On the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Inland Revenue, and under and in virtue of the authority given by the 17th section of the Act 31st Vict., Chapter-8, initialed: "An Act respecting the Inland Revenue:" His Excellency has been pleased to Order, and it is hereby Ordered, that the Order in Council passed on the 5th December ultimo, making certain regulations for the manufacture of Methylated Spirits in Bond, be, and the same are hereby modified by substituting for the 4th Section thereof the following regulation, which shall be held and taken as number four of said regulations, that is to say:

"4th, With every 100 gallons of alcohol 65 per cent, over proof, there shall be mixed at least 10 gallons of "Wood Xaphtha of Commerce" the whole being mixed together."
