Tonawanda, N.Y., Sept. 27.—The tornado which wrought such terrible havoc across the border in St. Catharines and Merrittion, struck this city with terrible force at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon. The amount of damage done will exceed \$100,000. Many people are homeless, and several are now under the care of physicians as a result of injuries sustained during the brief visit of the wind.

The Country Suffers.

St. Catharines, Ont., Sept. 27.—In addition to the list of damage and accidents at Merrittion, as recorded last night, a number of other persons were injured. When the roof of the Lincoln mill gave way, in the rush of employees to reach a place of safety, Miss M. Elliott of the mill was struck by a beam from the top of the stairs to the next floor and narrowly escaped being trampled to death.


