THE BLOCKADE. Castro's Request That It Be Raised Is Discussed.

London, Jan. 13.—President Castro's request that the powers raise the blockade of the coast of Venezuela is still under discussion. The Foreign office inclines to the belief that a suspension of the blockade would reduce matters to the same status as that existed at the beginning of the dispute, and it appears probable that unless an expedient is devised, Great Britain will insist on the continuance of the blockade in some form.

Berlin, Jan. 13.—The Foreign officials here commenting on the statement that his demand that the powers raise the blockade before commencing negotiations in Washington, say this is quite incredible. They also assert that the United States has not asked that the blockade be raised.

B-P's PROMOTION. Has Been Appointed Inspector-General of Cavalry.

London, Jan. 14.—A telegram from Johannesburg announces that Gen. Baden-Powell has been appointed an inspector-general of cavalry and that he will come to England in time to take up his appointment. The general has been in charge of the South African Constabulary.

U. S. GRAIN. Inferior Wheat Causes Complaint in Germany.

Berlin, Jan. 13.—The society of grain dealers of the Hamburg Bourse has published the following notice: "Renewed complaints against the inferior quality of United States shipments of wheat and corn have been made to the German government and the society of grain dealers of the United States produce exchange in order to remedy the serious complaint of, and to secure strict supervision of, classification."

WAR CONTRIBUTION. Mr. Chamberlain Arrives at Agreement With Mining Men.

Johnannesburg, Jan. 13.—Colonial Secretary Chamberlain and the leaders of the mining community here have arrived at an agreement in the committee of arrangements. Under this agreement the Transvaal will contribute the amount of £150,000,000, an Imperial loan of £150,000,000 will be given for the expenditure in reproductive public works in the Transvaal and the Orange River Colonies.

RUSSIAN BUDGET. Conditions of the Country Show an Improvement.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 13.—The budget estimate for 1933 places the ordinary revenue at \$948,516,339, the ordinary expenditure at \$942,614,500, the surplus plus at \$8,316,724,500 and extraordinary expenditure at \$65,631,121.50. The latter item will be met by the ordinary revenue of \$250,000,000, and the treasury reserve of \$80,000,000.

The budget estimates are \$10,490,511,500 for the building of the Siberian railway, and \$72,507,200 for the building of other public works.
