The resignation of the provincial treasurer of the province of Quebec, a few days ago, has attracted much public attention to the unfortunate financial condition in which that province is now placed through the extravagance and waste of previous local governments.

Quebec is the third province of the dominion which has resorted to direct taxation for local purposes, and in both the other provinces, British Columbia and Prince Edward Island, these taxes are proving all but objectionable and unpopular.
