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MEMORANDA.

The Weekly Prayer Meeting of the Congregation is held every Wednesday evening, at 7½ o'clock, in the Basement.

The Sabbath School Teachers' Meeting is held on the first Monday evening of every month, at 7½ o'clock, in the Bible Class Room.

Stated Meetings of the Session are held on the first Tuesday in every month, at 4 o'clock p. m., in the Vestry.

The Deacons' Court and Managing Committee meet in the Committee Room on the second Tuesday evening of every month, at 7½ o'clock.

The Sabbath School meets every Sabbath in the Basement, at 2½ p. m. Bible Class meets in the Lecture Room, at 2½ p. m.

The Ordinance of the Lord's Supper is dispensed on the first Sabbath of February, June and October.

The Ordinance of Baptism is dispensed on the first Wednesday evening of every month, at the Prayer Meeting, in the Basement.

When Members change their residences, information should be given to the Pastor or the Elder of their District, also to the Elder into whose District they have gone.

Pew holders leaving the bounds, or giving up their pews or sittings, are requested to give timely notice to the Pew Secretary, in order that the pews to be vacated may be re-let to others. Pew rents are payable quarterly, in advance, and due as follows :

- 1st Quarter, to be paid first week of January.
- 2nd " to be paid first week of April.
- 3rd " to be paid first week of July.
- 4th " to be paid first week of October.

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NINETEENTH ANNUAL
REPORT
OF THE
Deacons' Court & Managing Committee
OF
ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, LONDON, ONT.,
FOR THE YEAR 1869.

The last Annual Report of the Managing Committee was presented on the 25th January, 1869, in the old frame church, which had been occupied by the congregation since 1843. This year we are privileged in the good Providence of God to submit our usual Annual Report in this our new, handsome, and commodious place of worship, which is now nearly finished, without any serious accident having happened to any person engaged at the work. God has thus far blessed our efforts, and we hope our successors in office, and the congregation, will not relax their diligence and liberality until this Edifice can be presented as a free, unfettered and holy offering unto the Lord.

The important event in the history of the congregation, of removing from the old to our new church, was an occasion

which called to remembrance the pleasures and sorrows, hopes and joys, difficulties and trials, experienced by the congregation since its organization, and the last Sabbath in the old church, being also our Communion Sabbath, will long be remembered by many. At the close of the services of that day, it was found very hard to leave the old church for the last time, on account of the many interesting associations connected with it. Many of those who took an active part in its erection, and who, since it was built, occupied its pews, are gone to their reward, and we hope are now inheriting the promises. Short as the time has been since it was agreed to erect our new church, several of those who, in heartily subscribing towards the building fund, assisted by their means in the erection of the new Edifice, and who looked forward with hope and pleasure to the privilege of hearing the Gospel preached and of worshipping within its walls, were called from time to eternity before the church was opened. There are, however, some who assisted in the erection of the old church who have been spared to be with us at the opening of the new Edifice. They can look back with praise and gratitude to God for His goodness and mercy towards the congregation during the past, and look forward to the future with hope and confidence. God has helped and prospered us in the past, let us humble ourselves before Him, and trust, fear and serve Him more faithfully in the future. And having now suitable accommodation for carrying on the Lord's work, let our prayer be that within the walls of our new place of worship many may be brought to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ our Lord.

The new church, as the congregation is aware, was opened on Sabbath, the 31st Oct. last, the Rev. Dr. Ormiston preaching in the morning and evening, and the Rev. D. Inglis in

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the afternoon—the church being crowded at each of the services. The collections at the three services amounted to \$516.70. There were also slips, or due bills, put into the plates, amounting to \$219. The names of said subscribers have been entered on the Subscription Book, and the money will be accounted for with the other subscriptions to the Building Fund. On Monday evening, Nov. 1st, there was a very largely attended social meeting held. The refreshments were served in the basement, and afterwards addresses were delivered in the church by Rev. Dr. Ormiston, Rev. D. Inglis, our Pastor, and Alex. McKenzie, Esq., M.P. The Rev. Mr. Innes, of the Church of England, also took part in the proceedings by opening the meeting with prayer, and nearly all the ministers in the city, and several from a distance, were present, giving their countenance and support to the congregation on this interesting occasion. The nett proceeds of the social meeting was \$483.34. The total amount received from opening services was as follows:

The congregation are under great obligations to the Rev. Dr. Ormiston and Rev. D. Inglis, for the able and valuable assistance given on that occasion.

