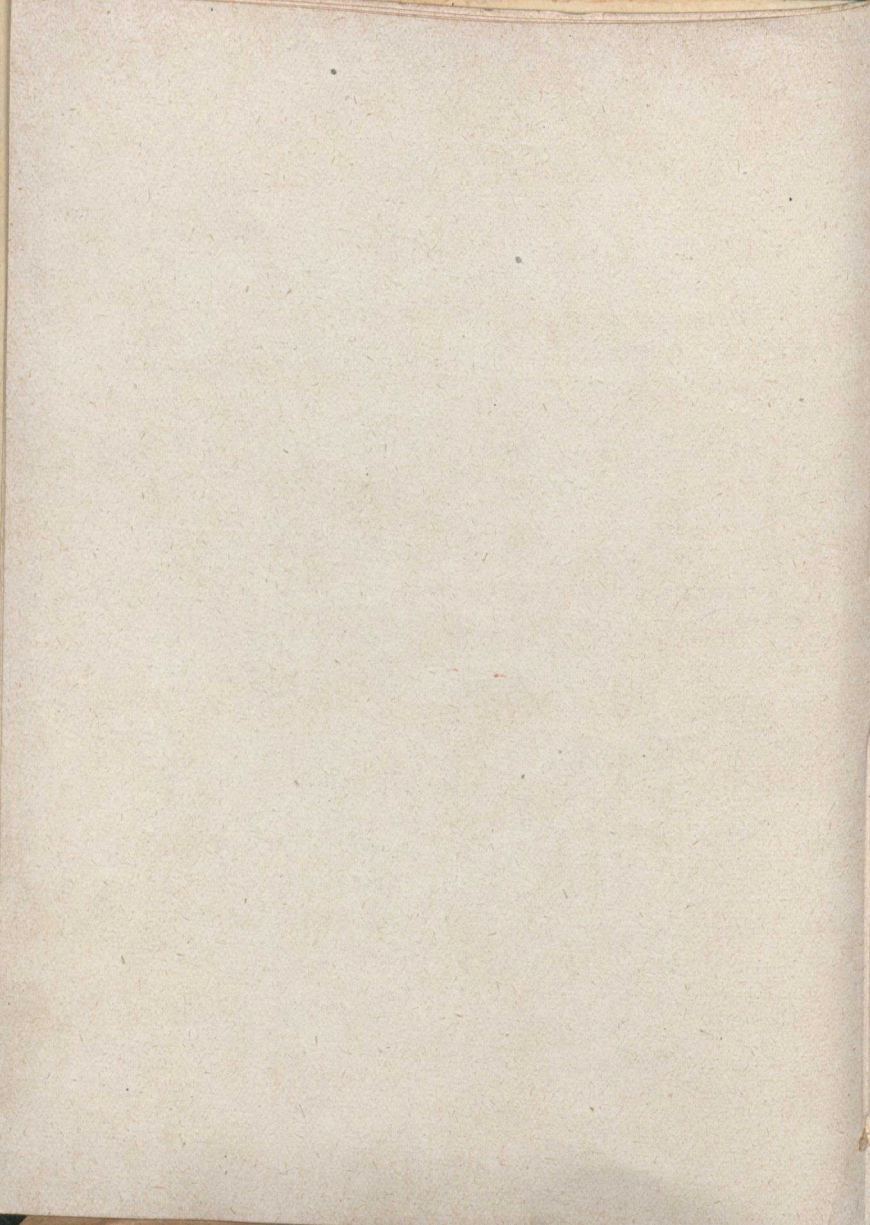
PREFACE.

