Examination for Discovery of A. E. Wallace, Made Public, Affords Interesting Reading.

Now that the examination of A. E. Wallace, manager of the defunct Atlas Loan Co. of St. Thomas, for the benefit of the liquidators, the National Trust Co., has been made public, it displays the fact that Ames & Co. to a very large extent controlled the investments.

The growth of the transactions with Ames & Co. was revealed when it was told that while in 1898 the business between them had only been \$42,000, in 1901 it had become \$7,424,500.

At the end of 1901 the Atlas Loan Co. owned Ames & Co. \$948,758.30, and Mr. Wallace said he did not know how that could have been paid if Ames & Co. had not been paid in full.
