I. SEDERUNT.

HAMILTON, TUESDAY,

June 6, 1854, 7 o'clock, P. M.

The Synod of the United Presbyterian Church in Canada, met, and, after sermon by the Rev. William Barrie, the Moderator, from Eph. i. 22, 23, and Col. i. 18, first clause, was constituted.

The Presbytery of London reported that they had ordained Mr. William Deas to the office of the Ministry, and to the pastoral charge of the United Presbyterian Congregations of Adelaide and Warwick, on the 7th of September, 1853; that they had ordained Mr. Matthew Barr over the Congregation of McKillop, on the 14th February, 1854; that they had ordained Mr. James A. Devine over the Congregation in Goderich, on the 10th of May, 1854; and that they had accepted the Rev. Mr. McLellan's demission of the charge of the Congregation in Detroit, on the 10th of May, 1854.

The Presbytery of Flamboro' reported that on the 6th of June, 1854, they had dissolved the pastoral connexion between the Rev. J. F. A. S. Fayette, and the Congregation of Ancaster West; that they also, on the same day, had dissolved the pastoral connexion between the Rev. John McClure, and the Congregation of St. Catherines; and that, on the same day, they had united the Congregations of Ancaster East and Ancaster West into one pastoral charge.

Minutes of the Synod of the

Report of Toronto Presbytery

The Presbytery of Toronto reported that they had organized the Second United Presbyterian Congregation in Toronto on the 23rd of June last; that they had inducted the Rev. John Taylor to the pastoral charge of the said Second United Presbyterian Congregation on the 23rd of November; that they had received the Rev. William Dickson's demission of the pastoral charge of the United Presbyterian Congregations of Albion and Vaughan, on the 7th of February, 1854; that they had also received the Rev. Thomas Dickson's demission of the pastoral charge of the United Presbyterian Congregation of Caledon, on the 9th of May, 1854; and that the names of the Rev. William Dickson and of the Rev. Thomas Dickson had been taken from the Roll of Presbytery; and lastly, that on the 9th of May last they had organized the Congregations of Dunbarton and Canton.

Canada East Presbytery Report.

The Presbytery of Canada East reported that since last meeting of Synod they had inducted the Rev. Alexander Stuart into the pastoral charge of the Congregation of Hemmingford; and that they had accepted the Rev. Peter D. Muir's demission of the pastoral charge of the Congregation of Huntingdon.

Durham Presbytery Report.

The Presbytery of Durham reported that on the 29th of June last they had ordained Mr. John Scott to the pastoral charge of the Congregation of Ernestown and Fredrickburgh; that on the 14th of July they had ordained Mr. Gilbert Tweedie to the pastoral charge of the Congregations of Lindsay, Verulam, and Mariposa; and that on the 4th of April they had accepted the Rev. Alexander Kennedy's demission of the pastoral charge of the Congregation of Darlington; and that the name of Mr. Kennedy had been taken from the Roll of Presbytery.

Roll completed

The Roll of Synod was now compiled from the Rolls furnished by the Clerks of the several Presbyteries, and being completed, was called and marked.

Moderator chosen.

Proceeded to make choice of a Moderator, when the Rev. Professor Taylor was proposed by Mr. Skinner, seconded by Dr. Ferrier.

The Rev. James Dick was nominated by the Rev. John Fraser, seconded by Mr. Thornton.

The Rev. John Morrison was proposed by Mr. Aitken, seconded by Dr. William Taylor.

On the vote being taken, Professor Taylor was elected by a majority, but he respectfully declined the appointment, and thereupon another vote was taken, when the Rev. James Dick was chosen Moderator, and took the chair and addressed the Synod

The Rev. Messrs. Jennings and Barrie, and Thos. Armstrong, Esq., were appointed to examine the accounts of the Synod's Treasurers. To report on Thursday at the evening Sederunt.

Reports of Presbyteries, when to be made.

Ordered—That the Reports of Presbyteries, 1, On Missionary Labour of Ministers of Supplemented Congregations; 2, On the Inspection of Students of Theology; 3, On the Report of the Committee on Supplement to Congregations whose Ministers are Superintendents of Schools, be given in at the second Sederunt on Thursday.