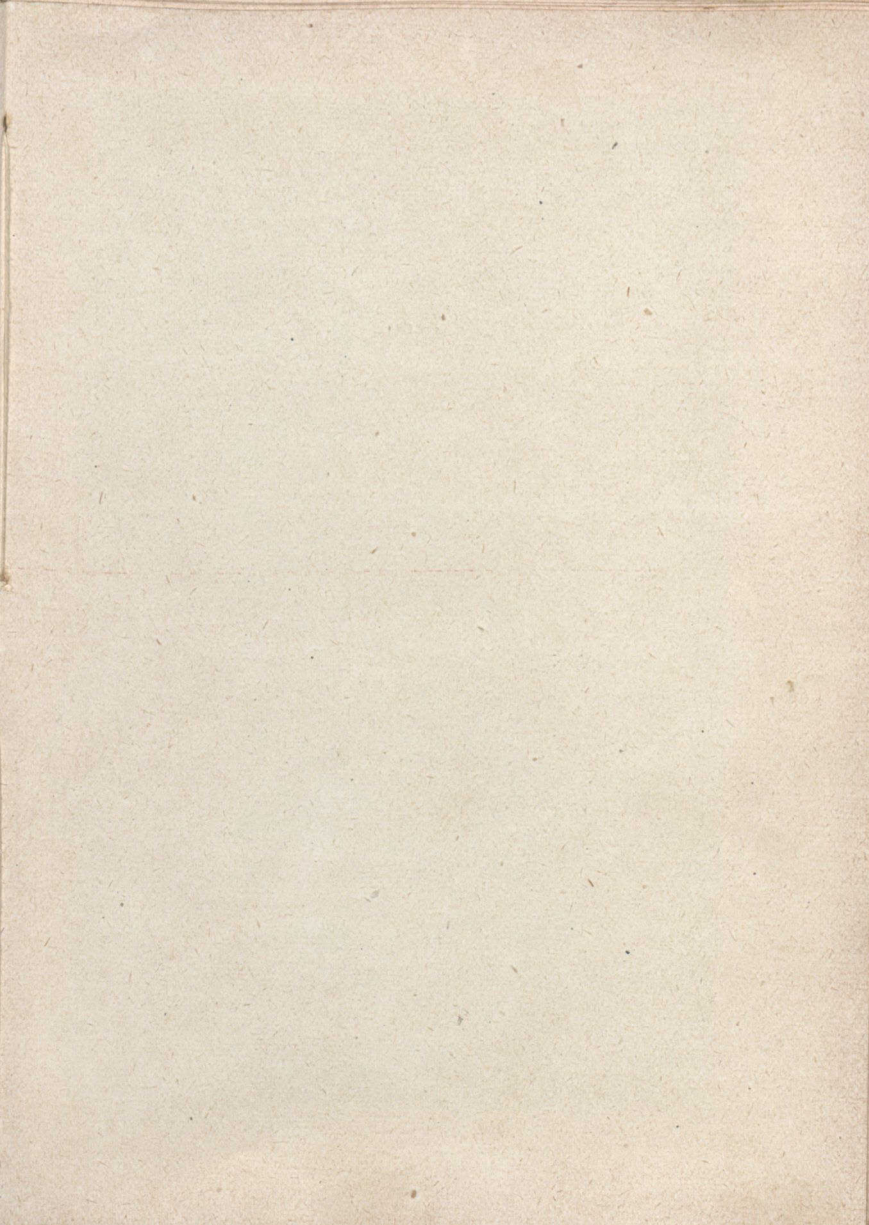

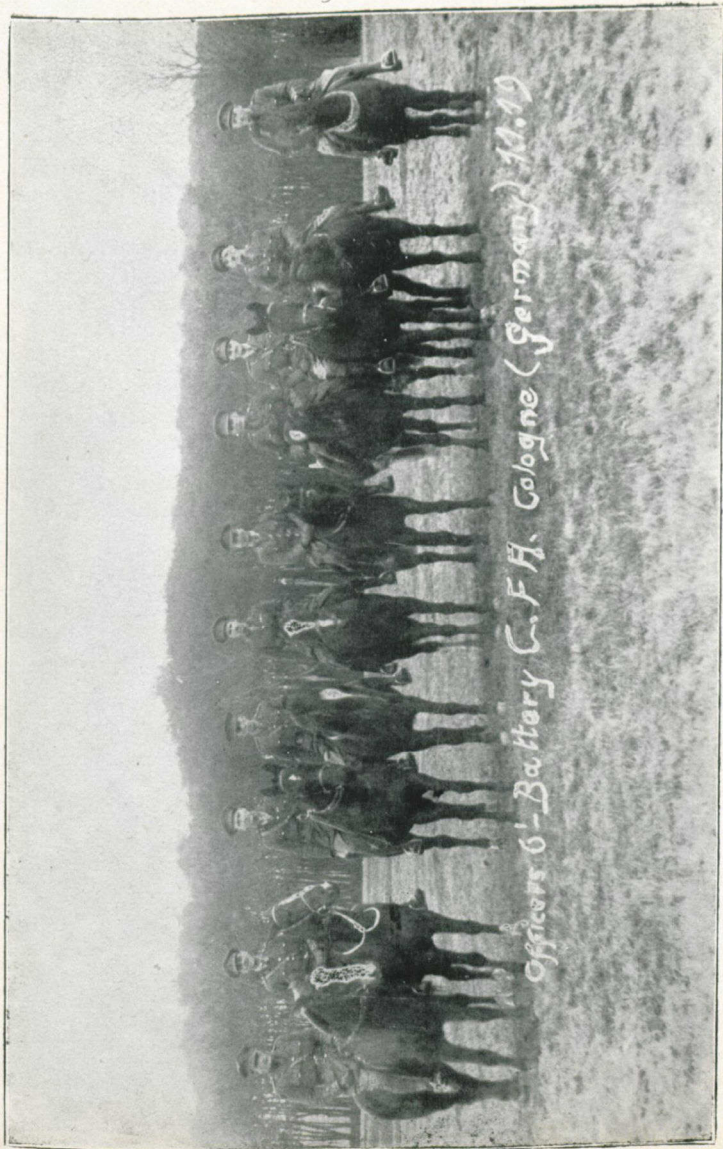
Did you ever sit on the battery phone

