RULES

of the

Saskatchewan Cricket Association

Passed at a meeting held on Sat., 28th Jan., 1911

Rule I

This Association shall be called "The Name Saskatchewan Cricket Association."

Rule II

This Association is formed for the Object purpose of promoting and protecting the interests of the Game of Cricket, and all Clubs affiliated with this Association shall be governed by and subject to the following rules and regulations:

Rule III

Membership to the Association shall Membership be confined to Clubs formed within the limits of the Province of Saskatchewan.

Rule IV

Any Club desirous of belonging to Election of the Association shall make formal ap-Clubs plication for admission in writing to the Secretary, setting out fully its qualifications.

Rule V

Officers

The officers of the Association shall be: Patron, two Honorary Presidents, President, one Vice-President from each of the three divisions of the League, Honorary Secretary-Treasurer and Auditor, to be elected by ballot at the Annual General Meeting of the Association.

Rule VI

Duties of Officers

(a) President (and in his absence a Vice-President) shall preside at all the meetings of the Association and perform the usual functions of the Chairman. In the absence of both President and Vice-Presidents the members present may appoint a Chairman from amongst themselves. The President, Vice-Presidents or Chairman (not being a representative) shall not vote at any meeting except where there is an equality of votes exclusive of his own, in which case he shall have the casting vote.

(b) Hon. Sec.-Treas. It shall be the duty of the Secretary-Treasurer to keep an accurate account of all the meetings of the Association, and enter them in a proper book for that purpose, and he shall also keep all correspondence, issue all notices, receive all moneys paid into the Association and give receipt for same, and shall deposit the funds in such Bank as the Association may direct, to the credit of and in the name of the Association; sign, together with the President, all cheques issued by the Asso-

ciation; attend all the meetings of the Association (but shall not be allowed to vote except he be a representative). Local Secretaries shall submit to the Secretary of the Association at the close of each session the averages of members of their respective Clubs.

Rule VII

The Executive shall consist of the Executive President (or in his absence a Vice-President), the Secretary, and one member from each affiliated Club. Four to form a quorum.

Rule VIII

The Executive Committee shall have full power and authority to enforce the rules and regulations of this Association, and shall do all the work necessary in connection therewith, and shall, when requested so to do, decide all matters and questions in dispute submitted to it, except as provided for in Rule 24, and the decision of the Committee shall be final and binding. Should the Executive Committee desire to refer any matter to a General Meeting, the Secretary shall call a special general meeting at any time, upon being requested to do so by the said Committee. In every such case there must be at least ten days' notice given, briefly stating the object of the meeting, and only such business as is specified in the notice shall be discussed. The representatives to attend at such special general meetings shall be those elected to attend at the Annual General Meeting.

Rule IX

Annual
General
Meeting

The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second Wednesday in March in each year, and due notice of such meeting shall be mailed to the Secretaries of the affiliated Clubs. All affiliated Clubs desirous of entering teams for league matches shall send an application in writing to the Secretary, setting out the number of teams and the division in which they wish to enter the same, in time for the General Meeting. The said application shall be accompanied by the regular affiliation fees for each team so entered, and shall name the elected representatives, of whom any two may attend the said meeting.

Rule X

Rules of
Order at
Annual
Meeting

The following shall be the order of business at the Annual Meeting of the Association:

- (1) Calling the roll of Officers and qualified representatives.
- (2) Reading and approval of minutes.
- (3) Reading reports of President and Secretary-Treasurer.
- (4) Election of Officers.
- (5) Reception of petitions for affiliation.
- (6) Reading of Communications.
- (7) Unfinished Business.
- (8) New Business.

Rule XI

Special
General
Meeting

The Secretary shall convene a special General Meeting at any time upon receiving a requisition to that effect

signed by the Secretaries of not less than two Clubs. In every case there must be at least ten days' notice given, briefly stating the object of the meeting, and only such business as is specified on the notice shall be discussed.