Reports on Theological Education and distribution of Preachers.

Ordered—That the Committee on Theological Education, and also the Committee for the Distribution of Preachers, give in their Reports at the first Sederunt on Friday.

Report of Committee of Bills & Overtures.

The Committee of Bills and Overtures gave in their report, which was read and received.

Report re-committed.

The Report was referred back to the Committee, together with the papers handed in as remaining over from last year, and they were instructed to retire immediately to consider as to the order in which those papers should be brought up, and to report as soon as possible.

Rev. Robert Monteath received.

Read testimonials from the Presbytery of Kelso of the United Presbyterian Church in Scotland, and from the Secretary of the Board of Missions, Edinburgh, to the Rev. Robert Monteath, formerly of Greenlaw. Those testimonials were highly satisfactory.

On motion Mr. Monteath was unanimously and cordially welcomed as a Minister of the United Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Bills and Overtures, Report of Committee.

The Committee of Bills and Overtures again brought up their Report, which is as follows:—

The Committee of Bills and Overtures beg leave to recommend that the papers which have been sent in to them, and which they now lay upon the Synod's table be taken up in the following order:

1. An Overture for a Committee of the whole house on the state of religion in our congregations, marked No. X. in last year's report.
2. Papers anent union with the Presbyterian Church of Canada.
3. Overture of Professor Taylor, respecting Missionaries from Scotland not sent out by the Board of Missions.
4. Application by the Rev. Martin W. Livingstone, to be received as a probationer.
5. Representation and Overture regarding the existing law of Synod on the allotment of preachers.
6. Overture by the Presbytery of Wellington anent the settlement of Probationers.
7. Overture anent Ministerial Support.
8. Representation and Petition of Mr. Thornton.
9. Overture from the Presbytery of Wellington anent Synod and Presbytery Funds.
10. Mr. Coult's complaint against Mr. Jennings.
11. Mr. Jennings' complaint against Mr. Coult's.

Resolved--To recommend that the papers marked "Words" be laid aside.

The Report and recommendations of the Committee, as above, Report adopted were unanimously adopted.

The Rev. Messrs. Monteath, McClure, and Fayette, were invited to correspond to take their seats in Synod during this meeting.

Took up the Overture for a Committee of the whole House, on the state of Religion in our congregations: whereupon the Synod resolved itself into a Committee of the whole--Mr. Caw in the chair.

After sitting some time, the Committee of the whole rose. The Moderator took the chair. The Chairman of the Committee of the whole, rose to sit again, at the mid-day Sederunt to-morrow. Leave was granted.

Read Overtures from the Presbytery of Brant, and from the congregation of Hamilton, recommending that the Synod should take such steps as may seem right and expedient, towards attaining a union between the Presbyterian Church of Canada and the United Presbyterian Church in Canada. Read also petitions from the Sessions and Congregations of Bethel, English Settlement, Warrensville and Bayfield, praying the Synod to take the same subject into their serious consideration.

The hour of noon having arrived, the Synod adjourned, to meet at Two o'clock P. M.

Closed with prayer.

III. SEDERUNT.

HAMILTON, WEDNESDAY,  
June 7, 1851, 2 o'clock, P. M.

The Synod met, and was constituted by the Rev. Mr. Dick, Moderator.

The Roll was called and marked, and the Minutes of last Sederunt were read, and being corrected, were sustained.

Entered upon the consideration of the question of union with the Presbyterian Church of Canada, brought under the notice of the Synod by the papers, read at the end of the last Sederunt.

Motions on

It was moved by Professor Taylor, and seconded by Dr. William Taylor:—

That the Synod agree to appoint a small Committee to draft a Minute, expressive of the sense of the Court, on this interesting and important subject, to be presented at the first Sederunt to-morrow.

It was moved in amendment by Mr. Torrance, seconded by Mr. Rodgers:—

That this Synod express their hearty concurrence with the subject and tenor of these petitions, and desire to record the fact that, they do not give such prominence to their distinctive principles as to prevent a union with the Presbyterian Church of Canada, and appoint a Committee to meet with any Committee that may be appointed by them, to consider the propriety of said Union.