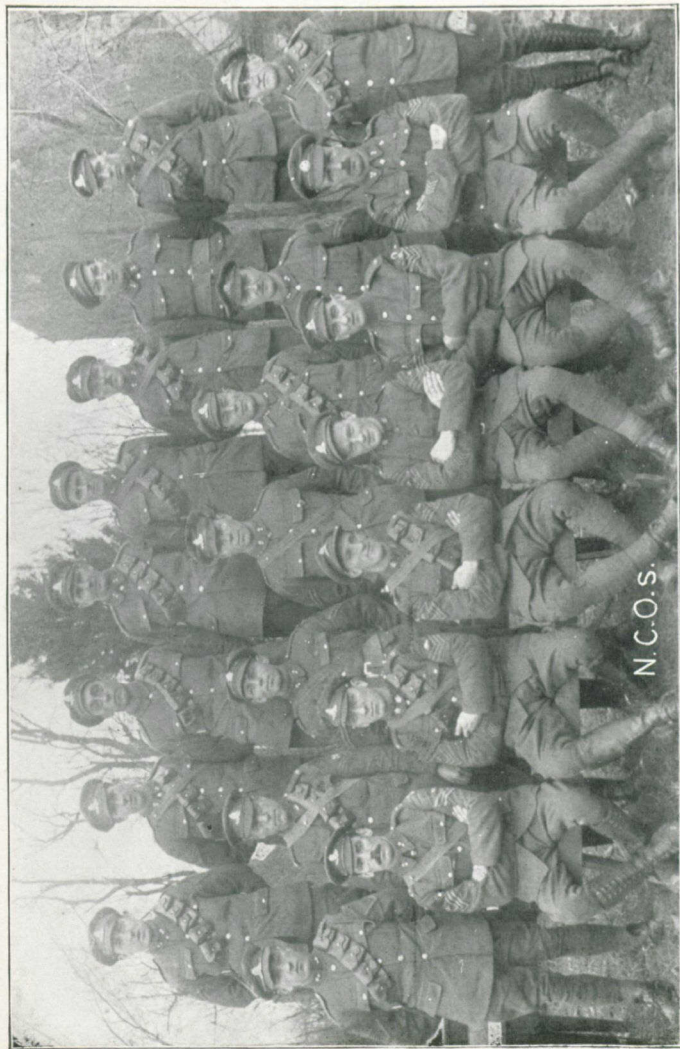
These are a few, just a few sensations

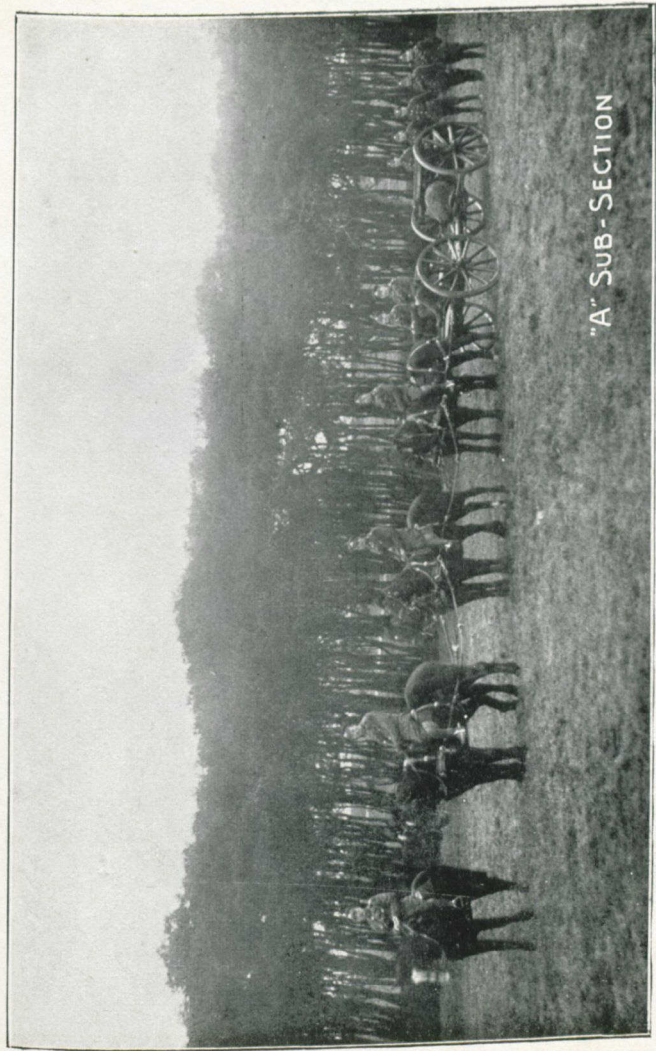




