LOOKING AT THINGS UNSEEN. A Rochester Divine Tells How it is Done—The Marvellous Results.

Members of Elm-street Methodist Church, ministers, laymen, numbers at the anniversary services of this historic church. They were delighted with the unaccounted-for Rev. Dr. Hayes of Rochester, a man in the prime of life, of medium height, with bushy dark hair, smart mustache and an agreeable style of speaking.

Rev. Dr. Galbraith, the pastor, took a share in the services, and pleaded that the liberality of the congregation might reach \$300, a sum the trustees are anxious to raise for pressing needs.

Dr. Hayes' morning discourse was based on St. Paul's words in II. Cor. iv. 17. For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory.

18. While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are eternal.

The preacher dealt with the temptation to regard this world as the only one, and the only real things those which can be seen and handled. How illustrious these views are he showed by reference to the disappearance of the great works of ancient architecture.

It was the same with the churches of the one-time, old familiar faces. The rule held good also in commercial and political affairs, and even in the very "O" for the touch of a vanished hand, and the sound of a voice that is no more.

Turning to the second division of his subject, "looking at things which are not seen," he showed that it was not incongruous as might be supposed. He instanced as potent, though unseen, low, electricity, sympathy, and even telepathy, patriotic, tidal waves of emotion.

How unseen things have influenced and stimulated great souls in every age Dr. Hayes admirably showed, the chief biblical characters instanced being Moses, Daniel, Paul and Stephen.

In pleading later for a big collection the Doctor said: "When a man is urged to give, he is urged to the bottom of his pocket, he will regard his banking account as a contract with the Lord."

In the evening the sermon was more especially for young people. The subject was "Life-Saving Principles." This evening in the same church Dr. Hayes gave his position on "Great Women and Their Husbands."