The amendment of Mr. Torrance being first put; was lost, when the motion of Professor Taylor being put to vote, was carried by a large majority, and the Synod resolved in terms of the motion.

Canon Committee to draft minute on, appointed.

The Moderator then appointed the Rev. Professor Taylor, Dr. William Taylor, Mr. Aitken, and Mr. Cavan, Ministers, together with Messrs. Thomas Armstrong, Alexander Smith, and John Keith, Elders, a Committee to draft a Minute on this subject. Report to be given in at first Sederunt to-morrow. Professor Taylor, Convener.

Reception of U. P. Ministers not from Mission Board.

Entered upon the consideration of an Overture from Dr. John Taylor, as to the reception of Ministers and Preachers, of the United Presbyterian Church in Scotland, coming to Canada without the sanction of the Mission Board.

Reception of U. P. Ministers, Re. Resolved:—

On motion of Mr. Jennings, seconded by Mr. Aitken, it was

Resolved:— That Presbyteries, Presbytery Clerks, and Ministers, be enjoined, in all cases, to give no appointments to any preacher or Minister coming from the United Presbyterian Church in Scotland, not through the Mission Board, till all necessary documents be produced, and approved, and said Minister or Preacher be fully recognized by a Presbytery, or by the Synod, as the case may be, but that in all other respects, the present law for the reception of Preachers, remain intact.

Adjourned to meet at 7 o'clock, P. M.

Closed with the benediction.

An extract from the Minutes of the Session of the Second United Presbyterian Congregation of Toronto was handed in, certifying that on the 5th instant, they had appointed Mr. Alexander Gemmell, Synod Elder, instead of the Rev. Charles Fletcher.

It was agreed that the name of Mr. Gemmell be substituted in the Synod Roll, for that of Mr. Fletcher, but that this action shall not be held as a precedent.

Read an application from the Rev. Martin W. Livingstone, formerly of Mill Hill, Musselburgh, Scotland, to be received as a Minister of the Church under the inspection of this Synod.

It was unanimously agreed that Mr. Livingstone be, and he is hereby received as a Minister of the United Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Took up a representation and petition from the Rev. Mr. Thornton, as to the allotment of Preachers to the different Presbyteries in proportion to their vacancies, setting forth the inconveniences and evils of the mode at present in use, for the distribution of Preachers, and making certain suggestions as to the remedy of those evils.

Distribution of Preachers, petition on.

On motion, the suggestions of Mr. Thornton's petition were unanimously adopted to the following effect:—

Resolutions on.

1. That discretionary power be granted to the respective Presbyteries to judge what extent of mission field, or how many preaching stations ought to be regarded as of equal importance with one organized, or congregated place.

2. That as an encouragement and aid in the advancement of the cause, in the respective Presbyteries, there be submitted to the Mission Committee, annually, a special account of missionary operations and results, in all cases where Presbyteries are so engaged; and that this account is not to be considered as given merely by the usual Statistical Reports.

Entered upon the consideration of an Overture from the Presbytery of Wellington anent the settlement of Probationers.

ter or Preacher, till said appointments have been fulfilled. And further, that the Committee of Distribution be instructed not to extend their appointments beyond a period of three months.

That there are, in the judgment of the Synod, no sufficient reasons for this Church and the Presbyterian Church of Canada, continuing in a state of separation; and that many great and obvious advantages might be expected, under the divine blessing, to result from their heartily uniting on sound and Scriptural principles.

3. That the Synod recollects, with satisfaction, that it formerly took some steps towards the realization of the union in question; and that though the issue was then unsuccessful, the Synod is still ready to concur in any reasonable and prudent measures that may be, at any time, proposed for the accomplishment of so desirable and important an object.

4. That, considering how much unhappy and mischievous division among Evangelical Presbyterians has been occasioned by the question respecting the power of the Civil Magistrate in matters of religion, or, in plainer terms, by the question of Ecclesiastical Establishments, the Synod takes the present opportunity of stating that the principle of this Church, in regard to that question, has always been, that it shall be matter of forbearance; and the Synod has great pleasure in reflecting that, while the principle seems just and sound in itself, it has this special excellence, that it presents a basis on which persons differing widely in their views respecting Establishments, may, nevertheless, conscientiously and honorably unite, provided none of them regard these views as of such vital and momentous importance, as to demand that they be made a term of Christian or Ministerial communion.