The old churches being no longer required for the use of the congregation, were disposed of as follows: The large church was sold for \$300, cash; and the Gaelic Church, with the thirty-five feet of land on which it stands, was sold at auction for \$670— $\frac{1}{3}$ cash, the balance in three annual instalments.

Since last year's Report was presented, the tender of \$400 for heating, by Messrs. Millar, and also the tender of \$500

for fresco work, by Mr. D. H. Krueger, were accepted. The outlay for fresco work was entered into in order to give a pleasing, attractive and finished appearance to the inside of the church, and the design and execution of the work does credit to Mr. Krueger, the artist.

The basement of the church has also been laid out and arranged with a large lecture room, rooms for Bible and infant classes, a library and committee room, and also a vestry room, and all seated and furnished with every convenience required for the carrying on with efficiency the important work committed to the congregation to discharge.

The vestibule and all the aisles of the church have been covered with matting; the pulpit stairs and platform with carpet, and the pulpit trimmed with French plush, the aim of your Committee being to have the whole work, furniture and furnishing, of the most approved and durable kind. The mattings, carpets, pulpit trimmings, &c., were purchased in Montreal, expressly for the church, at the lowest wholesale cash price, the only additional charge being the freight from Montreal. In furnishing the church, your Committee had the valuable assistance of the ladies of the congregation, who raised from members of the church and other friends the sum of \$212 70, which they paid over to the Treasurer of the Building Fund to aid in furnishing the church. The ladies also rendered very important services in the whole work connected with the opening of the church, and social meetings, and are entitled to the hearty thanks of the congregation.

Your Committee think it proper to mention here, in connexion with the furnishing of the new church, the following presents made to the congregation: From Mr. Joseph Atkinson, merchant, through the session, a costly and elegant

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Communion Service, consisting of a flagon, six cups and six plates, with the name of the congregation inscribed on each of the vessels ; from Mr. John Wilson, cabinet-maker, a handsome arm chair for the platform in front of the pulpit ; and from Mr. John Ferguson, upholsterer, the trimming and part of the furnishing material of the pulpit. There yet remains to be finished of the contract work, the porch on the east side, and a few other small items. The porch referred to could not be built last Fall, in consequence of the old church being in the way ; but will be finished early in the Spring. Your Committee regret that the west porch, so much required for the convenience of the congregation, cannot at present be used, in consequence of it being so near the Manse, for if opened, with entrance to Waterloo-St., it would interfere with the ground and conveniences connected with the Manse to such an extent as to make it unfit to be occupied by our Pastor. While the Manse remains in its present position, it will be in the way of laying out the ground, and will also interfere very much with the convenience of the congregation, and it may be found advisable to take steps to remove the Manse from its present position, and to erect another on some more suitable part of the church ground. Your Committee would recommend that early in the Spring the portion of ground intended to be kept for the use of the congregation should be levelled and enclosed with a good and substantial fence, and planted with trees, and the part of the church ground bounded by Duke Street be laid out in lots and sold as early as a satisfactory price can be got for them, to assist in paying off the debt on the new church.

The sheds in rear of the church having now become old, dilapidated, and almost useless, it will be necessary to consider if new sheds will be required ; and if so the most con-

venient kind to erect, and the best way to raise the amount required for that improvement.

During the progress of the work, many things were suggested that necessitated alterations. It would be useless to give unnecessary details; suffice it to say that every thing brought before the notice of the Committee that was required, either for the security, comfort, or adornment of the building was fully considered, and, if thought an improvement, was carried out; and your Committee trust that the funds placed at their disposal will be considered as having been well expended.

In consequence of the lamented death of Mr. Wm. Elliott, one of the contractors, more than his own proper share of the work and responsibility was thrown on the other contractor, Mr. D. Denham, and your Committee have much pleasure in testifying to the honourable and faithful manner in which Mr. Denham carried out the contract.

The books of the Treasurer, Mr. Wm. Begg, have been audited and found correct, and a certified abstract of his account will be found annexed to the Report.

The books of the Treasurer to the Building Fund, Mr. Alex. McIntosh, have also been audited, and a certified abstract of the receipts and disbursements will also be found annexed to this Report. And your Committee being anxious to give a full account of all the money received, a list of the names of subscribers to the Building Fund and the amount paid by each up to the 20th January, 1870, will also be found annexed.

