## GOOD ROADS

The split-log drag as an implement for the maintenance of earth roads is becoming more popular and more valuable. For the maintenance of earth roads it is replacing the grading machine, not that it can take the place of the grading machine, but supplementary to the good work this machine does in road-building.

Some of the chief advantages of the split-log drag over grading machines and wheel-graders are cheapness of construction and cheapness of operation, costing about one-half, and because of its two blades and method of construction it does not dig down into the holes, like the single blade scrapers, but passes over and fills them up.

The split-log drag should be used on earth roads just as soon as the top is dry in the spring. It is not necessary to wait until the spring rains are over and the frost is out to get good results from this implement, for by leveling down the road and properly crowning it, the later rains are quickly shed to the ditch, and washouts prevented and quicker drying secured after the rains are over.

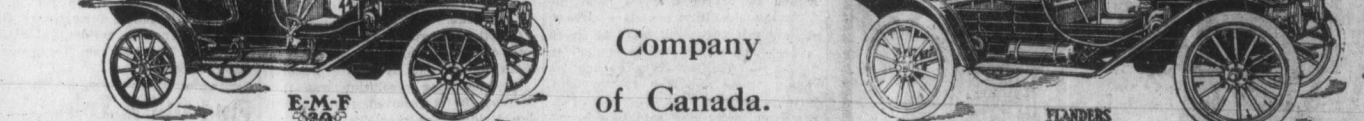