5. That the Synod hold out every encouragement to the congregations, Sessions and Presbyteries, under its inspection, to give expression to their sentiments on this most interesting and important matter, and exhort them earnestly to pray God that, under his blessing, the whole may terminate in what shall conduce most to the advancement of His glory, and the peace and prosperity of His Church; the Synod at the same time declaring that it will eagerly embrace the earliest opportunity that may seem to present itself, for giving practical effect to the reasonable, Scriptural and pious wishes of the people under its charge.

Called for the Reports of Presbyteries on Missionary labours performed by Ministers of congregations receiving aid from the Mission Fund. Missionary labor of supplemented Ministers. Reports of Presbyteries.

The Presbytery of Wellington reported that none of its Ministers comes under this injunction of Synod, as none of them receives aid from the Mission Fund. Wellington Presbytery.

The Presbytery of Flamboro' reported that none of the Ministers within their bounds have received any supplement of stipend during the past year, and consequently, no missionary labour has been performed on this condition. Flamboro'.

The Presbyteries of London and of Durham, reported verbally to the same effect with that of Flamboro'. London and Durham.

The Presbytery of Brant reported that, under their direction, the Rev. Robert Rodgers visited Norwichville once a month until September last; and that both on Sabbath and on week days, he preached at other stations in the vicinity, and visited the people. After the induction of Mr. Rodgers into the congregation of Norwichville, besides having supplied the congregation of Blandford on three several Sabbaths, he preached at other stations, at the rate of at least once a week. Brant.

No reports were given in by the Presbyteries of Toronto, Canada East, or Lanark.

Referring to the law of Synod enjoining Presbyteries to report to Synod on the missionary labours performed by Ministers of congregations receiving supplement, it was on motion agreed:— Missionary labor Reports to be sent to Committee of Missions.

That the last clause of the Synod's printed Minute, Section 4, and page 21 of the Session of 1852, be amended so as to read thus: And that the Presbyteries report the same to the Mission Committee, to be by them submitted to the Synod.

Called for the Reports of Presbyteries on the inspection of Students of Theology. Students Inspection of, Reports on.

The Presbytery of Wellington reported that they have had no Students under their superintendence during the past year. Wellington.

The Presbytery of Flamboro' reported that they have had one Student under their inspection—James M. Campbell—who had been lately received by them as a Student, from the Associate Synod of North America, and that they were satisfied with his diligence in his studies. Flamboro'.

The Presbytery of London reported that they have had one Student under their inspection—Mr. David Watters: that he had been examined at several meetings of Presbytery, and that he had performed all the exercises prescribed to him, to their entire satisfaction, and in a manner highly creditable to himself. London.

- Toronto. The Presbytery of Toronto reported that they have had three Students under their inspection, but as they were attending University College, Toronto, the Presbytery had but one meeting with them.
- Durham. The Presbytery of Durham reported that they have had under their care one student, Mr. William McNeillie, who has performed several exercises much to the satisfaction of the Presbytery.
- Brant The Presbytery of Brant reported that they have had one student, Robert Christie Moffat, under their inspection. He has had prescribed to him exercises, in accordance with the rules of the Church, which he has performed greatly to the satisfaction of Presbytery.
- Superintendents of Schools and supplement of stipend. Reports of Presbyteries on. Called for the Reports of Presbyteries and Sessions on the matter sent down from last Synod, in relation to granting aid from the Mission Fund, to congregations whose Ministers are in receipt of emoluments as Superintendents of Common Schools.
- Wellington The Presbytery of Wellington reported that the Sessions of Eramosa, Guelph, and Elora congregations, are of opinion that it is undesirable for Ministers to accept or hold the office of Local Superintendent of Schools, but in present circumstances, do not wish the Synod to issue any prohibition to that effect.
- Flamboro'. The Presbytery of Flamboro' reported, that they recommend to Synod to enjoin Presbyteries to see that Ministers do not engage in any business that shall interfere with the duties of their sacred office.
- Toronto. The Presbytery of Toronto reported, recommending that the Report of the Committee of Synod be adopted in the meantime, as the rule of the Church in this case. And in addition to this, the Presbytery, declaring their full conviction, that in all ordinary cases, it is of the utmost importance that Ministers confine themselves to the work of the Ministry: and considering that in this Church there is, by reason of the smallness of the remuneration afforded to Ministers, great difficulty in adhering to this principle, this Presbytery strongly recommend to the Synod, at its earliest convenience, prudently and energetically to adopt measures for increasing the minimum stipend of the Ministers of this Church.
- Brant. The Presbytery of Brant reported that, in the opinion of the Presbytery, the Report of the Committee of Synod, last year, to consider the case of Ministers receiving supplement under certain circumstances, should be adopted.

