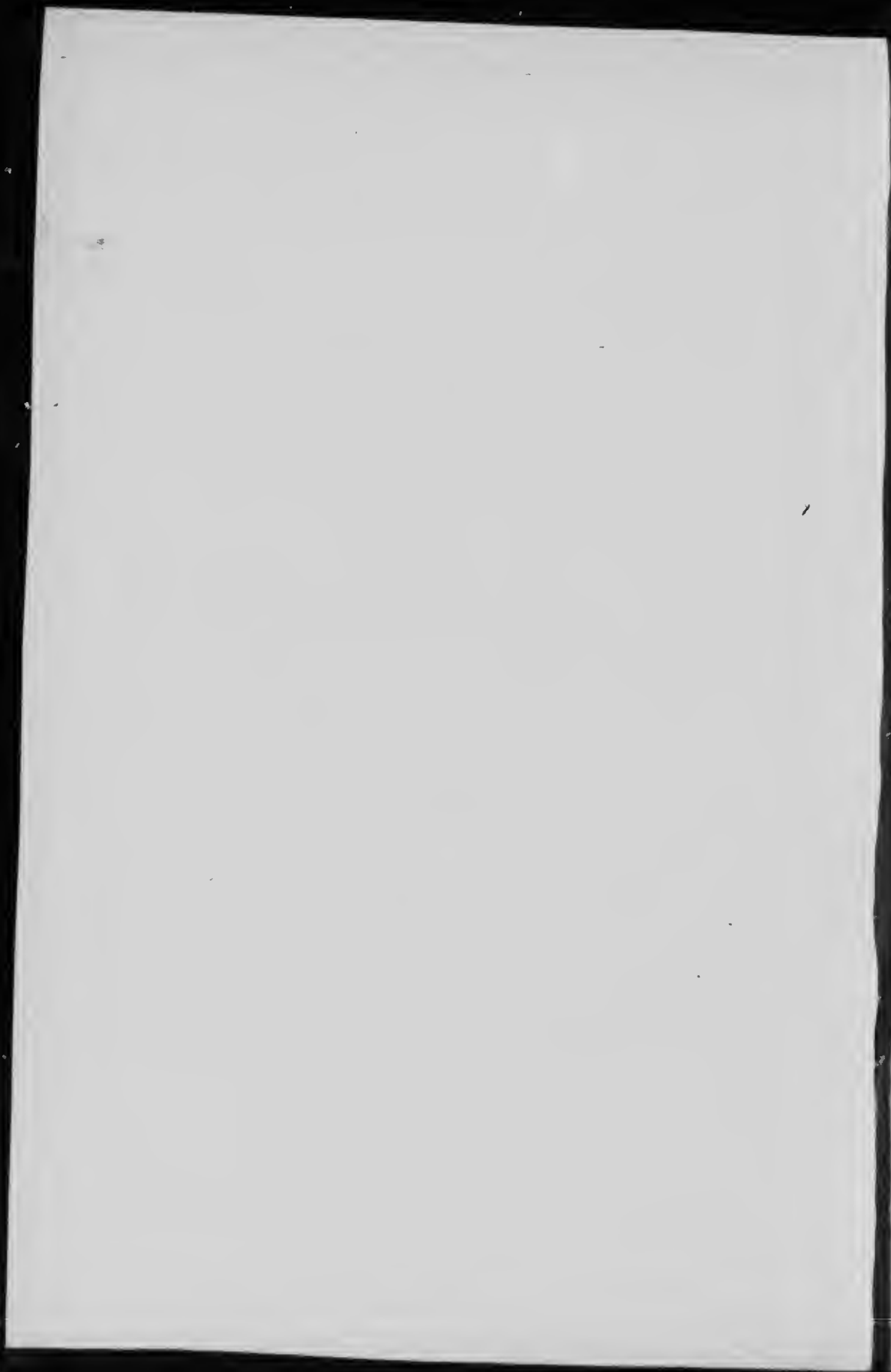
MICROCOPY RESOLUTION TEST CHART

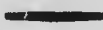

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1.—The annual fee of membership shall be \$2.00, which sum shall entitle the members to free admission to the Exhibition during the days in which the Exhibition is open to the public AND ALSO SHALL ENTITLE THE MEMBERS TO FREE ENTRY IN ANY SECTION. The same shall not be transferable and if presented by any other person than the one named thereon will be taken up and full admission fee or entry fee collected, and all privileges under same be forfeited.

2.—All Exhibits to be shown in the Hall must be placed in order on the 14th September before noon of the opening day of the Exhibition in order to compete in Judging which will begin at One p.m. Live Stock, including Poultry, will be judged on the grounds commencing at 10 a.m. of the second day, September 15th.

3.—Exhibitors must arrange to have their articles properly unpacked and delivered to the Hall Superintendent free of cost to the Agricultural Society.

4.—The Agricultural Society will take every reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of articles sent to the Exhibition yet it must be distinctly understood that the owner assumes all risks of any article injured, lost or stolen, and the Society will not recognize any claim of payment in any way.

5.—Entries positively close on Tuesday, September 12th.

6.—All entries of articles and stock intended for exhibition must be made on the printed forms furnished by the Association, and shall be filled out and signed by the exhibitor or his agent. Blank forms and prize lists may be had on application to the Secretary.

7.—Entry tickets will be held at the office of the Secretary and may be had on application. The entry ticket consists of a folded card, having the exhibitor's name and address printed thereon. The folded portion of the entry ticket must not be undone until after judging, otherwise the exhibit shall be barred from competition.

8.—Intending exhibitors desiring to enter worthy articles, not covered by any section, may enter such as extras in the class to which they most nearly correspond, but shall not be entitled to any prize money.

9.—All persons to whom prizes are awarded must apply to the Secretary on or before the 20th day of September on which day the Secretary will pay all prize money. Prize money will be paid in all cases by cheque.


