BRILLIANT OPENING OF THE NEW CAMPAIGN... BRITISH CAPTURED FIVE BOER LAAGERS.

General French Forces a Passage Across the Modder River at Clip Drift and Now Occupies the Hills to the North—Boer Army Barred From the Direct Route to Bloemfontein.

Enemy's Supplies Were Captured—British Losses Were Small—The Times Says Lord Roberts is Now Executing, With His Old Skill, a Plan of Operations Carefully and Ably Thought Out—Boers in Natal in the Old British Camp—A Traitor at Ladysmith—Latest War News.

LORD ROBERTS' BULLETIN.

LONDON, Feb. 14, 11.35 p.m.—The War Office has issued the following further message from Lord Roberts received this evening:

"KEKIL'S DRIFT, Feb. 14, 8.10 a.m.—Gen. French left this point at 11.30 yesterday morning with three brigades of cavalry, horse artillery and mounted infantry, including several colonial contingents, in order to seize a crossing of the Modder about twenty-five miles distant.

Five Laagers Captured. Gen. French reports by despatch, dated 5.35 p.m., that he has forced a passage at Clip Drift and occupied the hills north of the river, capturing three of the enemy's laagers, with their supplies; while Gen. Gordon, of the 15th Hussars, with his brigade, who had made a feint at Rondevaal Drift, four miles west, has seized it and a second drift between that and Clip Drift, together with two more laagers.

A Brilliant Performance. Gen. French's performance is brilliant, considering the excessive heat and a blinding dust storm which raged during the latter part of the day.

British Losses Small. Owing to the rapidity of his movements, Gen. French met with but slight opposition, and his losses were small. Lieut. Johnson, of the Inniskilling Dragoons, is the only officer reported seriously wounded.

Camped North of the Reit. The sixth division was last night on the north bank of the Reit, at Waterval Drift, and is moving to support the cavalry. The seventh division is here and will go on this afternoon.

Heat is Terrible. Four officers and 53 men had to be sent last evening, in the returning ox wagons, to the railway line, prostrated by heat and exhaustion.

The Boers have shown themselves too wary and too skilful for us to assume that the success of these operations must disconcert their scheme of defence, or compel them to raise the siege of Kimberley. It is possible to judge in the absence of detailed information, and good maps, the operations should be followed by strategists of the highest value.

THE PLANS FOR REPUBLIC

Important Statement Issued by the Directors to Shareholders at Montreal Yesterday.

NEW PLANS HAVE BEEN ADOPTED

Which Will Greatly Increase the Output of Gold—New Plant Going in—Sound Management.

Montreal, Feb. 14.—(Special.)—At a meeting of the directors of the Republic Consolidated Mining Company, held today, it was decided to issue the following statement to the shareholders:

To the Shareholders of the Republic Consolidated Gold Mining Co.: Gentlemen,—Your board has deemed it advisable to issue to the shareholders of this company an official statement clearly outlining its present position.

You are aware that as a result of the visit of the president, Mr. Clark, and Messrs. Ayer and McKinley, directors, to the Republic Camp in November, 1900, the 20-ton mill or reduction plant then in use was ordered to be closed.

Mr. Jackling's Report. Your board had some time previously decided to consult Mr. D. C. Jackling, cyanide expert and metallurgist, who had recently erected a plant with a capacity of a thousand tons per day for the De La Mar mines of Mercury, Utah, which is treating at a handsome profit \$8 ore.

Correctness Proved by Tests. Since that date repeated large scale tests and experiments at Republic have proved the correctness of his estimates. With these figures before us no further reason need be given for closing the old mill.

New Plant Ordered. Contracts were immediately let for the supply of the necessary plant and material. Very quick deliveries were agreed upon.

The Interim Dividends. To provide for the payment of dividends during the interim the company decided to ship a quantity of high-grade ore to the smelters, and having secured a favorable rate from the Trail smelter, arrangements were made to haul the ore to that point and ship by C.P.R.

Republic Mine's Official Condition. We would ask your most careful attention to the following statement of the Republic mine, which shows its thorough soundness. The mine has no reserves blocked out sufficient to justify extraction for several years to come.

The Next Three Dividends. Taking into consideration the condition forth above, and knowing that the increased earnings of the new mill will speedily repay any advances made, we would have you have this day decided that the next three dividends will be declared quarterly.
