Most Gracious Sovereign,

Preamble.

WHEREAS it appears by messages from His Excellency, the Right Honourable the Earl of Athlone, etc., etc., Governor General of Canada, and the estimates accompanying the said messages, that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the public service of Canada, not otherwise provided for, for the financial year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and for other purposes connected with the public service: May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it 10 enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, that:—


Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as The Appropriation Act, No. 1, 1945.

\$5,654,976.27 granted for 1944-45.

2. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole five million, six hundred and fifty-four thousand, nine hundred and seventy-six dollars and twenty-seven cents towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the 20 public service from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, not otherwise provided for, set forth in the Schedule to this Act.


Amounts chargeable to year ending 31st March, 1945. 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of *The Consolidated* 25 Revenue and Audit Act, 1931, the amounts appropriated by this Act may be paid at any time on or before the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-



five, and such payments shall be deemed to have been made in and be chargeable to the fiscal year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five.

Account to be rendered in detail.

4. A detailed account of the sums expended under the 5 authority of this Act shall be laid before the House of Commons of Canada during the first fifteen days of the then next session of Parliament.



## BILL 3.

An Act for granting to His Majesty aid for National Defence and Security.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Canada is at war with the German Reich and Japan; and whereas the term of this Parliament will have ended on the seventeenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five; and whereas it is expedient that aid be rendered to His Majesty for the common defence and security and for the prosecution of the war until a new Parliament assembles: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as The War Appropriation Act, 10 No. 1, 1945.

Appropriation \$2,000,000,000

2. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied, beyond the ordinary grants of Parliament, a sum not exceeding two billion dollars (\$2,000,000,000) subject to allotment by the Treasury 15 Board, towards defraying any expenses or making any advances or loans that may be incurred or granted by or under the authority of the Governor in Council during the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, for

(a) the security, defence, peace, order and welfare of

Canada;

(b) the conduct of naval, military and air operations in

or beyond Canada;

(c) promoting the continuance of trade, industry and 25 business communications, whether by means of insurance or indemnity against war risk or in any other manner whatsoever;

1943-44, c. 17; 1944-45, c. 15. (d) the purposes of The War Appropriation (United Nations Mutual Aid) Act, 1943, as amended by The 30 War Appropriation (United Nations Mutual Aid) Act, 1944; and

#### EXPLANATORY NOTES.

Apart from the necessary changes to make this Bill accord with the changes in the amount of the appropriation requested, and the changes in dates, this Bill is in the same form as that of previous War Appropriation Bills, with the two following exceptions:

- (1) The preamble draws attention to the fact that the term of the present Parliament will have ended on April 17th next, and that consequently an interim appropriation is necessary to provide funds for the continuing prosecution of the war until the next Parliament assembles; and
- (2) There has been added a new paragraph (d) in section two of the Bill.

It is intended that the funds to be provided under the Bill will be used for the purposes set out in The War Appropriation Acts passed last year, and in the War Appropriation (United Nations Mutual Aid) Act 1943 as amended by The War Appropriation (United Nations Mutual Aid) Act 1944.

The amount of the appropriation requested is based on the assumption that expenditures for war and Mutual Aid will continue during the next five months at approximately the same rate as during the last five or six months. (e) the carrying out of any measure deemed necessary or advisable by the Governor in Council in consequence of the existence of a state of war,

and any moneys received as a refund or repayment of any advance, loan or expenditure made under the authority of The War Appropriation Act, 1939, The War Appropriation Act, 1940, The War Appropriation Act, 1941, The War Appropriation Act, No. 1, 1942, The War Appropriation Act, No. 2, 1942, The Supplementary 1942 War Appropriation Act, The War Appropriation Act, No. 1, 1943, The War Appropriation Act, No. 3, 1943, The War Appropriation Act, No. 3, 1943, The War Appropriation Act, No. 2, 1944, or this Act may, with the approval of the Governor in Council, be re-expended, advanced or loaned for the purposes of this Act.

Government may act as agent.

3. (1) The Government of Canada may act as the agent of the Government of any British or foreign country allied with His Majesty for any purpose which, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, will aid directly or indirectly in the prosecution of the war, and any obligations or costs 20 incurred temporarily or assumed by the Government of Canada in the exercise of the powers hereby conferred may be paid out of any unappropriated moneys in the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Expenditures required by Government wholly-owned companies.

(2) Any expenditure required to be made by the Gov- 25 ernment of Canada under any contract for munitions of war and supplies entered into by the Government of Canada for the purpose of enabling any company wholly-owned by the Government of Canada to fulfil its obligations in respect of orders received by such company from the 30 Government of any British or foreign country allied with His Majesty may be paid out of any unappropriated moneys in the Consolidated Revenue Fund.