## APPENDIX.

### No. I.

#### REPORT OF THE MISSION COMMITTEE, READ AT THE MEETING OF THE U. P. SYNOD, 8th JUNE, 1854.

The proceedings of your Committee for the year which has just closed, do not present any feature of special interest or importance. All that has been done may be condensed into a brief Report, and your Committee judge it imprudent to occupy the time of this meeting by presenting anything more than a summary statement of the business they have transacted since the last meeting of Synod. During this period they have granted applications for supplement made by preachers to the amount of £127 7s. 7d.—by congregations to the amount of £223 0s. 9d.—making a total of £650 8s. 4d. In this sum there are included two items due to a Minister whose engagements with the board of Missions in Scotland entitled him to the full stipend of £100 sterling; with a sum of £15 due to one who, in consequence of family affliction, has been under the necessity of resigning his charge and removing from the Province, and a further sum of £14 17s. 2d. paid to Mr. James Frazer, who has now been employed for some years by the London Presbytery as a Catechist, and whose efforts for the spiritual instruction and impression of those among whom he is labouring seem to be acknowledged by God.

To make these payments, your Treasurer, the Rev. Mr. Christie, has drawn upon the Synod Grant for missionary purposes to the amount of £489 0s. 10d. currency, and there have been collected among the congregations of the Church in the Province, and sent in to the Treasurer of the Home Fund, Robert Christie, Esq., the sum of £215 11s. 3d. At their meeting on Tuesday, your Committee have passed applications by preachers amounting to £11 12s., and by congregations to £28 10s., which have not yet been paid, and there are other demands which have not yet been formally presented. The books of your Treasurer, then, show the following state:—

A balance remains in the hands of the Rev. Mr. Christie of £35 6s. 2d., and in the hands of Robert Christie, Esq., of £240 10s. 3d., while the former is liable for £40 2s.; at present there is no demand against the Mission Fund of the latter.

Your Committee, in obedience to the injunctions of Synod, prepared and forwarded to the Board of Missions in Scotland, a request for ten additional preachers. Before doing so, a circular was addressed to each of the Presbyteries of the Church, containing a number of questions designed to elicit as full information as possible as to the number of vacan-

cies—their local situation—their present state, with their prospects, and this was embodied in a communication which was sent off as soon as it could be got ready, to the Rev. Mr. Somerville. All the members of Synod have, we presume, seen the document as published in the *Missionary Record* for the month of October, 1853. An answer was received stating that the request had been laid before the Board at their meeting in that month, and that they had resolved to comply with it so far as in their power. When this answer was read in your Committee, they cordially and unanimously resolved to record their satisfaction with it, and instructed their Convener to convey their thanks to the Board in Scotland for the kind and Christian spirit in which the application had been received and considered. Efforts have been made, and are continuing to be made at home, to procure for the Church here the number of missionaries named, but they have been only partially successful. Five have been engaged, one of whom have already arrived. Let it be hoped, however, that those who are on the list of Probationers or completing their studies in the Hall, may be induced seriously to ponder the invitation that has been addressed to them, and to choose Canada as a field for the forth-putting of those energies which they have professedly dedicated to God, to serve Him in the Gospel of his Son.