Rule XII

There shall be played under the auspices of the Association a series of League Matches, same to be under the control of the Executive Committee. Division of the Leagues

Rule XIII

Any person who has played with any one Club shall not be eligible to play with any other Club in League Matches in any one season, except with the consent of the Executive. Members Must Play for One Club Only

Rule XIV

No professionals shall under any circumstances be allowed to play in a League Match. Professionals debarred

Rule XV

That no match be started after 2.30 unless by mutual agreement, or unless by a team being detained by accident. Commencement and finish of Matches

Rule XVI

In the event of a match not being played on the date fixed, the whole matter shall be referred to the Executive of the Association, which after both teams have been heard, shall de- Inability to fill League engagements

cide whether the game shall be forfeited by either team or shall be played on some other date.

Rule XVII

Method of
deciding
Champion-
ship

The Championship of each League in the Association shall be decided on a system of points, and this order shall be determined by counting two points for win and one point for draw or tie. The Champions of each division shall meet for the Championship of the Province, and in the case where only three teams are involved in these final games, one team will receive a bye, and that team will play the winners of the semi-final in the final game.

Rule XVIII

Protests

All protests and disputes shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Association, sent by registered mail within five days, who on receipt of same shall at once call a meeting of the Executive to consider the matter, and their decision shall be final, except as provided for in Rule 20.

Rule XIX

Transfer of
Members

A certificate of membership of good standing shall be necessary for a member leaving any Club and applying for membership in an affiliated Club.

Rule XX

M.C.C. rules
to be ob-
served

The Rules of the M. C. C. shall be adopted in all questions of the play.

Rule XXI

These By-laws can only be rescinded ^{Rescinding} or amended at a General Meeting of ^{of By-laws} the Association, or at a special General Meeting called for that purpose. Notice in writing shall be given to the Secretary of the Association of any proposed amendment or amendments at least 10 days before date of such meetings.

