DEATH STALKS AT THE FEAST

SECRETARY OF THE U. S. TREASURY WINDOM STRICKEN DOWN

While Attending the Annual Banquet of the New York Board of Trade at Del-

NEW YORK, Jan. 29.—Over 250 pm ended the 18th annual banquet of York Board of Trade and Transp elmonico's to-night. Many pro emen were present, including Windom and Tracy, ex-Secreta Murat Halstead, Collector Erhan Woodford Erastus Wiman, Ho. Laurier of Canada, Hon. J. W. Attorney - General of Nova and J. W. Vrooman. At sumptuous feast had been parte Capt. Ambrose Snow, president Board, introduced Secretary Windom, responded to the toast, "Our country's p perity dependent upon its instruments commerce." The secretary made an excellentaddress and was heartily applauded. Judge Arnoux then got up and was introducing excoretary Bayard, when someone cried: "Look at Secretary Windom!". The speech was broken short and every eye was rned in the direction of the Secretary. He had collapsed and was falling to the floor. His face was ghastly and a cry of horror arose among the guests.
