This The Declaration of Governor Peabody of Colorado Many Officials Are Driven Out—A War Against All The Unions.

DENVER, COLO., JUNE 10.—Governor Peabody today said: "I have not declared martial law in any community in Colorado. I have only decided it to be in a state of insurrection and rebellion, and the newspapers have used the term martial law in describing our proclamation.

The following Teller county officials are driven from their homes and will not return to Cripple Creek while the military are in power, owing to reports that the citizens' committee, which is co-operating with the military, intend to force them to resign their offices: District Judge Seed, County Judge A. County Clerk Mackay.

The executive board of the Western Federation of Miners decided today to decide that a history of the labor trouble in Colorado shall be taken to Washington by an emissary and placed in the President's hands. It was also voted to appeal President Moore's habeas corpus case to the United States Supreme court.

The Woman's Auxiliary of the Miners' Union has been forbidden by the military authorities to hold meetings.

Joseph Hamilton, chairman of the Democratic county convention appeared before the citizens' deportation committee today and acknowledged that he believed in unions, and was told that he must leave camp within the next four days.

The committee in charge of the petition being circulated among the merchants and business men, pledging themselves not to employ union labor, were repudiated by a list of objections because the printers, pressmen, stenographers and newspaper writers are allied with the federation and this would involve the suspension of the Cripple Creek Times and the Evening Star, which employ union labor.

All day a long line of women besieged the "bull pen" here and in Victoria, begging the armed guards for permission to see husbands, fathers, brothers and sweethearts. Admittance was denied during the forenoon, but all these were allowed to see the prisoners in the afternoon.

Strikes' Cost Is \$23,036,000

Extraordinary Financial Loss Caused by Colorado Labor Troubles.

For Sixteen Months the Great Mining Industry Has Been in a State of Chaos.

Denver, June 10.—The Republican today estimates the cost of the strikes in Colorado during the past sixteen months under the administration of Governor James H. Peabody to aggregate \$23,036,000. An itemized statement is given as follows:

Colorado City strike—State's expense, \$28,000; loss to men in wages, \$750,000.

Cripple Creek strike—State's expense, \$400,000; loss in wages to union men, \$4,000,000; loss in wages to other labor, \$3,000,000.

Denver and Pueblo smelter strike—Loss to smelters and miners, \$300,000; loss to dependent labor, \$200,000.

Telluride strike—State's expense, \$75,000; loss to miners, \$1,700,000; loss to dependent labor, \$500,000.

Coal miners' strike—State's expense, \$300,000; loss in wages to miners, \$4,000,000.

Loss to steel works employees, \$1,000,000; loss to men in allied trades, \$1,500,000.

Loss to employers, through idle capital, interest, profits, etc., \$3,000,000.

The strikes originated early in 1903 in an attempt on the part of the federation to force the introduction of the National eight-hour day in the mills and smelters.

Within a few weeks after taking effect, January 1, 1903, Governor Peabody's exception of brief periods the National eight-hour day has been on duty at one or another of the principal mining centers.

The Cripple Creek miners' strike began ten months ago. The men were earning on the average \$3.25 for eight hours' work. They had no complaints of their own, but went on strike in obedience to an order of their executive committee for the purpose of shutting off the ore supply of the mills and smelters at which an eight-hour day was not in operation.
