Mississippi Riven Trade.—The St. Louis Republican of the 6th inst., gives the following view of business between that city and New Orleans:

A number of steamers have arrived from New Orleans within the past week or ten days with unusually heavy cargoes, and receipts of groceries and general merchandise from that quarter were, burthers, never known more liberal at his season of the year.—Several boats have brought up five, six, and even as high as seven and eight hundred tons of freight, but the fine steamer Atlantic, Captain Oglesby, which arrived yesterday has borne off the prize in the way of big cargoes. She came into port loaded to the guards, and her manifest exhibits the names of over one hundred and twenty consignees. Since the discovery by the Prussian naturalist, Markgraf, of the mode of extracting sugar from beets and potatoes, it has been an object of the policy of the different European states to protect this undustry by high duties. Though the article produced is inspired in comparison with the came sugar, the price is exorbitant. In France, for instance, the price of common sugar, such as that used by ladies, for preserving fruit, is sixteen sous a pound, that all common table sugar twenty; and that of the better sorts between twenty-five and thirry.
