

CONSOLIDATED ACT OF INCORPORATION,

46 and 47 VICTORIA, CHAPTER 90.

An Act to amend and consolidate the Acts relating to Manitoba Club.

(Assented to 7th July, 1883.)

Whereas, The Manitoba Club have Preamble. presented their petition praying that their Act of Incorporation and any amendments thereof, together with other amendments set forth in said petition, may be embodied and incorporated in one general Act of Incorporation;

And whereas, it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition.

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Manitoba, enacts as follows:

1. The Manitoba Club, as now incorpowers of the porated in the city of Winnipeg, in the Province of Manitoba, and such other

persons as now are, or hereafter shall become members of the said "The Manitoba Club," shall and are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate, in deed and in name, by the name of "The Manitoba Club," and by that name shall have perpetual succession and a common seal, and shall have power, from time to time, and at all times hereafter be able and capable to purchase, acquire, hold, possess and enjoy, and to have, take and receive to them and their successors, to and for the actual use and occupation of the said Corporation, any lands, hereditaments, premises, and real and unmoveable property and estate situate, lying and being within the said City of Winnipeg, not exceeding the value of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), and the sell, alienate, exchange and same to otherwise dispose of, whensoever the said Corporation may deem it proper so to do. And by the same name shall and may be able and capable in law and in equity to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, in any manner whatsoever.

Rules of Club to be those of corporation. 2. The constitution, rules and regulations now in force, touching the admission and expulsion of members, and the management and conduct generally of the affairs and concerns of the said Club, in so far as they may not be inconsistent with the laws in force in this Province,

shall be the constitution, rules and regulations of said Corporation.

Provided always that the said corpora-Rules may be changed. tion, may from time to time, alter, repeal and change such constitution, rules and regulations in the manner provided by the constitution, rules and regulations of said corporation.

- 3. All property and effects now vested in, or by, or in trust for, the said corporation are hereby vested in the said corporation, and shall be applied solely for the use and maintenance of the said corporation.
- 4. The said corporation may, from time Corporation to time, borrow money, not to exceed in money. the whole the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) at such rate of interest and upon such terms as they may think proper; and may for such purposes make, execute or issue any mortgages, bonds, debentures or other instruments, under the seal of the said corporation, which shall operate as a mortgage and charge against the lands and effects of the said corporation.
- 5. Any such mortgage, bond, deben- Execution ture or other instrument shall be signed of bonds, by the president of the said corporation, and countersigned by the secretary.

Members, to what extent liable.

6. No member of the said Club shall be in any way liable for, or chargeable with, the payment of any debt or demand due by the said corporation beyond the extent of the entrance fee and annual subscriptions remaining unpaid by the said member and for any unpaid accounts he may have incurred to the Club for articles ordered by him in said Club. And every member of the said Club, not so indebted to the said corporation, will be allowed to withdraw and will cease to be a member on giving notice to that effect according to the form that may be prescribed by the constitution, rules and regulations of the said Club, and from henceforth shall be free from all debts and demands due by the said corporation.

Promissory notes.

7. That said corporation shall have power to draw, make, accept and endorse all bills of exchange and promissory notes necessary for the purposes of the said corporation, under the hands of their president and secretary, after authority from the committee of the said corporation so to do; and in no case shall it be necessary that the seal of the corporation be affixed to any such bill or note, nor shall the president or secretary be individually responsible therefor.

- 8. The Act of said Province, passed in 38 vic. Cap. the 38th year of Her present Majesty, Cap. 32, rechapter 51, and the Act passed in the pealed. 43rd year of Her present Majesty, chapter 32, are hereby repealed.
- 9. This Act may be cited as "The Manitoba Club Act," 1883.

Constitution.

BY-LAWS.

Title.

1. The Association shall be known as the "Manitoba Club."

Prohibited subjects.

2. Politics and religious questions of every description shall be absolutely excluded from the objects of the Club.

Admission.

3. Admission to the Club shall be by ballot. Each candidate for admission shall be proposed by one ordinary member, and seconded by another, by a written proposal addressed to the secretary, who shall post the name of such candidate, with the names of his proposer and seconder, in the place in the Club designated for that purpose, for at least fourteen days previous to the day of ballot. Notice of such ballot shall be mailed to each resident member at least seven days previous to the day of ballot.

Ballot.

4. The ballot shall be held on the second Wednesday in each month, between the hours of nine o'clock a. m. and seven o'clock p.m.; no ballot shall be valid unless at least twenty members vote, and one adverse vote in each five votes shall exclude.

*5. The entrance fee to the Club shall Entrance be \$75.00, and shall be handed to the Subscription. secretary at the time of proposal, and in case of non-election of the candidate it shall be returned.

