

## BILL.

An Act to amend the Act passed in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, chapter forty-nine, intituled, "An " Act to regulate the Culling and Mea-" surement of Timber, Masts, Spars,

WHEREAS it hath been ascertained by Preamble experience that parties have been enabled to evade the penalties imposed by the Act passed in the eighth year of Her Majes-5 ty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to regulate the Act 8 Vict., c "Culling and Measurement of Timber, Masts, 49, cited " Spars, Deals, Staves and other articles of a like " nature, and to repeal a certain Act therein "mentioned," and it is expedient to amend 10 the said Act: Be it therefore enacted, &c.:

And it is hereby enacted by the authority of Sect. 22 and the same, That the twenty-second and twenty-24 of the said fourth sections of the said Act shall be and they are hereby respectively repealed.

15 II. And be it enacted, That any Culler Culler not heensed under the said Act, and not em- employed by ployed by the Supervisor, may engage or may hire as a hire to merchants or others as a Shipping Shipping Cul-Culler; but such Culler shall in no case cull, may do as sort, measure, stamp or mark any description Culler of Lumber before the same shall have been first culled or measured by some licensed Culler other than himself, under the direction of the Supervisor, except by the written 25 permission of the Supervisor, and in accordance with the same rules and on the same terms by which Cullers acting under the
