MUNICIPAL NOMINATIONS.

The nomination of candidates for municipal offices throughout the Province took place on Monday last. In Listowel, at the appointed hour, 10 o'clock, the electors assembled in considerable numbers in the town hall for the purpose of nominating candidates for the offices of Mayor, Reeve and Deputy-Reeve. For the Mayoralty, Thos. E. Hny was proposed by J. W. Scott and seconded by W.m. McKinnie; Jacob Loree was proposed by B. B. Sutherland; Jno. A. Hacking was proposed by W. D. Campbell was proposed by W. D. Easterland; Jno. A. Hacking was proposed by J. P. Newman and seconded by George Hess. For Deputy-Reeve, George Hess was proposed by D. D. Hay. M. P. P., and seconded by George Zilliax. There being no other nominations for the office of Deputy Reeve, Mr. George Hess was declared elected. At the conclusion of the nominations, J. W. Scott, Is-1, the present Mayor, and the several candidates addressed the meeting. Mr. Scott expressed his thanks for the confidence the ratepayers of Listowel had reposed in him, having elected him by acclaumation for three successive years to the chief office at their disposal; He had endeavored during his tenure of office to promote the best interests of the town, and he was satisfied that his course was approved of by the ratepayers. He alluded to the present condition of the town's finances, which he considered very satisfactory. At the present time there were nearly \$3,000 in the Bank with about \$2,000 of taxes yet to come in, which with the revenue from licenses, etc., would make about \$6,000 to the credit of the town. This, he considered, would be sufficient to carry the town well through the complete of public improvements. He considered that the present rate of taxation was net heavy, and thought that it would compare favorably with that of other towns. Mr. Scott stated that his reasons for retiring from the position of Mayor were, firstly, that he left it due to other gentlemen in the town to retire, as he did not believe in a monepoly of nuncipal honors; and seconded by Mc.