The annual subscription shall be as follows:

Resident members \$40 per annum, payable quarterly in advance.

Non-resident members, \$25 per annum, payable half-yearly in advance.

Supernumerary members, \$5 per annum payable in advance.

If any member fail to pay his subscription within thirty days after the due date, if he reside in Manitoba, or within sixty days if he reside elsewhere, the secretary shall thereupon cause the name of the member so in default to be posted for a further period of sixty days, at the expiration of which, if still in default, he shall cease to be a member of the Club.

^{*}At a special general meeting held on Feb. 3rd, 1897, the operation of the first paragraph of Section 5 of the By-laws was suspended from the lst of March prox., for a period of three months, with power to the Committee to extend the time for a further period or periods, not exceeding three months in all; during which suspension the entrance fee to the Club to be \$25.00. The reduction of entrance fee not to apply to privileged members. The number of new members to be admitted at the reduced entrance fee to be restricted to fifty.

from a defaulting member, to reinstate him upon his paying all subscriptions which he should have paid in the meantime, if he had continued an active member.

Election.

6. Each new member shall be notified by the secretary of his admission, and furnished with a copy of the By-laws and shall sign the member's register.

Defaulters.

7. No member shall be permitted to vote or enjoy any of the privileges of the Club until he shall have paid whatever arrears are due by him, either for subscriptions or otherwise.

Supernumerary members.

8. Any member who shall be absent from the Province for a period of not less than six months at any one time, may on application in writing to the secretary, at least fifteen days before the next subscription becomes due, be placed on the list of supernumerary members, and shall be exempt from payment of the quarterly subscription or subscriptions falling due during his absence, but shall pay in lieu thereof the sum of \$5 per annum. Such member may, however, be re-admitted to all his privileges on application made in writing to the committee within one month after his return, and upon payment of such proportionate part of the current quarterly subscription as they may see fit to require, and failing in such application

- 9. Members who reside at a distance of Non-resiover twenty miles from Winnipeg shall members. be termed "non-resident members."
- 10. (a.) Officers of Her Majesty's Re-Privileged gular Forces, or of the Dominion Militia on active service in Manitoba, or of the Mounted Police, may be admitted by the committee as privileged members without ballot and without payment of the entrance fee, but shall pay the annual subscription of resident members.
- (b.) Any person who shall first satisfy the committee that his residence in Manitoba is likely to be but temporary, may be elected a privileged member on being oposed and balloted for as such, in the linary way.
- (c.) Any ordinary member of the St. James Club, of Montreal, the Garrison Club, of Quebec, the Hamilton Club, of Hamilton, the London Club, of London, Ontario, the Rideau Club, of Ottawa, the Halifax Club, of Halifax, the Union Club, of Victoria, B.C., the Union Club, of St. Johns, N.B. and the Union Club, of Quebec, who shall be duly certified as such, and whose usual place of residence shall be outside the Province of Manitoba, may be elected a privileged member of this Club on being proposed and

balloted for as such as in the usual way, without payment of the entrance fee, but shall pay the annual subscription of a non-resident member. Such privileged members shall enjoy all the advantages of membership except being on the Committee and voting, and may at any time, on obtaining the consent of the Committee, become ordinary members on payment of the entrance fee.

(d.) Privileged members, other than those mentioned in sub-section a of this section, shall not pay the entrance fee, but in lieu thereof shall pay in addition to the ordinary annual subscription an amount equivalent to 20 per cent of the then existing entrance fee, and at the expiration of five years from the date of their election as privileged members shall become full members without further payment. They shall enjoy all advantages of membership during the term for which their cause of privilege lasts, except being on the committee and voting and may at any time, on obtaining the consent of the committee, become ordinary members on payment of the balance required to complete the amount of the entrance fee. The 20 per cent shall be paid semi-annually.

Introduced members.

11. Any ordinary member shall have the right of introducing a friend, resident elsewhere than within a radius of fifty al way, fee, but on of a vileged antages te Comy time, Com-

miles from the City of Winnipeg, for a period not exceeding ten days, the name of the person so proposed being first submitted to the committee with the written recommendation of one ordinary member, and being approved of by the committee; and on application to the committee, the introduction may be extended with the approval of the committee from month to month for a further period not exceeding three months upon payment of a fee of \$5 for each month or portion of a month, and such extension may be granted within six months from the time of original introduction, and such person shall be an introduced member of the Club for the period for which he is introduced, subject to all regulations concerning introduced members which the committee shall from time to time prescribe. Provided always that the privileges of introduced members shall be personal only; that members introducing friends shall be responsible for any indebtedness the latter may incur, and that no person shall again be introduced by the same or any other member of the Club until a period of six months have elapsed since his last introduction, except as provided above.