We are happy in being able to inform the Synod of there being evidence that the care which they exercise over the weaker congregations has not been in vain, and that their kindness has not been unappreciated. A letter was addressed to the Committee, through their Convener, in the early part of the year, from the congregation of Chatham, which was one of those under the necessity of applying for supplement when they first obtained a pastor, conveying their thanks for the assistance that had been afforded them in their weakness, and stating that, in the present year they were in hopes of being able to raise £125 as stipend for their pastor, and £50 for building purposes. They remark, "As the day on which we were wont to receive pecuniary assistance from you is approaching, and as we are met to-day to transact the business of the congregation, we cannot allow so favorable an opportunity to pass without conveying to you this assurance of our heartfelt gratitude for the favors already mentioned—favours the more valuable because by means of them, under God, we have been enabled to go to the fold of Christ, and find pasture, and can say not only that we have a minister of our own, but also that we support him by our voluntary offerings."

Your Committee think it would serve a useful purpose were means taken to publish the reports, or a digest of them, which are presented by preachers to the respective Presbyteries within whose bounds they have been laboring. This would supply information as to the number and state of the vacancies which exist, and of the extent of mission field which the operations of the Church embrace: it would afford a better understanding of the position which the Church occupies in the Province—awaken a greater interest throughout all the congregations, and might lead to greater prayerfulness and liberality for the welfare of those who are without a shepherd. Were these reports forwarded by Presbyteries to the Mission Committee, they could embody as many of the facts narrated as they deemed advisable in a statement like the present—which would give it greater variety and interest to such a meeting as this—and we are certain that the Editors of both magazines would be willing to insert it in their periodicals, so that it would be diffused throughout our congregations for their instruction.

The Rev. Andrew Kennedy has written to the Committee informing them that, having succeeded in obtaining a situation which affords him the opportunity of laboring for the advancement of that cause to which his life has been hitherto devoted, he will not, in the meantime, draw upon the fund for any money in the way of salary.

Annual Statistical Reports have been received from six Presbyteries—those of Brant and Durham have not come to hand. From those which have been sent in, it appears that there are sixty “congregations,” but fourteen of these, from some cause or other, have not furnished their statistics. With the fifty-two that have reported, there are conneered thirty-six “stations”; the “average attendance” is 8260—the “numbers added” 567, and “removed” 368, giving an increase of 199, while there are on the roll of communicants in the Church 4291. In “religious classes” there are 1774, and 644 attend prayer meetings. The total number of baptisms is 541; the number of volumes in libraries 10,041; and the number of Churches 43. Congregational Debt amounts to £2132 0s. 6d., and the total income to £4684 4s. 4d., being an average to each member of almost £1 1s. 10d., and to each hearer of about 11s. 4d. £2585 16s. have been expended upon “stipend,” and £1153 4s. 6d., on “Church Property;” £77 19s. 1½d. have been collected for the Theological Fund—£31 2s. 1d. for Synod and Presbytery Funds—£127 14s. 9½d. for the Synod’s Missions—£91 13s. 11d. for General Missions—£25 9s. 6d. as contributions to the poor, while £426 17s. 8d. fall under the heading of incidental expenses.

Your Committee refrain from instituting any comparison between these returns and those of last year, but they would call attention to the number of instances in which congregations have failed to make collections for the schemes of the Church. In one Presbytery not a single farthing has been raised for the Synod and Presbytery Funds—only two congregations of the same Presbytery have contributed to the Theological Fund: one to the Synod’s Missions, and one to General Missions. In another Presbytery the column under the heading “Theological Fund,” presents a uniform blank, while those of the other schemes have but very few entries. Most of the other Presbyteries have been more faithful; but we believe that all the circumstances should remind the Synod of the propriety of enjoining that greater attention be paid in all the congregations and vacancies of the Church to the annual collections for the different objects specified in the statistical schedules, and of stating anew that those in need of supplement forfeit their right to have it granted, unless they comply. Your Committee cannot help expressing their conviction that the fault here lies at the door of ministers, and that the people would be willing to give of their wealth for these purposes were they asked, or furnished with the opportunity to do so. All our funds require the hearty and universal liberality of our membership. Much of our Zion is, in this respect, as an uncultivated field. Were we to work the resources which are within our own power to the full extent of which they admit, we would not require to be as dependent as we are upon external aid. And the circumstances of the Church are now such, that she can afford to cast more than she has been doing into the treasury of the Lord’s house, and she needs to cast more.