Loans authorized.

1931, c. 27.

4. (1) The Governor in Council may, in addition to the sums now remaining unborrowed and negotiable of the 35 loans authorized by Parliament, by any Act heretofore passed, raise by way of loan, under the provisions of *The Consolidated Revenue and Audit Act, 1931*, by the issue and sale or pledge of securities of Canada, in such form, for such separate sums, at such rate of interest and upon such 40 other terms and conditions as the Governor in Council may approve, such sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole the sum of two billion dollars (\$2,000,000,000) as may be required for the purposes of this Act.

(2) The principal raised by way of loan under this Act, and the interest thereon shall be a charge upon and payable 45 out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Charge on Consolidated Revenue Fund.



Orders and regulations 5. (1) The Governor in Council may make, from time to time, such orders or regulations as may be deemed necessary to give effect to the purposes of this Act, and for greater certainty, but not so as to restrict the generality of the foregoing terms, the Governor in Council may, by order or regulation:—

(a) make provision for the appointment of temporary civil officers, clerks and employees and determine their rates of compensation and conditions of employ-

ment;

(b) determine the rates of pay and allowances of officers 10 and men of the naval, military and air forces of Canada;

(c) prescribe administrative practices with respect to contracts and agreements for the execution of any public work or for the acquisition of lands, buildings, equipment, stores, materials and supplies, by pur-15 chase or otherwise, for the use of the public service of Canada:

(d) provide for the utilization, control and disposal of

equipment, materials and supplies; and


(e) prescribe administrative practices with respect to 20 the making of financial commitments, the taking of security for the performance of contracts and agreements, and the recording and paying of accounts.


Power to vary orders and regulations.

(2) All orders and regulations of the Governor in Council made under this Act shall have the force of law and may be 25 varied, extended or revoked by any subsequent order or regulation; but if any order or regulation is varied, extended or revoked, neither the previous operation thereof nor anything duly done thereunder shall be affected thereby, nor shall any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, 30 accrued, accruing or incurred thereunder be affected by any such variation, extension or revocation.

Accounting record of commitments.

6. Upon the Treasury Board making an allotment of any part of the two billion dollars (\$2,000,000,000) granted by this Act, to provide for the cost of any service, the 35 Minister of Finance shall cause an accounting record to be maintained in a form that will disclose the financial commitments entered into and the expenditure made as a consequence of the allotment being provided for the service concerned.


Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as The Appropriation Act, No. 2, 1945.

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\$148,845,000.59 granted for 1945-46.

2. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole one hundred and forty-eight million, eight hundred and forty-five thousand dollars and fifty-nine cents towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the 20 public service, from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, not otherwise provided for, and being five-twelfths of the amount of each of the items to be voted, set forth in the Main Estimates 25 for the fiscal year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, as laid before the House of Commons at the present session of Parliament.



\$437,749.83 granted for 1945-46.

3. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied, in addition to the amount granted therefor by section two of this Act, a sum not exceeding in the whole four hundred and thirty-seven thousand, seven hundred and forty-nine dollars and eighty-three cents towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the public service, from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, not otherwise provided for, and being one-twelfth of the 10 amount of each of the several items to be voted set forth in Schedule A to this Act.

\$862,958.33 granted for 1945-46. 4. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied, in addition to the amount granted therefor by section two of this Act a sum not 15 exceeding in the whole eight hundred and sixty-two thousand, nine hundred and fifty-eight dollars and thirty-three cents towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the public service, from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, to the thirty-first 20 day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, not otherwise provided for, and being one-sixth of the amount of each of the several items to be voted set forth in Schedule B to this Act.

Power to raise sums required for redeeming loans or obligations. 1931, 27. 5. (1) The Governor in Council may, in addition to the 25 sums now remaining unborrowed and negotiable of the loans authorized by Parliament, by any Act heretofore passed, raise by way of loan, under the provisions of The Consolidated Revenue and Audit Act, 1931, by the issue and sale or pledge of securities of Canada, in such form, for 30 such separate sums, at such rate of interest and upon such other terms and conditions as the Governor in Council may approve, such sum or sums of money as may be required for paying or redeeming loans or obligations of Canada maturing or callable in the fiscal year ending March 31, 35 1946.

Chargeable to Consolidated Revenue Fund.

(2) The principal raised by way of loan under this Act and the interest thereon shall be a charge upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Account to be rendered in detail.

6. A detailed account of the sums expended under the 40 authority of this Act shall be laid before the House of Commons of Canada during the first fifteen days of the next session of Parliament.