12. Any member may invite a friend or strangers. friends into the Club under such regulations as the committee may from time to time prescribe, and the committee shall have power to suspend this rule for a

period not exceeding ten days in its discretion.

Withdrawal.

13. Any member whose subscription and dues are paid shall be at liberty to withdraw from the Club, on notifying the committee in writing to that effect, but a member so withdrawing may be re-admitted to membership on application made within two years after such withdrawal, without entrance fee, but must be balloted for in the usual way.

Expulsion.

14. If any member be guilty of conduct which, in the opinion of the committee, or of any five members of the Club certifying such their opinion in writing, is detrimental to the character or interests of the Club, or if any member wilfully infringe the constitution or any of the by-laws, rules or regulations of the Club, the committee shall, by notice specifying the nature of the offence charged, cause a meeting of the committee to be specially called for the purpose of considering the same and shall request such member to appear before them at such meeting, giving him reasonable notice of the nature of the offence charged against him, and of the time and place at which he is requested to appear, and if he thereupon neglect to appear pursuant to such request and notice, or if having so appeared, he fail to satisfy the committee, the committee may by a vote of

at least five of its members suspend such member from the privileges of the Club for any period not exceeding two months, the time of suspension to begin to run from ten days after the decision of the committee has been made known to the suspended member; or the committee may call a special meeting of the Club to consider the matter, and it shall be competent to such meeting by a vote of at least two-thirds of the members present thereat, to be taken by ballot, to suspend or to expel such member from the Club. Provided that any member suspended by the committee under this rule shall have the right to appeal to a special general meeting of the Club, at which voting shall be by ballot, and which it shall be the duty of the committee to call as soon as possible after the member so suspended shall have notified the committee in writing of his intention to appeal. The secretary of the Club shall at once notify the member complained of, of the result of any special general meeting held under this rule.

15. Any member who shall resign or Forfeiture be expelled from the Club shall cease to of rights. be a member thereof, and shall forfeit all right to or claim upon its property and effects. A member who shall be expelled shall be ineligible for admission or reelection, and shall not be admitted to the Club premises.

Committee.

- 16. The Club shall be managed by a committee consisting of seven ordinary members, three of whom shall be elected annually at the annual general meeting by ballot. The committee shall have full power to make from time to time such rules and regulations not inconsistent with these by-laws, for the management of the Club, as they shall see fit, and it shall be the duty of the committee to take immediate notice of any infraction of the by-laws or the rules and regulations of the Club, and such action in regard thereto as the nature of the case may require.
- 17. Three members of the committee shall retire at the end of each year, in order of seniority. The members so retiring to be selected by the committee at a meeting previous to the annual general meeting, but the retiring members of the committee shall be eligible for re-election. No member shall be eligible for election to the committee unless he has been nominated and seconded and his name posted in the coffee room at least ten days before the meeting. If any member of the committee shall resign, or should any vacancy occur by the death of any member, the committee shall have power to choose a member to act in his stead until the annual general meeting. The committee shall continue in office until their successors are appointed.

- 18. At the first meeting of the commit-officers. tee after the annual general meeting, they shall elect from among the members thereof a president and a treasurer, and, either from among the members thereof or otherwise, a secretary.
- 19. At all the meetings of the committee tee three shall form a quorum, and the quorum committee shall meet at least once a meetings. month. Any member of the committee absent from three consecutive meetings thereof shall forthwith cease to be a member thereof, unless excused from attendance by resolution passed by the committee at the third meeting from which he may be absent.
- 20. There shall be an annual meeting General of the Club in each year, on the first meetings. Wednesday of February, for the purpose of electing members to fill the vacancies in the committee, at which meeting it shall be the duty of the committee to present a report and abstract of the state of accounts duly audited and general concerns of the Club for the past year, which report and abstract shall be printed and distributed among the members a fortnight prior to the date of the meeting. All propositions to be submitted by members at the annual meeting shall be posted in the coffee room at least seven days before the meeting. The chair shall be taken at all meetings at four o'clock in

the afternoon. A quorum of twelve qualified members shall be necessary to constitute any annual or special meeting of the Club.

Special meetings.

- 21. (a.) The committee shall have the power at all times to convene a special meeting of the Club, on giving seven days' notice, to be posted up during that period in the coffee room of the Club, specifying the object of such meeting; at which meeting no subject shall be discussed beyond that specified in the notice.
- (b.) A special meeting of the Club shall be called by the committee at any time upon a requisition signed by twelve qualified members of the Club, which requisition shall state the object of the meeting, and at such meeting no other subject shall be discussed.
- (c.) Notice of all annual and special meetings shall be mailed to members seven days in advance.