We would embody in this report the suggestion that Presbytery Clerk be instructed to send to the vacancies, intimation of the periods at which collections for the schemes should be made; and farther, that vacancies as well as congregations having a pastor, be required to make returns of their statistics.

Let your Committee close with expressing their thankful acknowledgments for the prosperity with which God has already blessed the Church, and the hope that he will increase her more and more till the little one shall become a thousand, and the small one a strong nation. May the Lord hasten it in his time.

## No. II.

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION.

The Committee on Theological Education beg respectfully to present the following Report:—

They met on Tue-day, 2nd August last, when the Divinity Hall was opened by the Moderator with devotional exercises and an address. The Rev. Dr. Taylor then read an Introductory Lecture; and the Rev. Dr. Ferrier delivered an address. The students who entered were,—of the fourth year, Messrs. John Lees and John Fotheringham; of the third year, none; of the second year, Messrs. Robert C. Moffatt, William C. Bruco and Francis Tisdell, (Mr. Alex. McFaul, who entered in 1852, was prevented from attending last year by severe and protracted bodily affliction); and of the first year, Messrs. David Waters, William Ballantyne, John McNeillie, and William Fletcher, the last of whom had not been examined by a Presbytery, but was afterwards admitted by the Presbytery of Toronto. Mr. John McNaughton also joined the Hall, but only as a hearer. The Committee likewise made arrangements for the meetings of the Hall during the session, and for the accommodation of the library.

The Committee met again on Thursday, 6th October, when the two Senior Students delivered their discourses, which met with the approbation of the Committee; and the Rev. Messrs. Thornton and Dick delivered addresses. Dr. Taylor stated that the students had attended regularly during the session, had conducted themselves with propriety, and had performed to his satisfaction the exercises prescribed; that they had been examined on Dick's Lectures, from XLVIII. to LXXI. both inclusive, and on Mosheim's Church History, from the Fifth to the Tenth Century, both inclusive; that they had read critically in the Greek of the New Testament, the narratives of the chief facts and incidents contained in the Gospels; and, in the Hebrew of the Old Testament, selected passages in Genesis, beginning with the murder of Abel, and ending with the interview between Abram and Melchizedek, along with the corresponding passages in the Septuagint. Also, that the students, besides delivering a discourse, had all during the session read several critical exercises on passages prescribed to them. The Committee then proceeded to the consideration of the remit from the Synod, and agreed to the following Recommendations to Presbyteries respecting the examination of students, viz.:

“The Committee are of opinion that the standard of requirement ought to be considerably elevated; but that this ought to be done gradually and cautiously; and they beg respectfully to recommend that the following be now the *minimum* which Presbyteries should faithfully and rigidly demand, viz.:

## I.—BEFORE ADMITTANCE TO THE DIVINITY HALL.

1. *English*.—A good Education, *i. e.*, a correct knowledge of the principles of the Language; Geography; Arithmetic; and History.
2. *Latin*.—The Grammar; Cæsar's Commentaries; and Virgil's *Æneid*, Books I—II.
3. *Greek*.—The Grammar; Gospel by John; and Xenophon's *Anabasis*, Book I, Chaps. 1—6.

## II.—BEFORE ENTRANCE TO THE HALL THE SECOND YEAR.

1. *Latin*.—Calvin's Institutes, Book I. Chaps. 1—5; and Cicero's *de Amicitia*.

5. *Mathematics*.—Euclid's Elements, Books V.—VI.
6. *Divinity and Church History*.—The portion of each studied at the Hall during the preceding Session.
7. *Composition*.—An Essay; and a Lecture,—the latter to be delivered.

### IV.—BEFORE ENTRANCE TO THE HALL THE FOURTH YEAR.

1. *Latin*.—Calvin's Institutes, Book III., Chaps. 11—16; and Horace's Odes, Book I.
2. *Greek*.—Hebrews; I. Peter; and Septuagint, Isaiah, Chaps. XI.—LXVI.
3. *Hebrew*.—Psalms XLI.—LV.
4. *Natural Philosophy*.—Mechanics; and Optics, (Chambers' Educational Course.)
5. *Divinity and Church History*.—The portion of each studied at the Hall during the preceding Session.
6. *Composition*.—A Critical Exercise; and a Popular Sermon,—the latter to be delivered.

