PRINCESS DI NABBED

Diana, Princess of Wales, was kidnapped early this morning from the penthouse suite of Hotel La Italia in Rome, Italy.

As of noon today, no individual or group has yet claimed responsibility for the abduction. The Princess' whereabouts are unknown and her safety is in question.

It is rumoured that Libya's Moammar Khadafy may be involved in the kidnapping.

"He seemed to take a special interest in the Princess when they met in the Bahamas last year," said a close friend of the Royal family who asked to remain anonymous for security reasons.


The Pope included a plea for the freedom of the Princess in his morning mass prayers.

A distraught Charles blamed himself for the abduction.

Charles and Diana were scheduled to leave for Madrid, Spain at nine this morning. The Royal couple were on an unofficial two week tour to some Mediterranean states to promote English muffins.

The Queen, who was in the middle of a state breakfast to honour top Canadian journalists Gwynn Dyer, Peter Gzowski, and Lynnetta Van Vliet, collapsed from a heart attack upon hearing the news.

"Everybody in the room was dazed and nobody moved even when the Queen fell from the chair. Thank God Lynn was quick. She gave Her Majesty mouth-to-mouth resuscitation immediately. Peter went for help and I tried to calm everybody," said Dyer.

There were 50 guests at the state breakfast, including Winston M. Churchill, an MP from Northumberland; Barbara Cartland, Princess Diana's stepgranny and popular romance writer; Sheena Easton; Rupert Murdoch, the international media

tycoon; and Myer Horowitz.



Death, Blood, chicks at Jonestown Poultry

Five agriculture students were killed and twenty others mangled following a senseless, savage attack by a flock of raving chickens yesterday.

According to Darned, a bunch of them sardonically called out, "Let's take them to the roof and throw them off. They can fly, can't they?" a remark that was greeted with much brutal amusement by the throng of debauched birds.

Dairy said the only thing that kept her and the others from certain death was grabbing eggs in their hands and screaming "don't move or we'll crush the embryos" to the bloodthirsty mob.

None of the survivors had any explanation why the five killed were especially singled out for the riff-raff's wrath, but one of them summarized the feelings of the group and said, "all I know is I'm glad my face doesn't look like it got shoved into a cuisinart."

All Darned could get out of the chickens for this reporter was a guttural "fuck 'em, we're pissed off and they deserved it."

So the mysterious reasons behind the fates of E.G.G. McMuffin, M.c. Chicken, Shake N. Bake, C. AlaKing, and A. Fryer will remain that way until further investigation.



Badear doesn't think she will fight the administration. Says she: "They offered me a juicy position on one of Horowitz's committees, and I'll enjoy retiring at 45."



Dressup charged with Casey's death

PUPPET MASTICATED

TV personality Ernie Coombs, who was known to children as Mr. Dressup on the long-running CBC show, was arrested yesterday on charges of child abuse and man-


'confidante', Mr. Rogers, said in an interview Monday that he believes Coombs is innocent.

The star of Post Corporation's Sugar Crisp commercials was arrested yesterday in Miami on charges of narcotics trafficking.

Snubs, added, "Yeah, mon, da bear berry, berry big in de Florida operation." Snubs accent changed as he restrained Crock'o Shit, saying, "be cool, man, be cool."

The Scum has learned that Sugar Bear placed his phone call to someone named 'Granny'. After listening to 'Granny' for a short time, Sugar Bear murmured, "Oh no, Granny. We got trouble. Is it the Columbians? Hey, hey, I'll be right over." Police in Miami had taped the call, after which they arrested Sugar Bear.

Sugar Bear maintains his innocence, claiming he was only doing his job. "And, hey," Sugar Bear snapped, "that cop Sinny sayin' I used. Jeez, you eat Sugar Crisp and you'll get mellow too. You know how much sugar is in the stuff? That's why people quit scrappin' when I give 'em Sugar Crisp."

Officer Crock'o Shit said he is shocked by the whole affair. "I used to look up to the guy (Sugar Bear). But now..." Crock'o Shit, in a soft voice, added, "I thought we only got sold out when I was over there. But here, now, I'm back in the world and I see this kinda stuff."

A spokesman for Post Corporation said Post supports Sugar Bear. "The Sugar Bear is crucial to our marketing of Sugar Crisp. He is an individual who is very devoted to his job. All the evidence against him is circumstantial. A group of hungry Columbians dropped by Granny's for lunch and she was low on food. They threatened to abduct her unless they were fed. Sugar Bear was preparing to deliver 3 kilograms of Sugar Crisp to Granny. That's what really happened."

Sugar Bear has been denied bail pending further investigation.



Miami Screaming Eagles sue for playoff berth

Miami Screaming Eagles owner Elmer DeFudd announced today that the team will sue the N.H.L. to be included in the Stanley Cup playoffs next year, regardless of where they finish in the standings.

"Making the playoffs seems to be totally unrelated to where you finish," said DeFudd. "Toronto was in third to last place this year! This situation is completely unfair to the fans and the players. Not only that, we need the playoff money."

The Eagles were eliminated from the playoffs this season when they finished in 6th place in the Adams Division. However, they ended the year with 78 points, more than 25 points ahead of the Winnipeg, Vancouver, and Toronto teams — all of which made the playoffs.

DeFudd added that he hopes to get the Buffalo Buffaloes, Pittsburgh Panthers, and New Jersey Darrhvaders to join in the lawsuit. "Hey, they finished ahead of those Canadian teams (Winnipeg, Vancouver, and Toronto) too," he said.

N.H.L. president John Ziegler did not

comment on the potential lawsuit. However, a high league official who asked to remain nameless said that the suit was not completely unexpected. "We knew that Hartford had been talking to a lawyer about suing. I guess he must have contacted Miami when the Swordfishers got in."

The Hartford Swordfishers had finished out of the playoffs, but ahead of at least one playoff team for several years running. They made the playoffs in the last week of the season this year.

Buffalo team officials indicated that

they were thinking about taking DeFudd's offer to join in the suit. Buffalo GM Montgomery "Scotty" Scott asked, "What's going on here? Is the league discriminating against American teams? Who's in charge of the playoff policy, Pat Riggins?"

Riggins, a goalie for the Boston Bruins, complained last year that American hockey players were taking jobs away from Canadians.

At the league office in Montreal, our source did not deny Scott's suggestion. "He (Riggins) probably does have an effect

on the playoff hopes of the Bruins and the teams they play against, particularly teams in their division like Buffalo and Miami."

Partly because of the Swordfisher situation, the NHL playoff system has been criticized heavily in the past. However, this marks the first time that a team has talked about suing. Several independent

observers believe that the N.H.L.'s fear of

lawsuits will soon result in an out-of-court settlement.





time trying to find the Commercial Hotel, where we have our meetings."


In reference to charges the club may be violating the Charter of Rights by excluding women from membership, Pigbouy said, "Some of my best friends are dames."