Officers 6<sup>th</sup> Battery C.F.H. Cologne (Germany) 1919

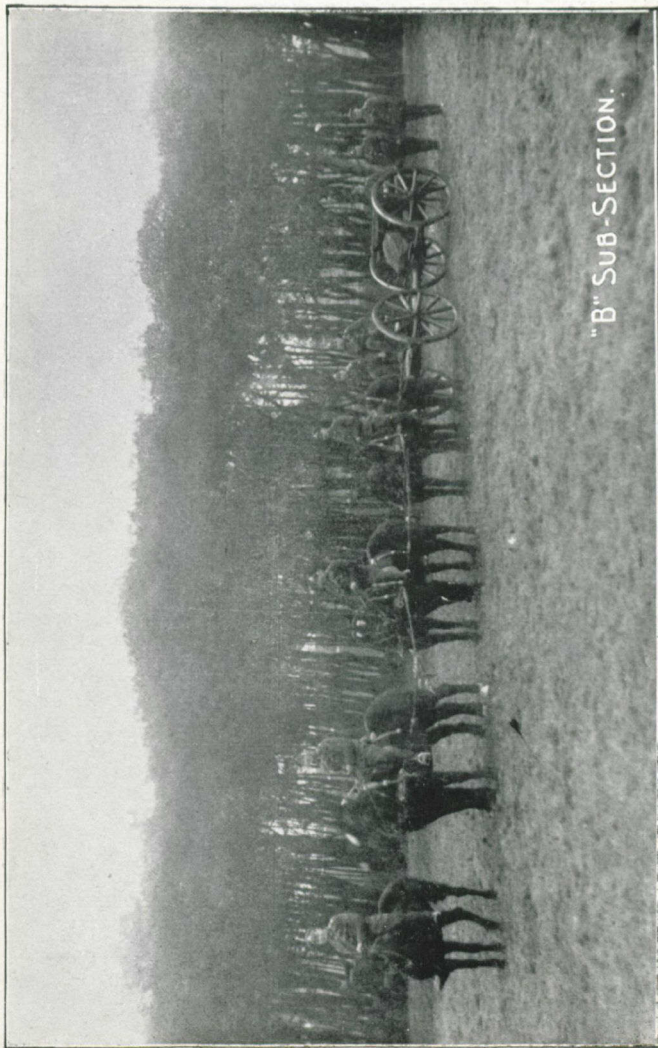
