A Charter of Incorporation has been granted for the 'The Toronto Cathedral School, Limited.' The provisional Directors are His Grace the Archbishop, David Kemp, George William Verrall, Jun, Jacob Andrea Kammerer, William Henry Brouse, and Herbert Langell Dunn.

The ground was broken for the erection of the School building at Humbercourt on Monday 14th September. The Archbishop, accompanied by a dozen or more of friends from the neighbourhood of the Cathedral, drove out in a coach and four, and His Grace with due ceremony turned the first sod, after which a number of those present, including several of the boys of the school, each contributed to the making of an excavation All the Masters of the School were present. The Rev. Mr. and Mrs Jones, and the Rev. Mr. Jenkins, were also present, with many others of Weston. Among those who went from Toronto were Mrs. Sweatman, Mrs. Chadwick, Mrs. Matthews.

A notable event of more than local interest was the marriage of Miss Edith Margaret Sweatman eldest daughter of His Grace the Archbishop, to Mr. John Lowe Walton, in the present of a large gathering of friends of His Grace and Mrs. Sweatman,
