Unusual Weather.

Winter truly "lingers in the lap of Spring" this year. Steamers and other craft were plying on the Miramichi on the 14th of March, a week ago last season, while the season and tempering were just in its infancy.

While it was quite clear and the temperature was above the freezing point on Saturday on the Miramichi, Saturday night was decidedly cold. In one place a few miles from Chatham the thermometer fell to 15°.

There was an April snow storm of more or less severity in Nova Scotia, Southern New Brunswick and the New England Coast on Saturday. An inch of snow fell in St. John.

At Toronto on Friday there was what the press despatches call a snow-blast, which interfered with street railway traffic.