House hours, 22. The Club shall be open every day for the reception of members at 7:30 o'clock in the forenoon in the summer, and 8 o'clock in the forenoon in the winter, and shall be closed and the lights extinguished at 1 A.M., except on Saturdays and Sundays, when the hours of closing shall be midnight; and no member shall be admitted into or shall remain in the

- 23. No member shall receive any pro-not to fit, salary or emolument from the Club, receive nor shall any member give any money or gratuity to any of the servants of the establishment, upon any pretence whatsoever; it being understood that this rule is not intended to preclude any member of the Club from selling property or goods, or stock or other money securities, to the Club, or buying any of the same from the Club, nor to prevent the secretary from receiving a salary if so decided by the committee.
- 24. No member shall remove from the Reading Club any newspaper, pamphlet, book, room. map or any other article.
- 25. No servant of the Club (the mes-Errands. senger excepted) shall be sent out of the house upon any errand.
- 26. No provisions cooked in the Club, Provisions or wine or other liquors, shall be sent out be sent out. of the house.
- 27. Members are on no account to find complaints fault with or reprimand the servants of the Club, but all cases of complaint shall be notified to the secretary in writing, and shall be by him laid before the committee at their next meeting.

Members' accounts.

28. The committee shall have power to regulate the mode of paying for house accounts incurred by members and to enforce payment of the same, and nonpayment therefor as required by the committee shall empower the committee to exclude defaulting members from the privileges of the Club If payment is not made within sixty days after notice in writing, the defaulting member shall absolutely cease to be a member, but the committee shall have the power to reinstate such member upon payment of the amount due and unpaid by him without re-election, providing such payment is made within three months thereafter.

Cards.

29. No round game of cards shall be played for money; nor shall dice be used in the Club except at back-gammon. No higher stake than quarter-dollar points shall be played for, nor shall any bet exceed one dollar.

Smoking.

30. No smoking shall be permitted in the Club except in the rooms set apart for that purpose.

Dogs.

31. Dogs will not be admitted in the Club. The hall porter will turn out any that may intrude, and members are requested to aid in the strict enforcement of this rule.

Amendments. 32. Any article of these by-laws may be altered, amended or suspended for any

length of time by consent of two-thirds of the members present at any meeting specially convened for that purpose, or at the annual general meeting, and provided such alteration, amendment or suspension shall have been specified in the notice summoning such meeting.

- 33. All notices shall be binding upon Notices. members it mailed to them at their last known address.
- 34. The president and treasurer shall Ex-officio be ex-officio members of all committees.
- 35. All by-laws, rules and regulations Repealing inconsistent with the foregoing are hereby repealed.

HOUSE RULES.

Complaints are to be made in the book provided for that purpose, or under cover, addressed to the secretary.

The hall porter's duties include the care of all letters, papers, cards, messages, etc., for members. He will enter once a day in his book the name of every member coming into the Club House—see that non-members are not admitted unless brought in by a member. If strangers call to see a member who is in the House, he will show them into the strangers' room and immediately send notice to the member so enquired for. He will respectfully call attention to any departure from the rules, reporting to the secretary persistent disregard of them.

The Club will be opened at 7.30 A. M. from 1st April to 31st October, and at 8 A.M. from November 1st to 31st March.

The Club will close on Saturdays and Sundays at midnight and on other days at 1 A.31. (Standard time will be kept.)

The coffee room will be open at 8 A.M. Members leaving by early trains can have

breakfast at 7.30 A. M. by giving notice to the steward before 9 P. M. the night previous.

Breakfast will be served from 8 A. M. till 11 A.M.; lunch from 1 P.M. till 3 P.M.; dinner from 6 P.M. till 8 P.M.; and cold supper from 8 P.M. till midnight. Hot suppers may be obtained by giving notice to the steward not later than 7.30 P. M. On Sundays breakfast will be served from 8 A.M. till 12.30 P.M.; dinner from 5.30 P.M. till 7 P.M. Hot dishes will not be served between 3 and 5.30 P.M.

Smoking, except by special permission of the committee, will not be allowed in the coffee room until after dinner.

During the above hours the Club will be open to all members in good standing, and to introduced members for the dates covered by their introductions.

The strangers' room will be used for non-members who are brought into the Club by members, and members may not take non-members into any other room unless they have lunched or dined in the Club with them.

When non-members have so lunched or dined they may be admitted into the billiard, smoking and card rooms, but not otherwise.

No servant of the Club shall be sent out on messages under any pretext whatever, except by order of the House committee, secretary or steward.

No member, except on special duty, will be allowed into the kitchen, bar room, carving room, or any of the servants' rooms.

No Club property shall be sent out of the House on any pretence whatever, except by permission of the committee. of their at pur-