The Committee also recommend that Presbyteries give Students every encouragement to avail themselves of the opportunities they may have for becoming acquainted with such Branches as the following, viz.:—Natural Philosophy generally, including Astronomy; Chemistry; Natural History, (Mineralogy, Botany, and Zoology); Geology; Anatomy; Physiology, &c. And it is respectfully submitted that in the case of Students who may be attending University College, Toronto, or any other approved Academical Institution, or who may be preparing for such Institution, Presbyteries should dispense with the Literary and Philosophical portions of the above Curriculum, and should accommodate their examinations in these departments to the course of study pursued in the Public Institution."

The Committee resolved that these be printed, and that a copy be forwarded to every Minister in the Synod; and they are now respectfully submitted for the consideration of the Reverend Court. The Committee have to state also, that at their first meeting they directed their Convener to correspond with the Convener of the Scottish Synod's Committee on Theological Education, respecting a donation of Books which, it was understood, that Synod had, in 1852, generously resolved to transmit to the Theological Library here. From that correspondence the Committee have learned that the books are not very numerous and chiefly in the Latin language, but that they will be sent on directions being given as

to the best mode of conveyance. The Committee have instructed their Convener to furnish such directions, and to intimate that the Committee will be glad to receive whatever books the Synod at home may have the kindness to bestow. The Committee feel it a duty and a pleasure to record, that they voted in August last their cordial thanks to John Logan, Esq., Corn Merchant, Glasgow,—the son of a late excellent minister in Scotland,—for handsome donations of books he had made to the library both last and preceding year; and their pleasure is increased by hearing that their Convener has just received a letter from Mr. Logan, intimating that he has, this year also, sent out a number of additional volumes. The Committee trust the Synod will concur with them in opinion that Mr. Logan is justly entitled to the thanks of the Synod itself for his considerate, continued and exemplary generosity. The Committee will not further detain the Synod, than by expressing their conviction that it is a matter of vast importance for the prosperity of this Church, and for the religious well-being of the Province, that all legitimate and prudent means should be assiduously used for inducing young men to come forward as students of Theology; and that it deserves most serious consideration, whether the Synod should not endeavour to devise some method of providing for such young men, in cases where it may be needed, some pecuniary assistance by scholarships, exhibitions, or bursaries.

The Committee cannot conclude without commending the Divinity Hall to the warmest sympathies and most fervent prayers of the members of the Synod and the Church.

NOTES.—PRESBYTERY OF TORONTO.—Toronto Second Congregation was organized on the 23rd of June last; and Dr. Taylor inducted into the pastoral charge on the 23rd November, 1853.

The debt on Hampton Church has been nearly paid since the above date.

Pickering.—The income and expenditure given in the Table are those only of the front part of the Congregation; the back Station has made no returns.

Calden, Albion and Vaughan have made no returns.

PRESBYTERY OF LONDON.—From Detroit, no returns. It is now vacant, Mr. McLeish having demitted his charge, May 10, 1854. It is a financial point of view it seems prosperous.

From Adelaide and Harwick the returns are necessarily very imperfect, both Congregations having been vacant up to Sept. 17th, 1853, the date of Mr. Deas' ordination. Their contributions to his support have been at the rate of £26 8s. 7d. per annum. The report of things now seems very encouraging.

From Gaderick, no returns. They have, comparatively speaking contributed liberally for missionary services. The Congregation is in a flourishing condition. It now enjoys the pastoral services of the Rev. James A. Devine, who was ordained May 10, 1854. The stipend promised at the outset is £150 per annum.

McKillop is now under the pastoral care of the Rev. Matthew Barr, who was ordained Feb. 14, 1854.

From Ingersoll, no returns. They contribute up to their ability for missionary services. They are zealously laboring to erect a church. For this purpose they have contributed very liberally.

PRESBYTERY OF LANARK.—Forty-four members of the Pakenham Congregation were deputed to form the United Congregation of Fitzroy-Harbour and Toronto.
