, an increase of \$28.90; for Special Fund for Jewish work in Alexandria, \$30.13; making a total for Foreign Missions of \$686.50. The contributions for Domestic Missions have been as follows: For the Diocese of Algoma, \$296.67; for the Bishop of Algoma's Stipend, \$159.53; for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund (Algoma), \$18.18; for the Wawanosh Home, \$10; for Domestic Missions, unappropriated, \$120.21; and for North West Missions \$10.12; making a total of \$614.71.

Besides the above sums, we are duly informed that \$30 have been forwarded to Benson's East Indian Missions; \$213.35 to the Church Missionary Society; \$128.61 to the Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews; \$150 towards the support of two children in the Indian Homes (Algoma); and \$81 to the Church of England Zenana Missionary Society; making a sum total from the Diocese for Missionary purposes of \$1,904.17 — a decrease of \$605.47 in the amount raised last year.

The Report of your Board last year stated that it had been found impossible to raise by subscriptions the sum which this Diocese had undertaken to contribute annually towards the Bishop of Algoma's Stipend, and recommended that the Board be authorized, in the event of not being able in the current year to raise the amount by individual subscription, as heretofore, to devote to that purpose any sums that may be necessary from monies received for Domestic Missions. Last July the arrears due amounted to \$150, against which there was the small balance of \$12, and, as since that date only \$95 have been subscribed for that purpose, your Board has been constrained to pay \$343 out of funds sent in for Domestic Missions during the year to settle what is due up to present date (30th June, 1888).

During the year your Board has taken further steps to promote the circulation of "The Canadian Church Magazine and Mission News," the official organ of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada, and for that purpose sent a canvasser to Fredericton, St. Stephen, and St. Andrews. We regret to say that only 20 subscribers could be obtained throughout the whole Church population of those places. Twenty-seven new subscribers have been added to the list for St. John and Portland, making the total number in circulation through the Diocese of 144, an increase of 50 over the number reported last year.

Of the proceedings of the Board of Management of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada, we have no direct information. From The Canadian Church Magazine we learn that its Board of Management met in Toronto last September, which the representatives of this Diocese were unfortunately unable to attend. The chief business which engaged its attention seems to have been the question of the Canadian Church undertaking directly Foreign Missionary work. All action in the matter was, however, postponed until a conference had been held upon the subject with the Missionary Societies in England. Another meeting of the Board was held in April in Montreal, which was also unattended by any of the representatives of this Diocese. From the statement presented by the Treasurer, the receipts for Domestic Missions for the past six months were \$5,569.14, and for Foreign Missions \$7,208.39, making a total of \$12,777.53. It was reported that there were 25,000 Chinese in the Dominion living in all the darkness of heathendom, and it was resolved that steps should be taken to evangelize them. Bishop Kingdon and Mr. G. Herbert Lee were appointed a committee to prepare the next Epiphany Appeal. The next meeting of the Board was appointed to be held in St. John on the second Wednesday in October.

Such, in brief, is the record of Missionary effort in the Domestic and Foreign Mission field during the past year, and how far any of us have done what we could fitly forms a subject for searching examination. The work spread out before the Church of God is immeasurably great, and the opportunities for preaching the Gospel now lie open everywhere. We have great responsibilities towards those in this vast Dominion who are as sheep without a shepherd. Nor ought we to think little of missions to the heathen in Africa and the East. If we

"Curse ye Meroz," said the Angel of the Lord, "curse ye bitterly the inhabitants thereof; because they came not to the help of the Lord, to the help of the Lord against the mighty."

APPENDIX J.

REPORT OF THE WOMEN'S AID ASSOCIATION DIOCESE OF FREDERICTON.

In accordance with the request of the Synod at its last meeting, the Committee of the Women's Aid Association beg to submit the following Report of the work of the Association during the past year:

The Fredericton Branch has 146 members. The quarterly meetings have been held regularly, and addresses by the Bishops and several of the clergy have done much to promote an interest in the work of the Church in the Diocese. The Lecture Committee arranged a series of literary and musical evenings during the winter in the Church Hall, which were much enjoyed, and realized the sum of \$71.60. Needlework Committee has realized \$80 from the sale of work, and in December sent a donation for a Christmas tree to the Danish Settle-The income of the Fredericton Branch since June, 1887, amounts to the sum of \$225.08. The grants for the year are as follows: Books for Ludlow, \$20; Miss Jacob, travelling expenses to Ludlow to help in the mission work, \$40; building fund, church at Temperance Vale, \$100; building fund, church at Birch Ridge, Victoria County, \$50; a total of \$210. At the June meeting it was resolved that the Fredericton Branch guarantee the sum of \$100 annually, for five years, towards the salary of a missionary on the Upper Tobique. The St. Paul's (Portland) Needlework Society was affiliated with the Association in 1887. Mrs. W. H. DeVeber is vice-president, and Miss Murray secretary. The members are 60 in number. The Secretary reports that the income during the year from contributions, donations, and the Christmas sale, amounts to \$249. Of this sum \$80 were devoted to the mission of St. Barnabas, which has been lately established about three miles distant from St. Paul's Church. The scattered inhabitants of this district, which was destitute of any place of worship, have eagerly assisted in building a neat church, in which services and Sunday school are regularly held by the clergy of St. Paul's.

The Secretary of the Hampton Branch reports eleven members and an income in the year of \$50. The Hampton Branch is endeavoring to pay off the debt on the chapel in the village. The St. John Girls' Branch consists of 26 ordinary and 28 associate members. Miss Schofield, the Secretary, reports that 29 meetings have been held, at several of which Bishop Kingdon was present and addressed the members on missionary work in the Diocese. The sum of \$50 has been remitted to

Bishop Kingdon for the maintenance of the work at Ludlow, and there is a balance of \$21 on hand. A donation was sent to the Ladies' Association of the Church Institute for a Christmas tree at Ludlow, and 300 books and pamphlets have been sent to two country parishes. The kind donation of useful and fancy articles from Bishop Kingdon will be disposed of at the sale in December.

A Branch has been formed in Woodstock, of which Mrs. B. H. Smith is Vice-President, and Mrs. W. F. Dibblee, Secretary-Treasurer, and has 24 other members. A Branch has also been formed in the Parish of Burton with 23 members. Mrs. Hubbard is Vice-President, and Mrs. Stockes Secretary-Treasurer. The income so far amounts to \$16, chiefly members' subscriptions. Eleven dollars have been added to the Parish endowment, and the members have guaranteed \$50 for needed repairs on the church and to pay premium of insurance on the church. A Branch has been established in Hillsboro, Albert County. Mrs. Tomkins, Vice-President; Mrs. John Steeves, Treasurer; Mrs. Osman, Secretary, and several members.
