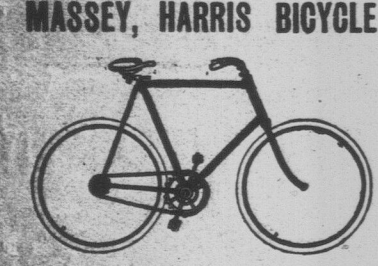

THE QUEEN'S JUBILEE. Preparations are being made throughout the British Empire for the celebration of the sixtieth anniversary of Queen Victoria's accession to the throne.

The circumstances of the day are such that it is desirable that it should be strictly observed by closing places of business during the entire day and the citizens generally are respectfully invited to illuminate their residences and places of business in the evening.

As you are aware, the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen, will be celebrated on the 22nd inst. It is a memorable event, not only in the history of the British Empire, but also in the history of the Dominion of New Brunswick.

The clergy of the Diocese of Chatham have received the following circular from their venerated Bishop: CHATHAM, N. B., June 5th, 1897.

Having just read the annexed circular from the Archbishop of Halifax, I have thought it well, for the sake of uniformity and in the spirit of union, to adopt and prescribe similar religious services for this diocese.
