THE ROYAL VISIT.


What will certainly prove one of the important events of the opening of the new century in Canadian history is the visit of the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York to Canada in the fall of the first year of the century. From ocean to ocean the journey of the Royal party was one series of magnificent successes, the enthusiasm of the Canadian people at every point knowing no bounds. The Royal train on which the Royal party travelled Canada, and on which they necessarily lived a large part of the time, proved a specific attraction of the entire trip. Everyone wanted to see the Royal train. This was not possible for everyone,

but that a very clear conception of the magnificence of the train might be possessed by Canadians generally, we have prepared the present pictorial souvenir of the Royal visit.

Throughout these pages will be found very fine illustrations of the exterior and interior of the train, and along with these a beautiful interior view of the magnificent palace steamer "Empress of India," on which their Royal Highnesses took passage from Victoria to Vancouver and return. The souvenir is prefaced with fine illustrations of the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York themselves. 




PRIVATE DINING ROOM, DAY COACH "CORNWALL,"

A unique telephone system connects with all sections of the Royal train.




THE DINING CAR "SANDRINGHAM," WHICH IS SHOWN IN THIS VIEW,