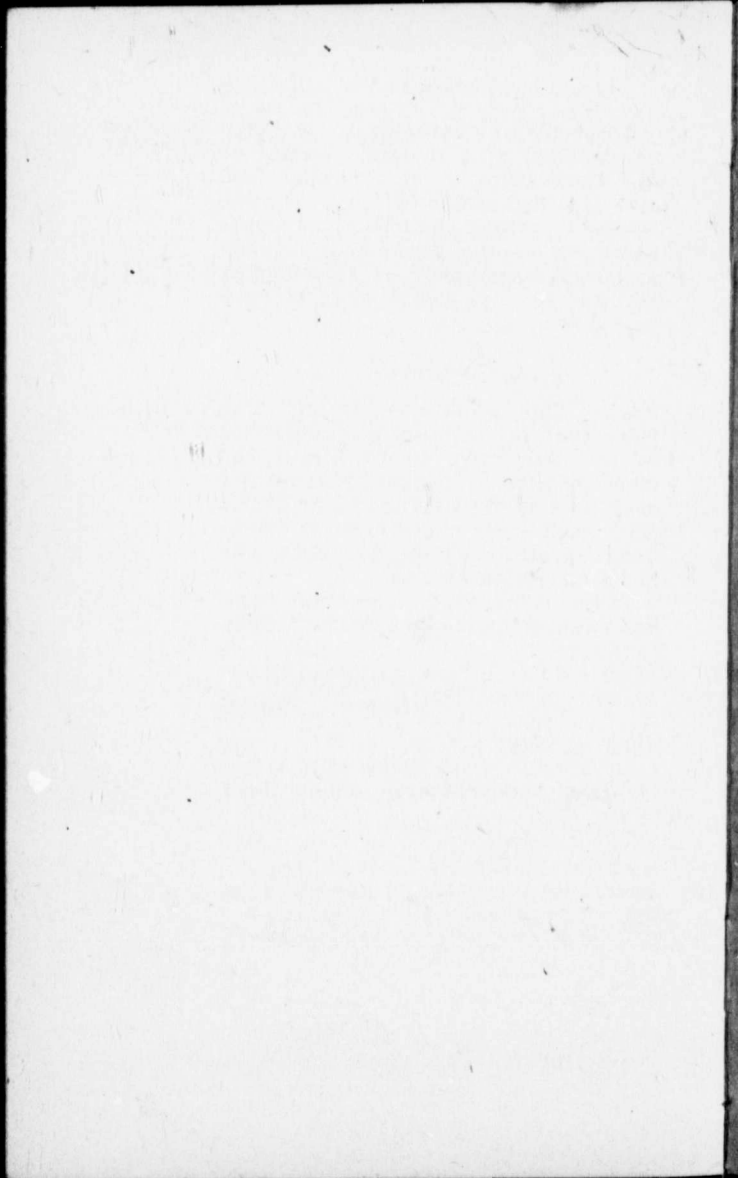
Rule XXII

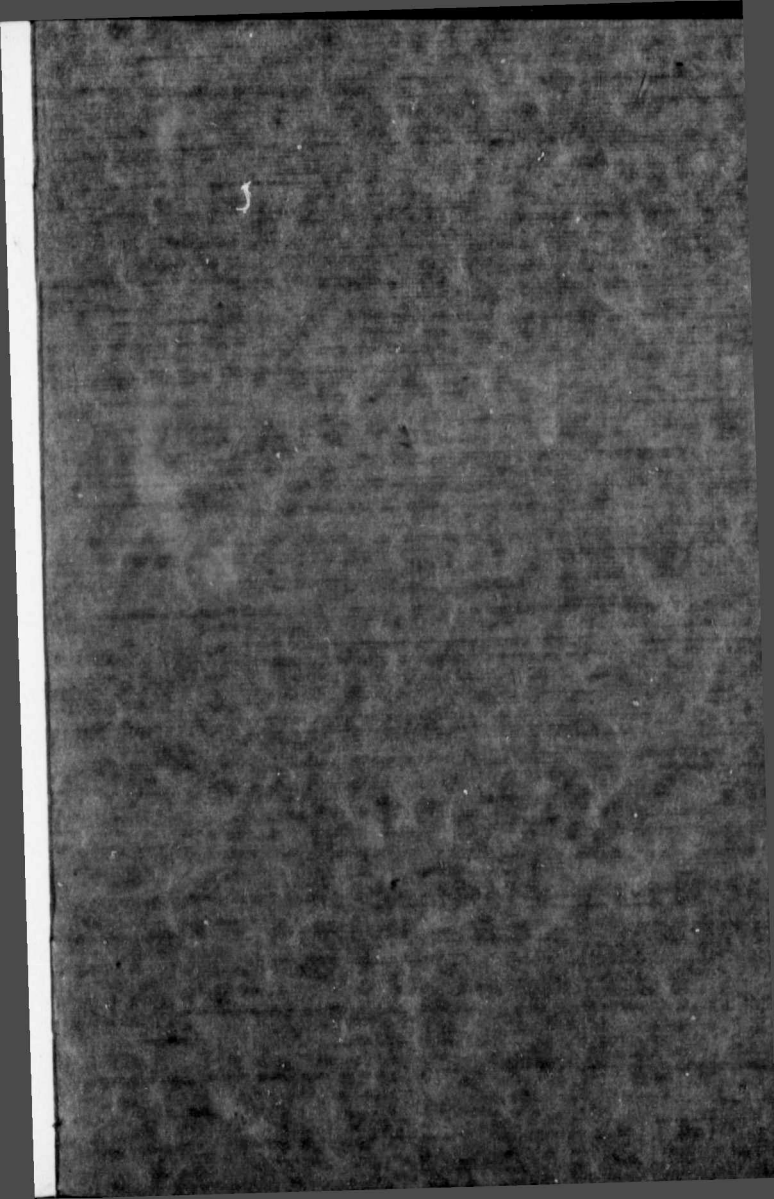

These rules shall come into force and effect from the 28th January, 1911.
