There is much force in this contention, it seems impossible for the present to have anything else than party government in Ontario.

International law cannot be made to include the Monroe Doctrine without an absurd exaggeration of the significance of the term.

It is not necessary, however, that every party man should tamely submit to the view of partyism that is being preached by the machine politicians.

It was a mistake on the part of the opposition at Ottawa to be drawn into the scheme of a joint committee to arrange the election of seats.

The Laurier government, in the first place, laid down a principle which makes representation by population a mere detail in the redistribution.

By its concurrence in the scheme the opposition admits of the supremacy of the principle of adherence to county boundaries and joins with the Laurier government in repudiating the principle of representation by population.

Disappointment awaits those who expect to see human nature as it is from the Gamey-Stratton case by its removal to the legislature to a judicial commission.

It is in these matters the attempt to ignore the ordinary weaknesses of human nature is bound to result in failure. Party government is founded upon rivalry, and the feeling of rivalry must always be taken into account.

BUDGET SPEECH ON APRIL 16

House Will Adjourn To-Day for Easter Holidays—Motions and Queries.

Ottawa, April 7.—(Special.)—In the House to-day the bill to incorporate the Vancouver and Port Simpson Railway Company (Macpherson) was read the first time.

The report of the Delegates Committee was presented, asking that S. Mackay of Montreal be paid \$1200 for services as a temporary translator from May 27, 1902, to April 8, 1903.

Mr. Mackay, who is a notary of Montreal, did substitute for a sick translator, but that since May 27 to April 8 he has done nothing.

Mr. Mackay's bill for \$1200 for work he never did. The report was adopted, and Mackay was dropped from the staff of translators.

Mr. Mackay moved "that from April 22 to the end of the session government orders have precedence on Wednesdays, immediately after questions put by members."

The motion was carried. Mr. Mackay announced that the budget speech would be delivered on Thursday, April 16, that is, Thursday next week.

Mr. Mackay's motion for the Easter adjournment was agreed to. The House adjourned at 6 o'clock to-morrow night for Easter. It might rise earlier, according to Mr. Mackay's motion.
