



HIS HAIR TURNED BLACK.

Louisville, Jan. 2.—Engineer George F. Gambrall, of the fire department, while on duty at a fire on Friday night, was covered by ice and fell from exhaustion. Dr. Griffiths, who called upon the engineer yesterday, found that a large portion of the patient's snowy hair had turned black as night. The only part affected was that protected by the fireman's helmet, which Gambrall wore, and the eyebrows. From the temples around the back of the head is a sharp line of demarcation where the black hair joins the gray. Gambrall is recovering rapidly from the effects of his exposure but the black hair shows no signs of resuming its houry color. Washington, D. C., Dec. 31.—Judge Mc-Comas tu-day over-ruled the demurrers filed by the attorneys of Captain Howgate to three indictments returned by the grand jury. Capt.
