



PEOPLE OF NOTE



Frederick Weyerhaeuser, called the head of the lumber trust, is an immensely wealthy lumberman who came to this country from Germany in 1852 and who is today the head of the Weyerhaeuser Syndicate which is said to control more square miles of timber lands than any other single power in the United States. Mr. Weyerhaeuser was born in Germany on November 21st. 1834, and when he reached the United States he settled in Pennsylvania. He remained there for six years and in 1856 he removed to Illinois. It was not until 1891 that he went to St. Paul, Minn., to reside. He is married and has a beautiful home in St. Paul.


