Winnipeg, May 13.—(Special.)—D. W. Bole, a prominent Liberal, one of Winnipeg's delegates sent to Ottawa to oppose the railway deal, has returned from his visit. In an interview today Mr. Bole spoke very modestly, so far as the efforts of the delegates and the Parliamentary representatives from Manitoba opposing the deal were concerned. "We see more clearly what the deal is," he said, "and we know that if it passes we, more than any other part of the country, will feel its harmful effects, and we are only doing our duty in opposing it with all the strength we possess. But the people of this province should never forget the services rendered by Bourassa and Charlton and the other faithful few who have taken up the fight so eagerly in our behalf. Charlton has been doing his best, and he is entitled to the credit of having secured the agreement of the Government and Opposition leaders in keeping their support throughout the debate on Monday was simply a masterpiece. "Do you think there is a chance of the bill being defeated?" "There is, of course, the chance of talking it out."

REMOVAL OF MGR. FALCONIO

Canadian Catholics Found Fault With the Vatican—The Matter May Be Arranged

Montreal, May 13.—Special cable from London says: The Rome correspondent of The Daily Chronicle, who is a recognized authority on news from the Vatican, telegraphs to that paper today an explanation of the reasons for the coming transfer of Monsignor Falconio from Ottawa to Washington. Some complaint had been made from Canada that the Catholic of the Dominion were dissatisfied at being deprived of special representation by a Papal delegate, and the correspondent states that this reported opposition of Canadian Catholics to the suppression of the Papal delegate there has surprised the Vatican. The sole reason of the change was purely to effect an economy, owing to the fact that the state of the Pontifical budget at the present time necessitates a reduction of the number of delegates.

It is acknowledged in Rome, however, that the Canadian Catholics are the more aggrieved by the change, as they have recently acquired a special palace at Ottawa for the delectable residence.

It seems that the Vatican acted without having first obtained sufficient information. Monsignor Falconio will not leave Washington for a year or so, it is said that the matter may yet be arranged to the satisfaction of Canadian Catholics, who have been disappointed at the removal of the Papal delegate there has surprised the Vatican.

METHODIST DEACONESSES

Women Trained for the Highest Form of Christian Activity—The Graduation of the 15 trained deaconesses of the Methodist Deaconess Home last night at the Broadway Tabernacle attracted a large and interested attendance.

Rev. Dr. Toveal, chairman, congratulated the officers and supporters of the Training Home upon the success which it has achieved in alleviating suffering, protecting children from evil influences, and training young women for the highest form of Christian activity. The report of the secretary, Mrs. Price, was read by Miss Taylor. It expressed the view that the Home would soon prove to be a model for the growing requirements. The Metropolitan and several other churches have given \$500 each to support a deaconess in connection with their church, in addition to their car fare, which was an important item. The receipts for the past year had been \$23,000. The cash balance was \$39,053. Twelve thousand calls had been made since the Home was opened, and an average of 80 families a month had been relieved from want, 600 articles of clothing had been distributed. The Training School was fully occupied, and the history of the Home was one of continuous usefulness, prosperity and progress.

The report was adopted on the motion of Mrs. Phillips, seconded by Mrs. Sills. Rev. A. Brown, on behalf of the Board of Managers, warmly commended the report of the superintendent and the staff of the institution for their self-sacrificing devotion to their work. The Nominating Committee's report was moved by Mrs. Somers, seconded by Mrs. Grady. The nominating committee were: Mrs. (Dr.) Sutherland; secretary, Mrs. Phillips; treasurer, Mrs. (Dr.) Powell; and a large and representative General Committee and Board of Management. The report was adopted.

Miss Scott, superintendent, spoke of the seven years' work of the Home, and believed that the fruits of their work, just the hopes of those who founded it. Miss Isabella Hutton of Chicago, who has been visiting the leading Methodist Churches of the city in the interests of the deaconess movement, gave an address in the deaconess work which engaged followed out the principles of Rev. Mr. Clayton's Church, who leaves for the Old Country next Saturday, was presented with a nurse containing \$100 in gold, by the congregation last night. Mr. George Smith made the presentation. Rev. Mr. Scager replied, thanking the members of his flock for their kindness.

MRS. WHITE NOW CHARGED WITH MURDER

bury, that Mr. White was very sick. When I was leaving her I told her that Mr. White might die at any time, and that she might let me know later.

"Mrs. White called on me the day before (Saturday) and said that Mr. White had been ill that morning. She said that she was very much afraid as regards his condition. Asked as to his trouble, Mrs. White said that he was suffering from piles.

Deceased Mrs. White. In cross-examination, Dr. Marquis said he had consulted a hand-book with reference to strychnine before giving evidence at the inquest to verify his opinion. Mrs. White was very much surprised when she was asked witness by telephone to come to the house on Sunday morning. She met the doctor at the door and was excited, agitated and anxious. The patient was conscious and when he went into a convulsion, he did not prescribe any antidote for strychnine poisoning, being of the opinion that it was not strychnine. After the second spasm witness gave deceased whiskey hypocritically. When he left the house Mrs. White and Dr. Bier, who assisted Dr. Marquis in performing the post-mortem, agreed with her that she was the possessor of the strychnine.

"The Night Before." Mr. Dunlop, a boarder at Mrs. White's, testified that the prisoner and Mr. White had been separated, and that Mr. White had returned to the house shortly before his death. The separation was not particularly long, and Mrs. White had been drinking. Witness saw nothing to indicate that their relations were not pleasant. Witness saw deceased on Saturday night before his death, and he was all right then. On Sunday morning he saw White shortly after breakfast, and on returning to the house about half past 10 was told by Mrs. White that her husband was dying, and she had given him a glass of whiskey. Witness saw her husband and tea. After White died, prisoner talked with witness considerably, and said something about the honor which had been taken the night before. On Saturday night witness saw Mrs. White drinking, and that he had a bad cold.

"My Poor Man's Dead." At Sturges, said that on Saturday night deceased was in his room and had complained of shortness of breath. Witness saw him and saw that witness he was very ill. When he first saw Mrs. White she said to him: "My poor man's dead." Witness saw her showing grief.

Dr. Scherer said Mrs. White told him that her husband was restless of her, and that she was very much distressed. She opened the window, discharging a revolver in the air. Mrs. White had been drinking several times during the night, and she had been in the habit of using it. She told witness there was no one else in the house at the time, and she asked his opinion about the matter. Witness said in order that she might marry some one else.

A druggist testified to having sold a quantity of strychnine to Mrs. White. The case was then further adjourned.

TOOK IN A STRANGER.

William Britton, a hack driver, who has no particular place of abode, was captured this morning by Special Constables saldar and Hunt and locked up on a charge of theft.

Young was in Tobin's restaurant on York-street between 9 and 10 o'clock last night, when he met the prisoner Britton. The two men left the place together, and on the way Britton was robbed of his watch and his hand in Young's pocket and stole his purse, containing about \$10 in money.

Indignant Young recovered himself, and it is said, made his escape by running into the street. He reported his loss to P.C. Roberts, and subsequently Constables Snider and Hunt were called out to search for him. After the arrest was made Young visited the cells and identified Britton as the man who had robbed him.
