The Paris correspondent of the Times indicates as the result of yesterday's vote in the French Chamber, that the committee of thirty now have received an imperative mandate, forcing them to promptly organize either the septennate without proclaiming the Republic, or to constitute the definitive Republic under President MacMahon. It is probable that the commission will organize a septennate, and the Assembly will ratify its decision, otherwise the majority hitherto with the Government will shift to the Left, which, in all probability, would cause MacMahon to resign.

London, June 17. SPAIN'S CIVIL WAR. A battle between the Republicans and Carlists at Estella, Spain, is reported in progress.

FRANCE'S POLITICAL MIDDLE. The Orleans papers in Paris do not deem the recent rejection of Rochefoucauld's Monarchical resolution by the Assembly after defeat.

The members of the Right and Left Centres of the French Assembly are commended by the Parisian Republican journals for voting against the Monarchy. A deputy in the French Assembly claims that seven members represented as voting "urgency" were not present, and that a rectification of the vote would make it 330 affirmative to 340 negative.

FLOOD AND FAMINE. A third of Louisiana is still under water one to two feet deep, and 70,000 to 80,000 people are destitute. Much sickness prevails and, unless the people obtain relief, the suffering during the summer will be beyond precedent.

The late Dr. Wayland, President of Brown's University, was very fond of everything pertaining to the sea and ships. A student who fastened himself to the keel of a boat, and who, it is said, knew much about naval science introduced the subject to the President, but he soon retired in confusion, as the doctor knew vastly more about it than he did, carrying away Collingwood's despatches, which he was advised to read thoroughly.

In a recent lecture on the Roman Catacombs, Dean Stanley of Westminster Abbey said that the oldest chamber of the catacombs, which dated from about the beginning of the second century, contained representations of a joyous nature. There were no crosses or illustrations of torture, or death's heads, but wreaths of roses and children at play. Heavily painted were very freely copied, the figures of Orpheus, Psyche, and Bacchus being frequent. In the midst of so much heathen imagery was the frequent representation of the Good Shepherd. The religion of the first Christians, as it appeared in the catacombs, was a religion of a joyful nature, one which had a tendency not to rebel but to include, not to condemn but to save. Besides the Good Shepherd the most prominent figure was the vine, which ran over the whole chamber.

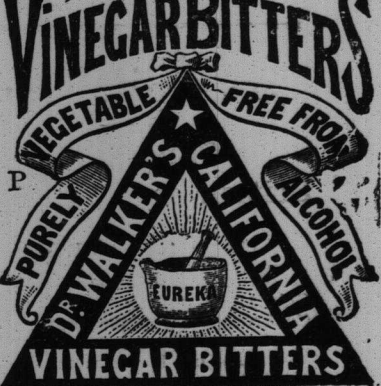
