## GENERAL LAWS.

---

"Omnium regina rerum oratio."

PACUVIUS.

---

### Section I.—The Society.

1. The Society shall consist of the Graduates of King's College and the University of Toronto; and of the Students of University College.
2. It shall be called The University College Literary and Scientific Society.
3. The objects of the Society shall be: the encouragement of Literary and Scientific pursuits among its members, by Discussions and Essays on subjects suitable for that purpose; and by the establishment of a Reading Room.
4. No controverted point in religion or politics shall be admitted for discussion in the Society.
5. The President and Professors of University College shall be the Patrons of the Society, and shall have the right of attendance at all its meetings.

**Section II.—Members.**

1. The Society shall consist of Ordinary, Honorary, Corresponding and Life Members.
2. Ordinary Members shall consist of Graduates and Students.
3. Honorary Members shall consist of Graduates, as hereinafter determined, and such Ordinary Members as the Society may elect.
4. Graduates of King's College and the University of Toronto, who have already (*a*) taken a higher degree than Bachelor of Arts in the same, shall be Honorary Members.
5. Ordinary Members, upon taking a higher degree than Bachelor in any of the Faculties, at the University of Toronto, shall thereby become Honorary Members.
6. Corresponding Members shall consist of such Graduates, not resident in Toronto, as may be desirous of contributing to the objects of the Society.
7. Life Members shall consist of such Ordinary Members as shall have subscribed for four years to the funds of the Society.

8. Candidates for Membership shall be nominated at an ordinary meeting, and balloted for at the next ordinary meeting.

9. The Election of Members shall be by ballot ; the votes of a majority present shall elect a Graduate or Matriculated Student, and the votes of two-thirds present, an Occasional Student.

10. An Occasional Student shall be nominated by one of the officers of the Society, and, when elected, shall have the right to continue a member of the Society only so long as he attends University College, unless elected an Honorary Member.

11. Each member, on admission, shall subscribe his name to a declaration to observe the laws of the Society.

---

### Section III.—Officers.

1. The officers shall constitute the General Committee of the Society, and shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Curator, and four Councillors—two of whom shall be Graduates.

2. The election of officers shall take place annually, by ballot, at the ordinary meeting preceding the close of the academic year.

3. Members, to be eligible for offices in the Society, shall be nominated at the ordinary meeting preceding the election; and such as are nominated for superior offices, and not elected thereto, shall be eligible for election as Councillors.

4. The General Committee shall make by-laws for conducting the business of meetings, and for otherwise carrying out the laws of the Society.

5. The President, or, in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents, alternately, shall preside at all meetings of the Society, and shall decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the meeting.

6. The Secretary shall keep the minutes, and conduct the correspondence of the Society and General Committee, and notify Debaters and Essayists of their appointment.

7. The Treasurer shall receive and account for all moneys belonging to the Society, and notify members of the fees and fines in arrear.

8. The Curator shall have charge of the Reading Room, and shall have authority to enforce the rules, subject to an appeal to the General Committee.

9. Vacancies in the General Committee shall be filled up in the same manner as at the Annual Elections.

**Section IV.—Meetings.**

1. The meetings of the Society shall be held on every Friday evening, during term, from 7 to 10 o'clock.
2. Every fourth meeting of the Society shall be considered a public meeting, to which the Patrons of the Society, and others, shall be invited.
3. An Essay shall be read and a Question debated at each meeting of the Society.
4. Each member, in the order of his name upon the roll, shall read an Essay, and act as Opener or Respondent, or Debater, or find a substitute.
5. The Opener and Respondent and two other Debaters on each side, selected as above, shall be announced at the meeting previous to that for which they are appointed.
6. The Opener shall have the right to reply at the close of the debate; but no other member shall speak more than once. (a)
7. Each member in speaking shall address the Chair.
8. At the close of each debate, the Chairman shall sum up and give his decision, and then put the ques-

tion to the vote of the meeting, with which his decision shall be counted; and in case of an equal division, he shall have a second or casting vote.

9. The General Committee shall have authority to call a Special Meeting of the Society at any time, and for any purpose, by giving due notice thereof.

---

**Section V.—Reading-Room.**

1. The Reading-Room shall remain open from nine o'clock in the morning until sun-set, each day, except Friday, when it shall remain open until the close of the meeting of the Society.

2. Members on entering the room shall sign their names in the Register; and shall avoid such discussions as might disturb others in the room.

3. No periodicals shall be removed from the Reading-Room.

---

**Section VI.—Finance.**

1. The annual subscription for Ordinary Members shall be 5s.

2. Matriculated and Occasional Students of University College, not members of the Society, shall be admissible to the Reading-Room on an annual payment of 2s. 6d., and on signing a declaration to observe the rules of the same.

3. The following fines shall be imposed under the laws:

Failure in reading an Essay . . . .	7½d.	1s. 3d.
Disobedience to the Chair, discretionary with Chairman, not to exceed . . .	2s. 6d.	5s.

4. Appeals against fines shall be decided by the General Committee.

5. One week, after notification from the Treasurer, shall be allowed for the payment of fines and fees; and if not then paid, the defaulter may be struck off the roll.

---

#### Section VII.—Alterations in the Laws.

1. Alterations in the laws shall be discussed only at the last meeting in each term, or such other meeting as the General Committee may appoint, after having been announced at a previous meeting.

2. No such alteration shall take place without receiving the votes of two-thirds of the members present, nor without the sanction of the College Council.

**B Y - L A W S .**

1. The Order of Business at the Ordinary Meetings of the Society shall be as follows :

- (a.) The minutes of the previous meeting read and confirmed, and then signed by the Chairman.
- (b.) Election of Candidates for admission, previously nominated.
- (c.) Nomination of Candidates for admission.
- (d.) Communications received since the last meeting.
- (e.) Business from the General Committee.
- (f.) Business arising out of the minutes.
- (g.) Notices of Motion.
- (h.) Roll called.
- (i.) Essay read.
- (j.) Question Debated.
- (k.) Announcements for the next meeting.

2. The following Motions shall be in order at any time :

(a.) To adjourn the meeting.

(b.) To postpone the discussion.

(c.) To refer to the General Committee.

3. The following time shall be allowed in the Order of Business :

(a.) Twenty minutes to the Essayist.

(b.) Fifteen minutes to each Speaker.

(c.) Ten minutes to the Opener for his reply at the close of the debate.

4. Every Motion, and Notice of Motion, before being read to the Society shall be put in writing by the mover.

5. Each Member, during the last fortnight of each term, shall hand to the Secretary four questions for debate, from which the General Committee shall select such as may be approved.

6. The Secretary shall prepare a list of the Essayists and Debaters for each meeting during the year, and place the same in the Reading Room.

7. The Treasurer shall, each month, announce the fines and fees due by members, and place a list of the same in the Reading Room.
8. The Curator shall prepare a list of the Periodicals received, with the value of single copies, and place the same in the Reading Room.
9. Each Member shall have the privilege of admitting a Visitor to the Reading Room and Ordinary Meetings of the Society.
10. Any By-law may be suspended for one meeting by a majority of the members present.