Your Committee reported last annual meeting that \$6000 had been borrowed to assist in paying the contractors, and they have now to report that during the progress of the work there has been necessity for borrowing \$6,000 more, in all \$12,000, one thousand dollars of which has lately been paid. The amount now borrowed being \$11,000; and although the

bank is willing to accomodate us, yet your Committee think it would be advisable to make arrangements for a more permanent loan on the security of the church property, until the congregation be in a position to make some effort to clear off the debt; and as the yearly interest on the borrowed money will be a heavy item, to meet this and other incidental expenses, it will be necessary to continue the quarterly collections in aid of the Building Fund during the year. Your Committee are happy to report that a large number of the subscribers to the Building Fund came voluntarily forward to the assistance of the Committee, and paid up their subscriptions in full long before due, but there yet remains on the subscription book to be paid on or before April 1, the sum of \$2,567. If all would make an effort to pay at once, it would save interest and trouble of collecting, and assist very much in arranging our finances; and your Committee hope that all the pew-holders and other friends who intend to aid the Building Fund, but have not yet done so, will now come forward and assist as the Lord hath prospered them.

Your Committee are happy to report that the demand for family pews and sittings in our new church is more than was anticipated. There are now about nine hundred sittings let and a great many more pews and sittings might have been let had they been attainable in choice parts of the church. Your Committee have to express their regret that although they have endeavored to do the best they could to arrange and allot the pews and sittings in a fair and impartial manner, yet in a few cases parties have been disappointed in not obtaining pews or sittings where they expected. Your committee hope that time will enable their successors in office so to arrange matters as to satisfy all, and correct by degrees any mistakes made and disappointments experienced.

During the past year our esteemed pastor's health has

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continued very much improved, so that with the exception of the three months that Mr. Battersby laboured with much acceptance amongst us, the whole of the pastoral duties were discharged by himself; but your committee are satisfied that his strength is not sufficient for the discharge of the whole duties connected with our large and increasing congregation, and, as stated in last year's Report, would be glad if some suitable arrangement could be made that would relieve him of part of his heavy and responsible duties.

In accordance with the rules of the Congregation, six managers retire annually. Those whose term of office now expires are Daniel Lester, John Tytler, James Gillean, John Ross, Duff Cameron, and J. G. McIntosh.

All of which is respectfully submitted on behalf of the Deacons' Court and Managing Committee.

REPORT OF SABBATH SCHOOLS

In Connection with St. Andrew's Congregation.

The Sabbath School organization of the Church, comprises the Central School, and four Branch Schools, two of which are in the Township of Westminster, one in the Gore of London, and one in Petersville.

THE CENTRAL SCHOOL

meets in the Basement of the Church, at half-past two P. M. every Sabbath Day, excepting those on which the ordinance, of the Lord's Supper is administered. In the year ending December, 1869, the number of Teachers on the roll was 28, males, 13; females, 15. Number of scholars on the roll, 282. Boys, 114; Girls, 168. Average attendance during the year, Boys, 70; Girls, 84. The Library of the School contains about 320 volumes, which are circulated among the scholars every two weeks, the boys being supplied one Sabbath and the girls the following. The scholars are regularly supplied with the *Sunday School Visitor*. In connection with the Sabbath School, Rev. J. Scott conducts a Bible Class, having on the roll 19 young men, and 30 young women. The average attendance being 14 young men, and 20 young women.

The Superintendents and Teachers of the various schools meet on the first Monday of each month, for the transaction of business; and on the first Monday of December, to receive reports, appropriate surplus funds, and elect officers. At the last Annual Meeting, the following were appointed

THE HAMILTON ROAD BRANCH SCHOOL

is under the superintendence of Mr. H. E. Nelles, who has the assistance of four female teachers. The average attendance of scholars for the past year has been a little over 40. Number of volumes in library about 80. Amount paid to general Treasurer for the year, \$13.41. The scholars are supplied with S. S. papers regularly.

THE PETERSVILLE BRANCH SCHOOL

is under the superintendence of Messrs. Tytler and Cooper. Number of teachers, 7; number of scholars on roll, 62. Average attendance, 41. Number of volumes in library, 175. Amount paid to Treasurer during the year, \$17.17, including donation from Mrs. Wm. Kent.

MR. DODD'S BRANCH SCHOOL,

in the township of Westminster, is conducted by Mr. Dodd, who has the assistance of one male and four female teachers. Number of scholars on the roll, 63. Boys, 27; Girls, 36. Average attendance, 39. Number of volumes in library, 244; copies of the S. S. paper are given to the scholars. The collections during the year amounted to \$22.62. This school, although in connection with St. Andrew's congregation, is self-sustaining.

MR. DIPROSE'S BRANCH SCHOOL,

also in the township of Westminster, is conducted under the superintendence of Mr. Diprose. Average attendance during the year about 25 scholars, the library and S. S. paper being supplied by the Central School.
