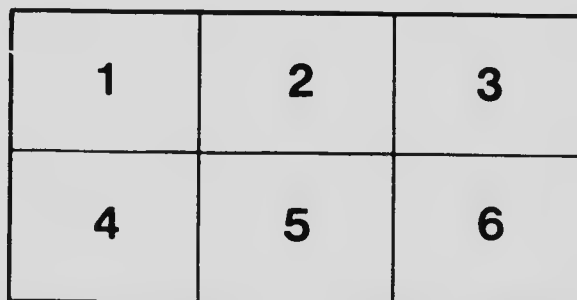

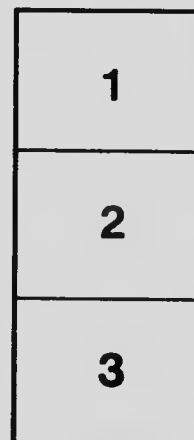

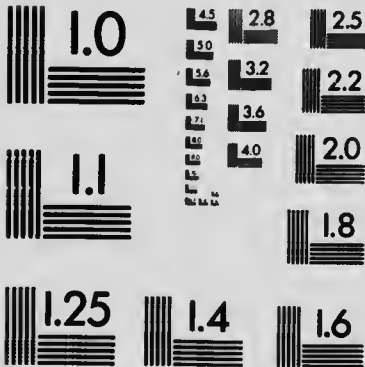

Painter of figures and Street-scenes. Born 1864. Pupil of the Academies of Amsterdam and Antwerp. Honorable mention, Paris Exhibition, 1900.

Painter of Landscapes, principally Winter scenes. Born 1850. Awarded Medals: The Hague, Amsterdam, Munich, etc. Member of the International Jury of Awards, Chicago World's Fair. Chevalier of the Order of the Eikenkroon. Is represented in the Museums of Amsterdam, The Hague, Rotterdam, Dordrecht, and in many other important collections.

His work is represented in the principal Museums of Holland and in Canadian collections.

Born 1824 at Groningen. Awarded many Medals at domestic and foreign Exhibitions, among which was the Grand Prix at the Paris Exhibition, 1900. Decorations: Knight of the Order of the Lion of the Netherlands, Officer of the Legion of Honor, Knight of the Leopold's Order of Belgium, Knight of the Franz Joseph's Order of Austria, Knight of the Crown Order of Italy. His work is represented in all of the important Public and Private Galleries of Holland and many foreign collections and Museums, also in the United States and Canada.

JOSSELIN DE JONG (DE PIETER) The Hague.

Figure and Portrait Painter. Born 1861. A fine draughtsman. Pupil of Cabanel, of Paris. Awarded: Gold Medals, Amsterdam and Munich; Silver Medal, Paris, 1900; decorated with the Order of Oranje-Nassau. Represented in Museums of Rotterdam, The Hague, Ghent, and by portraits in the Royal collections.

KEVER (JAOOB SIMON HENDRIK) Amsterdam.

Painter of Dutch Interiors and Figures out-of-door. Born 1854. Pupil of P. F. Greive. Awarded: Bronze Medal, 1889, Paris World's Fair; Gold Medal, 1896, Amsterdam; Silver Medal, 1900, Paris; Silver Medal, 1893, Chicago; Gold Medal, 1899, Amsterdam. Largely represented in American collections and in Canada.

His work is of international fame and found in public and all important private Galleries in Europe, United States and Canada.

Painter of Harbor Views and River Scenes. Born 1875. Awarded: Prize, Rijks Academy, Rotterdam, 1898; Honorable Mention, Paris, 1900. Represented in the Walker Gallery, Liverpool, and in many private and public collections.

One of the most famous Painters of Dutch Interiors, with Figures. Born 1846. Studied at Academy, Rotterdam. Awarded 5 Gold Medals. Represented in many collections of Holland, America and England.

MESDAQ (HENDRIK WILLEM) The Hague.

Greatest Marine Painter of the age. Pupil of Alma Tadema and W. Roelofs.
