C A P. XXII.

An Act for making perpetual several Laws relating to permitting the Exportation of Tobacco Pipe Clay from *Great Britain* to the *British* Sugar Colonies in the *West Indies*; the Importation of Salt from *Europe* into *Quebec* in *America*; and the prohibiting of Foreign-wrought Silks and Velvets.

[21st March 1808.]

WHEREAS the Laws herein-after mentioned have by Experience been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be made perpetual; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That so much of an Act made in the Seventeenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for repealing the Eleventh Rule in the Book of Rates, so far as the same relates to making any Allowance upon the Importation of damaged Currants and Raisins; and for making the Importer of such Goods an Abatement in the Duties in lieu thereof; and for explaining the said Rule with respect to such Allowance for Damage on other Goods; and to permit the Exportation of Tobacco Pipe Clay from this Kingdom to the British Sugar Colonies or Plantations in the West Indies, for a limited Time; as permits the Exportation of Tobacco Pipe Clay from this Kingdom to the British Sugar Colonies or Plantations in the West Indies, which was to continue in force until the*

Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand seven hundred and seventy-nine; and which, by Six Acts made in the Twentieth, Twenty-third, Twenty-eighth, Thirty-third, Thirty-eighth, and Forty-second Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, was further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and eight, shall be and the same is hereby made perpetual.

II. And be it further enacted, That an Act made in the Fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for importing Salt from Europe into the Province of Quebec in America, for a limited Time*, which was to continue in force from the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand seven hundred and sixty-four, for the Term of One Year, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and which by several subsequent Acts was further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and eight, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, shall be and the same is hereby made perpetual.

III. And whereas an Act was made in the Sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to prohibit the Importation of Foreign wrought Silks and Velvets for a limited Time, and for preventing unlawful Combinations of Workmen employed in the Silk Manufacture*, which was to continue in force for the Term of Five Years from the Fourteenth Day of *June* One thousand seven hundred and sixty-six, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and which by several subsequent Acts made in the Eleventh and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty was further continued until the Fourteenth Day of *June* One thousand seven hundred and eighty-two, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and which Acts, so far as relate to the prohibiting the Importation of Foreign-wrought Silks and Velvets, was, by three Acts made in the Twenty-second, Twenty-ninth, and Thirty-fifth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, further continued until the Fourteenth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and two, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and amended and further continued by an Act of the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, until the Fourteenth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and eight, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament: And whereas the said Act, so far as relates to the prohibiting the Importation of Foreign-wrought Silks and Velvets, hath been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be made perpetual; be it therefore enacted, That the said Act, so far as relates to the prohibiting the Importation of Foreign-wrought Silks and Velvets, shall (except so far as the same is repugnant to an Act passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, *An Act to repeal the Duties of Customs payable in Great Britain, and to grant other Duties in lieu thereof*), be, and the same is hereby made perpetual.
